Greetings, Brothers & Sisters in Christ!

We've made it through the busy month of May and now June officially or unofficially signals the beginning of the summer season! Most schools are out for the summer and summer programs and activities are starting! Seems like there is barely any downtime left for anyone these days! That means kids and adults alike!

I'm sad that I have to miss the Memorial Day services at the cemeteries and so many weeks without being with you, but everyone has reminded me that there are times when I need to take time for myself, as well. This is one of those times. I appreciate your prayers for wisdom to the doctors and getting all the cancer removed and for a full recovery. One of the things that will be the hardest is that I need to go two weeks without using my lips, which means no talking, and smoothies for meals! I'm sure it will be a challenge but I went two years without chewing when I had extensive dental surgery a few years ago, so I will try to remain positive that I can do it. One of the things I had shared in the May newsletter was that I needed to find a way to slow down and take some time to relax and I guess this is God's answer to me!

I look forward to leading worship on June 22 and having joint worship in the Aurora City Park on June 29, with a potluck lunch after worship at the Aurora Legion. I pray that you are enjoying the mixture of warm sunny days and cloudy rainy days to water the new plantings and gardens. I find comfort in knowing that God is with us in all seasons and circumstances. If you are facing changes and decisions, making plans for the future or just trying to get through this time of uncertainty, remember God is with us!
