




Jesus, your friend, invites you:




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

Instructions:

Free Space: Each player will write their own prayer in any one block they choose. This space will be marked as if it has already been called.

From the Master List: Each player will choose 4 sentences from each letter in P.R.A.Y. Cut and paste them in their proper column on your own sheet.

As the statements are called out, the leader marks it in his/her master list, and the players circle it on their board. The first person to get a completed straight row down, across or diagonally calls out "I Pray". The leader checks it with the master list, and if all is correct, that person is the winner.







THE SCAPULAR IS A SIGN OF MARY

One of the signs in the tradition of the church from many centuries ago is the Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. It is a sign approved by the church and by the Carmelite Order as an external sign of love for Mary, of the trust her children have in her and of commitment to live like her.

The word scapular indicates a form of clothing which monks wore when they were working.

With the passage of time, people began to give symbolic meaning to it: the cross to be borne everyday as disciples and followers of Christ. In some religions, such as the Carmelites, the scapular turned into a sign of their way of life. The Scapular came to symbolize the special dedication of Carmelites to Mary, the Mother of God, and to express trust in her motherly protection as well as the desire to be like her in her commitment to Christ and to others. Thus it became a sign of Mary.

Some Practical Rules

> People are enrolled in the Scapular only once, by a priest or

authorized person. > The scapular can be replaced afterwards by a medal which has on one side the image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and on the other, the image of Mary.

Receive this Scapular, a sign of your special relationship with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, whom you pledge to imitate. May it be a reminder to you of your dignity as a Christian, in serving others and imitating : Mary. Wear it as a sign of her protection and of belonging to the fammily of Carmel, voluntarily doing the will of God and devoting yourself to building a world true to his plan of community, justice and peace.

We can whisper a Hail Mary when we are walking along or doing a chore. We can spend some quiet time in our room or another location and say the Rosary. We can keep a little statue or picture of Mary near our bed to remind us to honor her with prayer.

This is the way to make Mary the center and queen of our hearts. We can say the Hail Mary often throughout the day:

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.
