Supervisor's Report — Distributed

- ARPA Funds can be used for many different projects including what we customarily use tax dollars - purchase of office equipment, public health equipment, roads, etc.

- Oil revenue check in the amount of \$141.70.
- State of Michigan revenue sharing will include approximately 500 more residents based on 2020 census retro to October 2020.

Road Work - 2022 Lenawee County Road Commission (3) year plan road work was presented.

Sewer work update – Thornhill Station upgrade - \$850,000 – looking into possible bond for additional work

With (3) trustees absent no action was taken until we have a full board.

Ambulance Replacement – Chief Bartenslager presented a quote for \$268,236.87 for a new 2022 ambulance – Emergency Vehicles Plus - to use ARPA funds to purchase – Supervisor Koehn made a recommendation to put 10% down to secure the availability and price. Motion by Malarney, second by Thompson to approve the deposit to secure ambulance of \$26,823.69. THE MOTION PASSED UNANAMIOUSLY

Slusarski Excavating is preparing to finish the stone placement on Beaver creek sewer line that is exposed – work has begun but recent rain has halted the progress but completing in a few weeks.

Supervisor Koehn called a special closed session for the board for a personnel issue. Motion by May second by Thompson to go into closed session at 7:47 pm. THE MOTION PASSED UNANAMIOUSLY.
