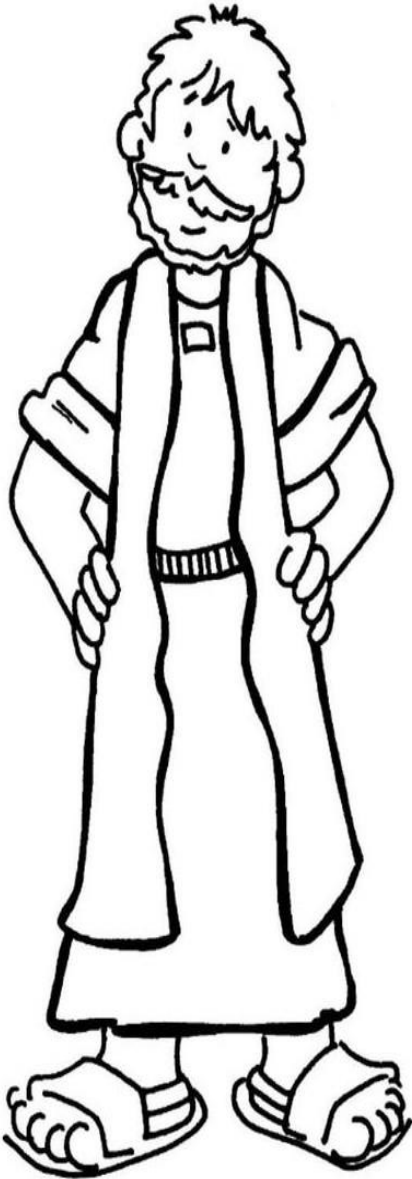




St. Simon the Zealot



We celebrate both saints on
October 28
Because they were always
together in their apostolate.
Simon belonged to a group
called the "zealots" who worked
tirelessly against the Roman
invasion of their country. But
upon hearing the Word of
Christ, he discovered the
universality of God's love.

St. Judas Thaddeus (not Jesus' traitor, Judas Iscariot) God called him to complete the 12 apostles charged with continuing the work of Jesus in the world. Judas is one of the most popular saints because of the favors he gives to those looking for work. St. Judas wrote little. Only one letter of his is found in the bible which finishes with: "Eternal glory be with our Lord Jesus Christ, who is capable of keeping us from folly, to stand without blemish in your presence with rejoicing".

Both were martyred.
