October 5: 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Talk about the story

Speak with the children about how women and children should be treated. Do they feel treated with love and respect by their parents, teachers, and members of the family?

Activities

Have the children draw the scene of Jesus with the children. Ask them to write their own names on the figures of the children near Jesus.

You are there

What do you think about what Jesus says about divorce? Do you like being called by Jesus? What would you like to tell him?



Jesus, you friend, invites you:

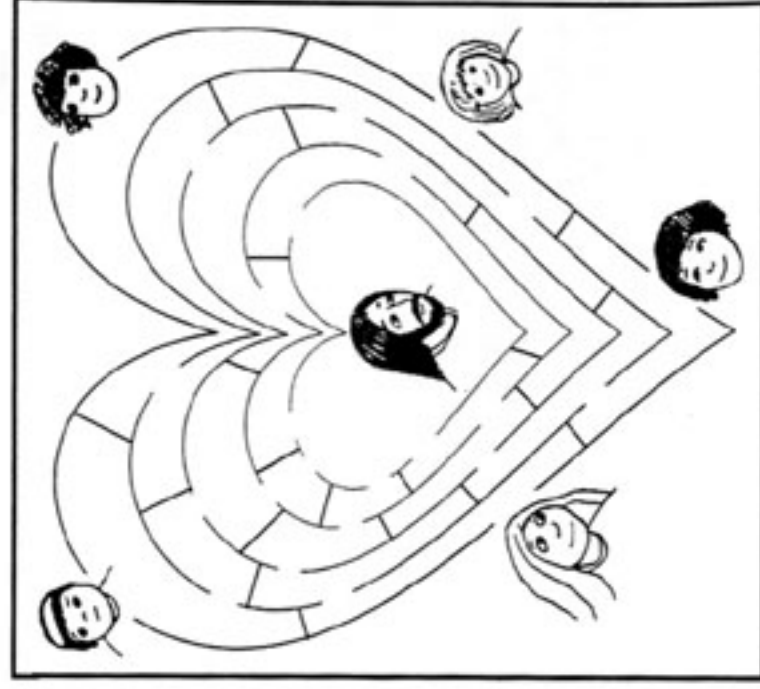
- >> Jesus says that both men and women are made after the image of God and therefore, they have the same rights. Do you respect your mom and dad equally?
- >> Jesus loves everyone equally, even those that others think are not important. Do you try to respect everyone also, or do you think some people are important than others?

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus and tell him about your week. Talk to him about the people you respect the most. Tell him what you would like to do

- >> For example: *I will thank Jesus for my parents.*
- >> For example: *I will look for a classmate who is usually ignored, and I will play with him or her*

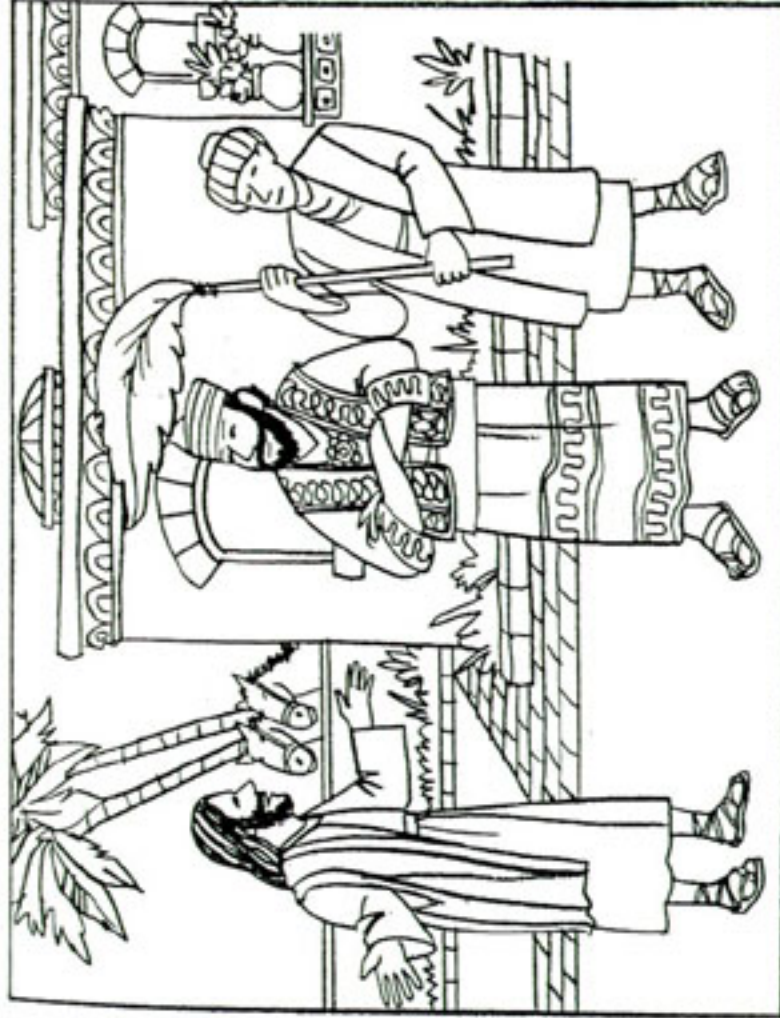

Talk about the story. Speak with the children about their treasure (toys, books, or other possessions) they have and would not like to give up. Is there any very important reason that would move them to give everything up? Do they know someone in their family who has given up lots of things for the good of the family?

Activities. Take to class a box full of trinkets. Ask the children to choose things that may be symbols of something that is hard for them to give up. Ask the children to put the things back in the box with their prayer about what they want to do this week.

You are there. What do you think about the rich young man? Do you think Jesus demands too much? Imagine you were the young man? What would you do? Why?

Jesus, your friend, invites you:

- >> Jesus says that, more important than all the money in the world, is to be friends with God.
- >> Jesus invites his friends to always be with him, even if it means they have to leave everything they own.

What am I going to do?

- Speak to Jesus and tell him about your week. Talk to him about some of the things you have and that it would be difficult for you to give up. Tell him what you would like to do:
- >> For example: *I will give up something that I like very much in order to help others.*
- >> For example: *I will not complain if my parents don't buy me something I want.*
- >>

How would you feel if you were the rich young man? Think of all the possessions you have - your books, your toys, your clothes. What would be the hardest thing for you to give up? Draw a picture of it below.

Talk about the story. Speak with the children about competitiveness. Do they feel they have to fight others in order to be the first? Why is that? What do they think about what Jesus says about service in order to be the first? Why would he say that? The people they really admire, are they the most powerful, or rather those who serve others?

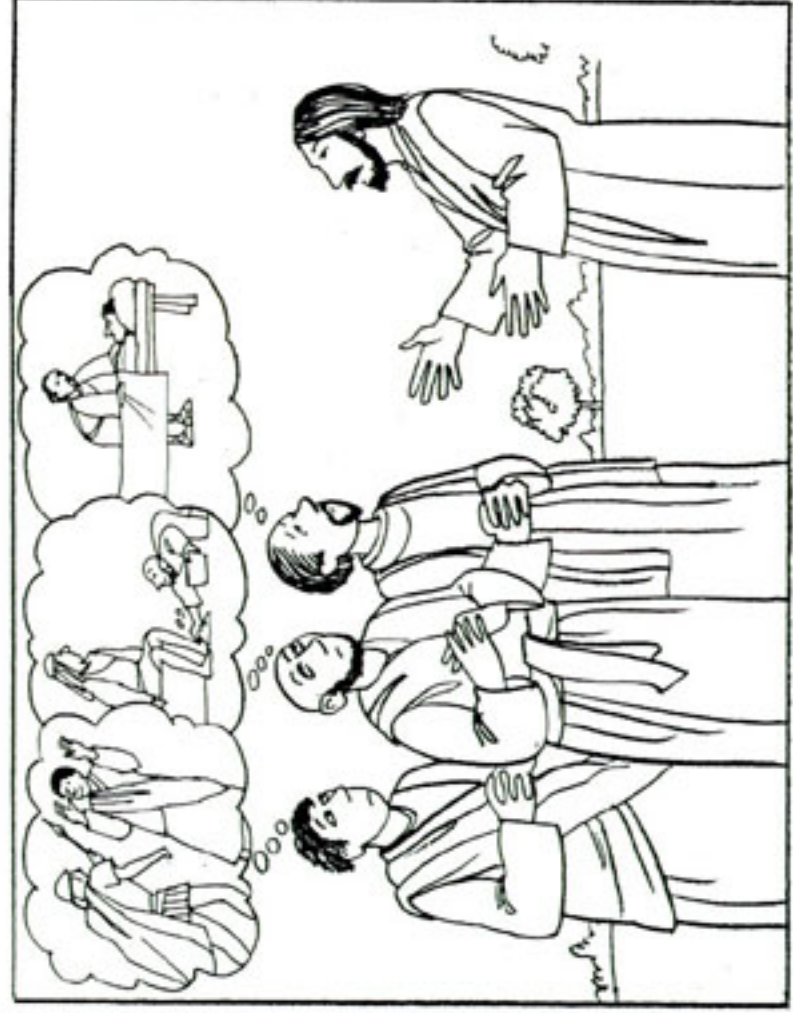
Activities. Write a story together in which things are in reverse: the king is the poorest, the princes and ministers are the servants, and the last ones are those with lots of titles. How do things happen in this story?

You are there. Do you also want to have a good position near Jesus? What do you think going through the same as Jesus might mean?

>> Jesus had to go through many difficulties and he did it all so that we could be happy with God.
>> Being near Jesus means to be willing, like him, to serve others and be generous.

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus and tell him about your week. Tell him about things that you find difficult at home or at school. Thank him because he understands you very well.
>> For example: *I will thank Jesus because he is with me.*
>> For example: *I will offer my help to adults at home without waiting for someone to ask.*

Talk about the story

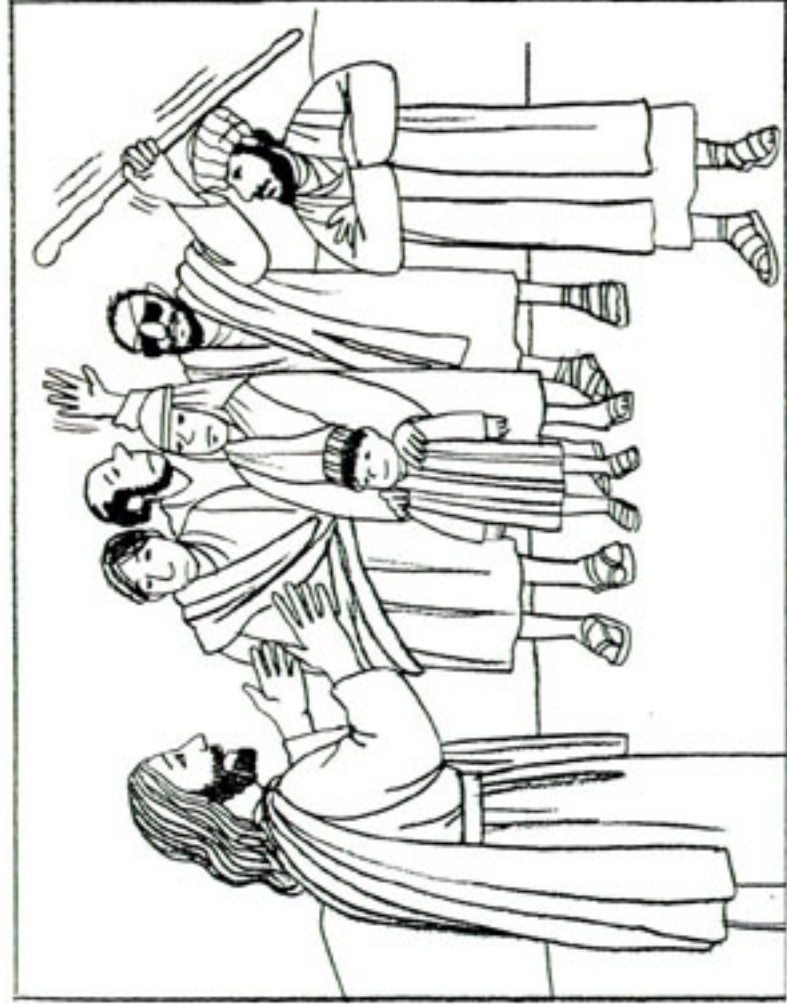
Do they know any blind person? Have they ever heard adults talk about a person who is not blind physically, but who refuses to see some truth? Have you heard them say "he or she is blind"? Is there something they would not like to see? Is there something they would like to understand better?

Activities

Do a trust walk in which one blindfolded child allows himself to be led by another. Speak about the experience.

You are there

Imagine you are the blind man. Do you shout really loud, or are you afraid Jesus might be upset?



Jesus, your friend, invites you:

- >> The blind man recognizes that Jesus is the one sent by God, and because of his faith, he is healed. Do you have lots of faith when you ask God for something?
- >> Jesus gives sight, not only to physical blindness, but also for us to be able to see good things, that are good and are pleasing to God.

What am I going to do?

- Speak to Jesus and tell him about your week. Tell him about certain things that you would like to see and understand better in your family or at school. Tell him what you would like to do:
- >> For example: I will pay attention when someone tells me something I have not done properly.
- >> For example: I will speak with Jesus every morning to see what he wants me to do during the day.

Mystery saints for the month of October

1. Her mother dies when she was very young. Her father and sisters loved her very much. When she was 15 she gave up everything to join the convent where her sisters were. She wanted to belong to Jesus. She offered all her prayers and sacrifices so that God would bless the work of missionaries and many people would learn about Jesus' love.

2. He was very rich but wanted to be as poor as Jesus was. He gave up everything he owned and went to live in the woods. He received the stigmata (Jesus' wounds). He taught everyone about Jesus and Mary, loved animals very much, and was such a good and gentle person that everyone loved to listen to him.

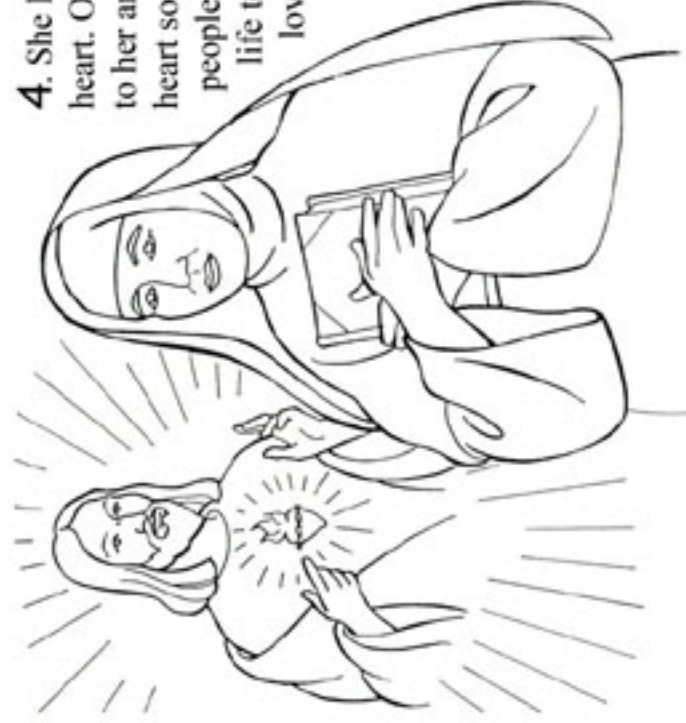
3. As a child she loved to read about the lives of saints and martyrs. When she grew older, she entered the convent. She spent all of her life dedicated to God and helped to bring other sisters closer to God, too. She wrote many books.

4. She loved God with all her heart. One day Jesus appeared to her and showed her His heart so filled with love for all people. Margaret spent her life telling people of Jesus' love for them.

Mystery Saints for the month of October



1. He was one of the four writers of the gospels. He also wrote about the early Christian Church to whom Jesus sent the Holy Spirit. He was also a doctor.

October 18



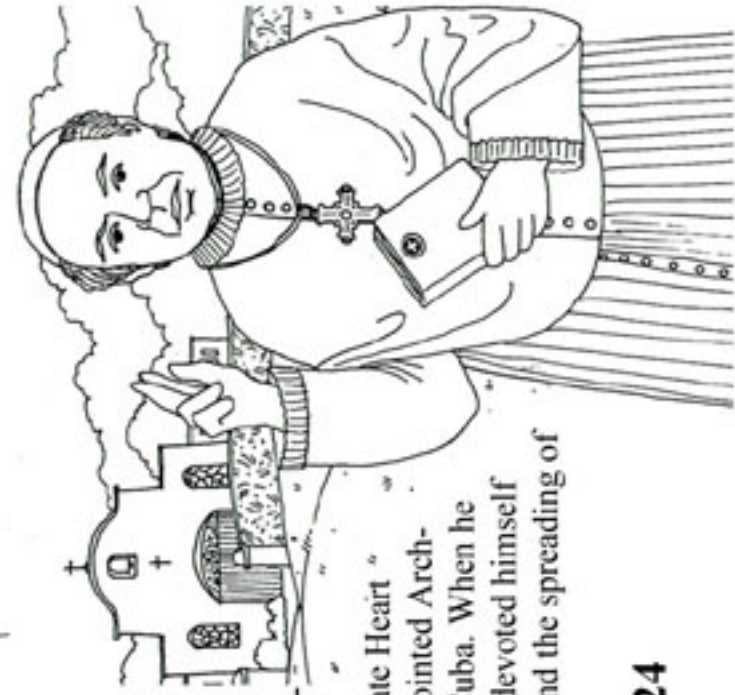
2. He wanted to teach the North American Indians about God's love, even if it meant death. Isaac and his companions were killed by an Indian war party who didn't understand the way of God's love.

October 19



3. He was born in the city of Genova, Italy. After his ordination he was inspired in a vision to found a congregation in honor of the Passion of Christ. The badge he chose for the congregation was a heart with 3 nails. The work of the "Passionists" (as they were called) was preaching to people in the parishes.

October 19



4. Born in Spain, he worked as a missionary in Catalonia and the Canary Islands for ten years. In 1849 he started the Congregation of Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. He was appointed Archbishop of Santiago, Cuba. When he returned to Spain he devoted himself to missionary work and the spreading of good literature.

History of the Rosary



In the past, when the monks wanted to pray they would recite the 150 Psalms of the Bible. They would count them with stones they kept in a pouch



Later, they used strings with 150 knots or with pieces of woods to count their prayers. This was more practical than keeping 150 pebbles around.



The common people also wanted to pray and praise God, but they couldn't read the Psalms, the monks suggested that they pray the Our Father they knew.



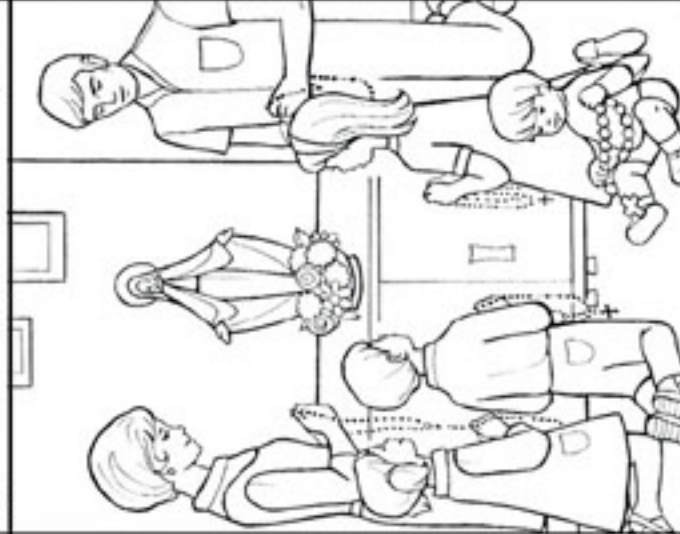
As time went by, the 150 Our Fathers were replaced by Hail Marys. Each group of 50 Hail Marys was called a "rosary" (bouquet).



During the XIII century, Saint Dominic had an apparition of the Blessed Virgin. She told him that devotion to the Rosary would convert sinners.



The Rosary we pray today keeps the 50 Hail Marys, and the Our Father, it also includes thoughts about the chapters in Jesus and Mary's lives.



To meditate the Joyful, Sorrowful, and Glorious mysteries of the Rosary in family, is one of the most treasured traditions of the Catholic faith.



In October 2002, Pope John Paul II added the Luminous mysteries about Jesus' public life. He then proclaims 2003 "Year of the Rosary".

Each one of us has a Guardian Angel, which is our partner and protector, and guides us through the good path.

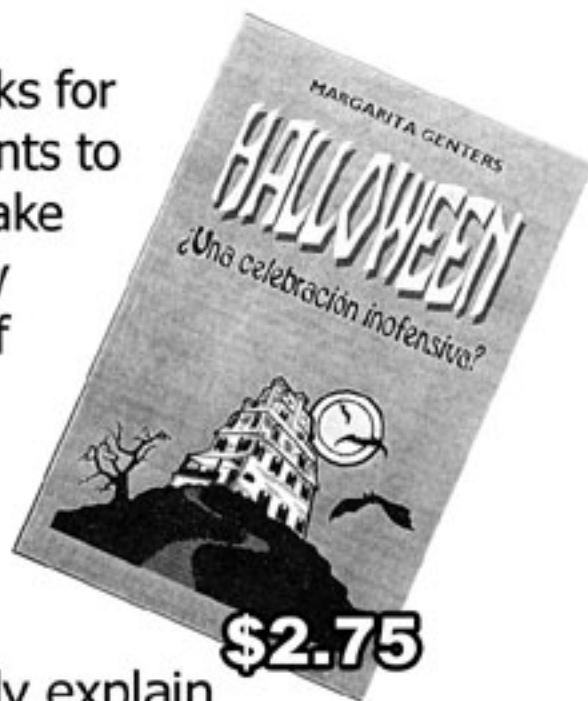

SALVE REGINA

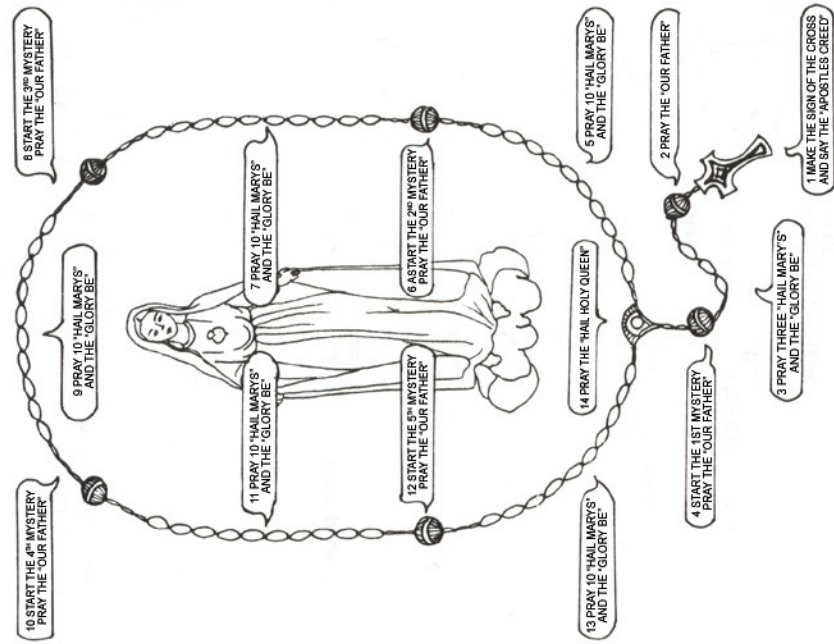

Jesus is born in a poor stable in Bethlehem.

Lk. 2:1-20

Share what I have with others for the love of Jesus.

4. THE PRESENTATION

Mary and Joseph bring Jesus to the temple to offer him to the Father.

Lk. 2:22-39

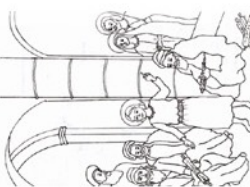
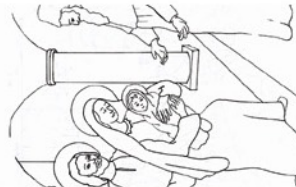
I will offer myself to the Father.

5. THE FINDING OF THE CHILD JESUS IN THE TEMPLE

To be prayed on Thursdays.

1. BAPTISM IN THE JORDAN

Jesus came to be baptized by John the Baptist. The voice of the Father declares him the Beloved Son.

Matt. 3:13-16

Pray to be faithful to our baptismal promises.

2. THE WEDDING AT CANA

Jesus changed water into wine through the intervention of His Mother.

Jn. 2:1-12

Pray to do whatever Jesus tell us (accomplishment of God's will).

3. PROCLAMATION OF GOD'S KINGDOM

Jesus proclaims the coming of the kingdom of God, as he calls to conversion and reconciliation.

Mk. 2:3-13

Pray for the grace to forgive always.

4. THE TRANSFIGURATION

The glory of God shines forth from the face of Christ as the Father commands the apostles to listen to Jesus.

Lk. 9:28-36

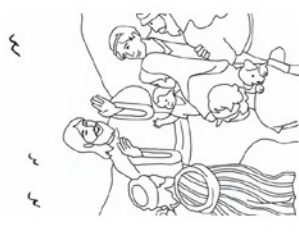
Pray for a change of heart.

5. THE INSTITUTION OF THE EUCHARIST

Christ offers his body and blood as food under the signs of bread and wine, and testifies His love for us.

Lk. 22:14-20

Pray to be always in the state of grace to receive the Eucharist.

To be prayed on Tuesday and Fridays.

1. THE AGONY IN THE GARDEN

The thought of our sins and His coming sufferings causes Jesus to sweat blood.

Lk. 22:41-45

I will pray like Jesus when something is hard for me.

2. THE SCOURGING AT THE PILLAR

Jesus is beaten for our sins but He does not complain.

Matt. 27:26

For love of Jesus I will not make a fuss over things I do not like.

3. THE CROWNING WITH THORNS

They make fun of Jesus and put a crown of thorns on His head.

Matt. 27:28-31

I will ask Jesus to help me to never make fun of others.

4. THE CARRYING OF THE CROSS

Jesus carries His heavy cross to Calvary.

Lk. 23:26-32

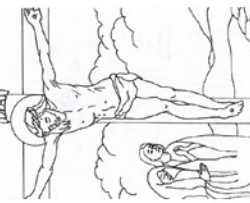
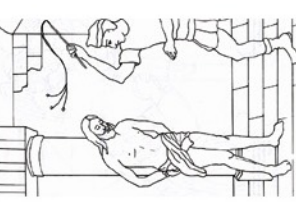
I will offer for love of Jesus what is hard for me.

5. THE CRUCIFIXION

Jesus suffers on the cross for the love of me... He forgives everyone...!

I will forgive everybody who hurts me.



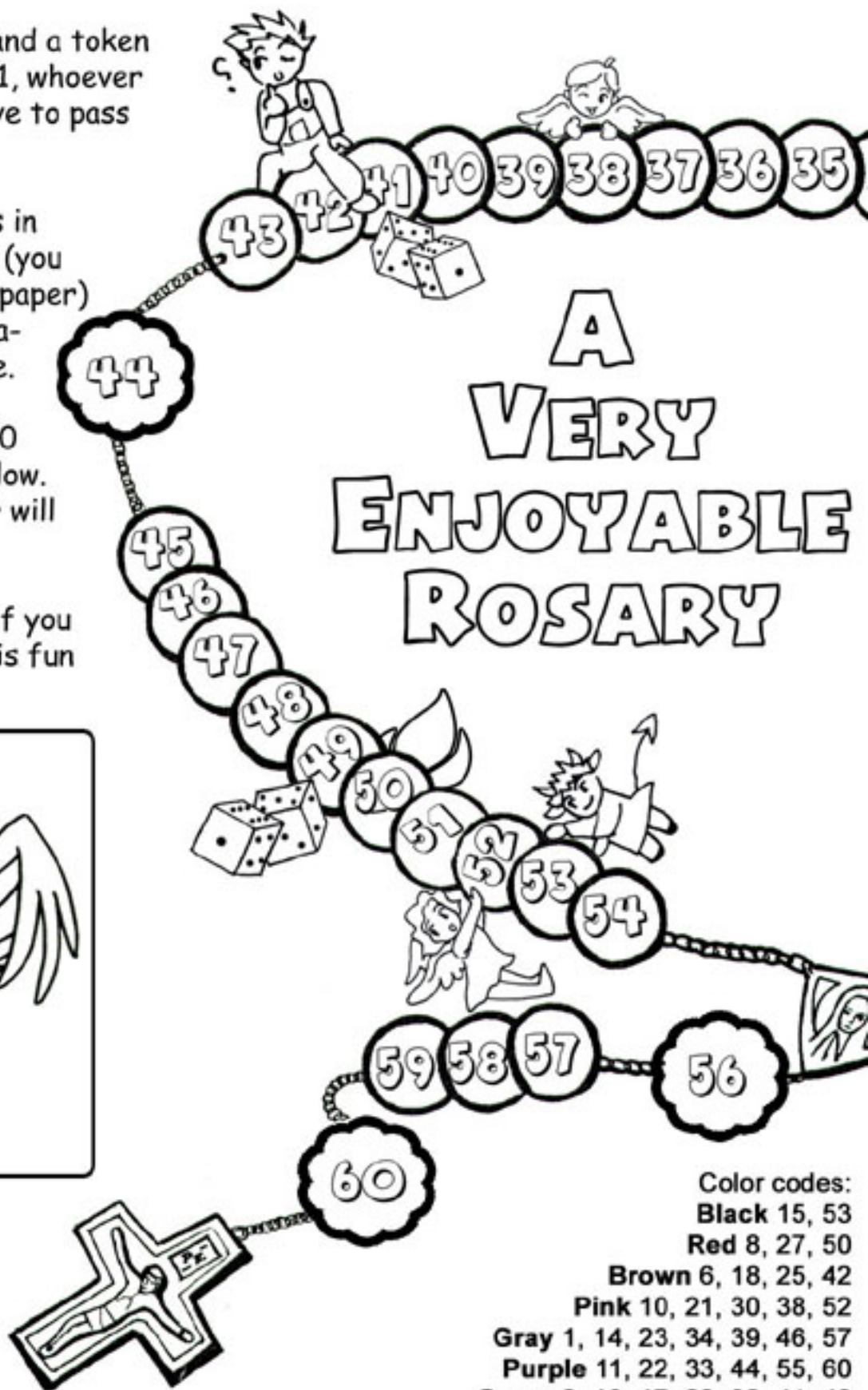
MAKE YOUR OWN GAME

You will need a set of dice and a token for each player. Start at #1, whoever reaches the cross (they have to pass #60) is the winner.

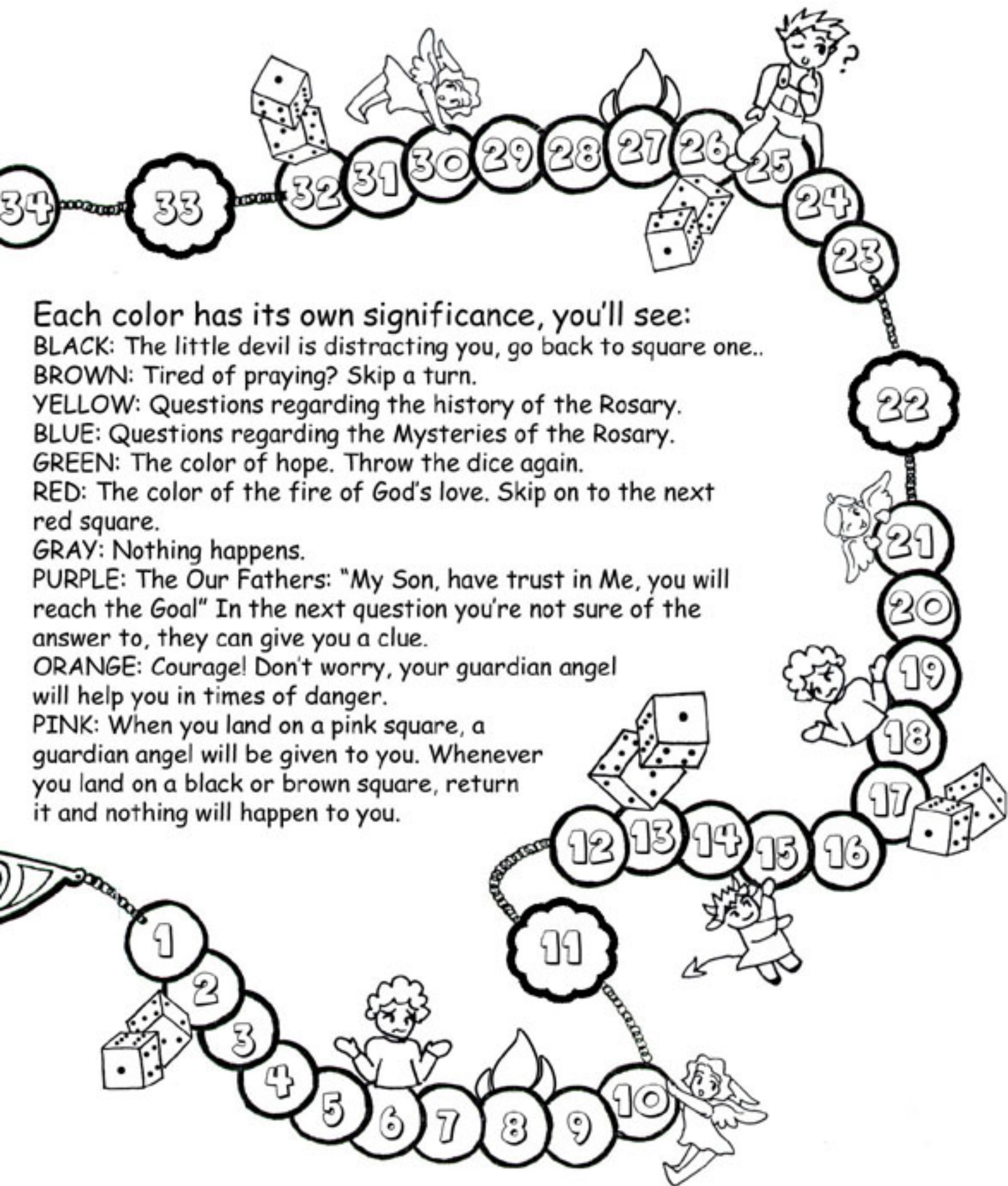
Print or paste the questions in blue and yellow index cards (you could also use construction paper) and have them ready in separate stacks during the game.

Each color has its own significance, you'll see:

BLACK: The little devil is distracting you, go back to square one..

BROWN: Tired of praying? Skip a turn.

YELLOW: Questions regarding the history of the Rosary.

BLUE: Questions regarding the Mysteries of the Rosary.

GREEN: The color of hope. Throw the dice again.

RED: The color of the fire of God's love. Skip on to the next red square.

GRAY: Nothing happens.

PURPLE: The Our Fathers: "My Son, have trust in Me, you will reach the Goal" In the next question you're not sure of the answer to, they can give you a clue.

ORANGE: Courage! Don't worry, your guardian angel will help you in times of danger.

PINK: When you land on a pink square, a guardian angel will be given to you. Whenever you land on a black or brown square, return it and nothing will happen to you.
