ADWENT CALENDAR

This is a special time when Catholic are full of joy, because of the preparation for the birth of Jesus, the Son of God.

Advent begin four weeks before Christmas and there are different ways to be prepare. One is the advent wreath with four candles, another way can be this calendar with 24 windows. You open one each day.

With this advent calendar you can know better the story of Christmas and do a nice craft.

Instructions:

- 1. Paste the two pages with the calendar in a cardboard, forming a stable.
- 2. In the page where the pictures are cut them all individually. Each day paste them in the square with the same number. Example December 1, paste the figure with # 1, of the Holy Land.
- 3. Only paste the figure from the top part. In this way you can always read the text
- 4. Each day continue pasting and ... MERRY CHRISTMAS

Advent: We await the coming of Jesus

December 3: First Sunday in Advent

Jer. 33:14-16; 1 Thess. 3:12-4:2; Luke 21:25-28, 34-36

Talk about the story. Talk to the children about waiting. Are they impatient? Do they find waiting around to be very hard for them to do? Do they need immediate gratification? What do their families do when they are expecting a visit form someone? What can they do to prepare for Jesus' coming this Christmas?

Activities. Provide your class with green, purple, and pink construction paper so each child can make his or her own Advent wreath and candles. Ask them to write their commitments for the week on the back of their first candle.

Final Prayer. As each child pastes the first candle on his or her Advent wreath, they should express their commitments for the week. All respond, "Come, Jesus".

You are there

How do you prepare for Christmas?

Jesus, your friend, invites you:

- How does your family prepare for visitors? When you are waiting for someone, what do you do?
- ▼ Do you clean or shop? Do you ever get so distracted by all your preparations that you forget about the person who is coming to visit? Do you often think of Jesus, who is to come this Christmas?
- God is not pleased when we spend our time worrying about those people who need our care and affection.

What am I going to do?

Tell Jesus what you like about Christmas. Tell him how you would like to prepare for it:

- ▼ For example: I will give some of my allowance to someone who doesn't have much.
- For example: I will pray to Jesus to bring peace and love to my family.

Q: Advent is a countdown to Christmas, when Jesus arrives. Are you prepared to welcome Jesus? How do you prepare for visitors?

Mary said yes to God

December 8: The Immaculate Conception

Gen. 3:9-15, 20; Eph. 1:3-6, 11-12; Luke 1:26:38

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about things we all should say yes to. What about those we should say no to? Provide examples of good things that happen when we say yes—when we help and share with others. What good things happen when we say no to violence, drugs, or selfishness?

Remind the children of the upcoming celebration of Our Lady of Guadalupe in a few days. Through her apparitions to Juan Diego, Guadalupe confirmed the dignity we all have as children of the living God, regardless of the color of our skin or our background.

Activities. Provide pictures for the children of the scene of the Annunciation or the apparitions of Guadalupe to Juan Diego. Talk about the good things that happened after Mary said yes or when Juan Diego agreed to do what Mary asked of Him.

Final Prayer. Each child should present his or her commitment for the week. All respond: "Jesus, I want to say yes so you can come into the world."

Q: The Angel Gabriel came to tell Mar that she would give birth to Jesus. Although Mary was worried, she did as God asked.?

You are there

Are you shocked to see an angel? What do you say?

Jesus, your friend, invites you:

- When she said yes to God, Mary opened the way to the coming of God.
- What good things happen to you, or in your house, when somebody has done something that pleases god?
- ♥ What do you think God is asking you to do today?

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus and thank for Mary, who made it possible for him to come to the world. Tell him what you would like to do so that he can continue to come us.

- ▼ For example: I will say yes when members of my family ask me for help.
- ▼ For example: I will listen attentively to what adults, parents, guardians, and teachers tell me knowing that God often speaks to me through them.

Prepare the way of the Lord

December 10: Second Sunday In Advent

Bar. 5:1-9; Phil. 1:4-6, 8-11; Luke 3:1-6

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about ways and paths. When is it easier to go from one place to another? Why do curves, mountains, and valleys make the journey slower? What are some of the obstacles in their lives that are hard to overcome? Why is it impossible for Jesus to come if we place obstacles of selfishness or curves of deceit in God's way?

Activities and prayer. Place the second Advent candle on the wreath that each child created last Sunday. As they write their commitment for the week on the back of the candle, all respond: "I want to prepare your way, Jesus."

You are there

What do you think John was talking about?

Q: Jesus come to straighten out what is wrong in the world. What obstacles and problems do you have? How can Jesus help out?

Jesus, your friend, invites you:

- ▼ John says that obstacles must be overcome so that Jesus can be with us. What are some of the things you find difficult? Who can help you to overcome them?
- John says that things that are wrong in our lives must be fixed for Jesus to come to us.
- ▼ Is there anything in your home and family that you think is not totally right? Is there some people argue over? What are some of the problems in your family? What can you do to make things easier?

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus and tell him what you would like to change about yourself so you can prepare for his coming. Tell him what you want to do this week.


- For example: I will make up with a friend with whom I have fought.
- **▼** For example: I will make an effort to improve my homework.

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December 17: Third Sunday In Advent

Jesus gives us joy

Zeph..3:14-18a; Phil. 4:4-7; Luke 3:10-18

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about Christmas, which is getting closer. What gives them joy? How long does that kind of joy usually last? Why does it end? Do they lose their joy when the gifts they get at Christmas break or when they get bored with them?

What is hard for them to share? What examples can they give of people taking advantage of others? Are there children in their schools or neighborhoods who bully weaker children?

Activities. On the back of the third candle (the pink one) from the advent wreath they have made, the children should write what brings them joy and this week's commitment. They should also pledge to bring a toy to class for someone in a poorer parish or country who probably won't get any presents this Christmas.

Final Prayer. After each child expresses his or her commitment for the week, all say, "Jesus, we rejoice because you are always with us".

You are there

Does this help to clear your doubts?


Jesus, your friend, invites you:

- ▼ John invites those who want to receive Jesus to prepare by sharing what they have with others. Do you want to receive Jesus?
- ▼ The first readings remind us that Christmas is near, and that gives us joy. What gives you joy during the Christmas season?

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus and thank him for what gives you joy. Tell him about the things you have that you would like to share with others. Tell him what you want to do this week.

- For example: I will not take advantage of the kindness of my relatives by asking them for things I don't really need.
- For example: *I will share what I have with others*.



Q: John the Baptist tells us that we must share with others to prepare for the coming of Jesus. Do you happily share with others? What is most difficult for you to share?

Let us bring the joy of Jesus to others


December 24: Fourth Sunday In Advent

Mich. 5:1-4a; He. 10:5-10; Luke 1:39-45

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about visiting with others. Why do people visit one another? Do their mothers or others relatives visit people to help them? What kinds of visits do they like? Who are the good people in whom they recognize the presence of God? What are those people like?

Activities. On the back of the fourth candle of their Advent wreath, they should write the names of people in whom they recognize Jesus. They also can write about visitors who give them joy and why. Collect the toys or gifts they pledged to bring last week and present them at the Mass with the gifts of bread and wine.

Final Prayer. As they name the good people they know and present their gifts, all respond, "Jesus, teach us to share our joy."



Q: When Mary was pregnant with Jesus, she hurried to help her cousin Elizabeth, who was an older woman and about to have a baby. Do you rush to help others out when they need you?

You are there

Imagine how hard Mary's journey was. Are you tempted to just go back home?

Jesus, your friend, invites you:

- Mary hurried to help her cousin. Do you hurry up to help others when you see help is needed?
- ▼ John jumped for joy when he recognized Jesus inside Mary. Do you rejoice when you see something that reminds, you of Jesus' goodness?

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus and tell him about the times you have helped someone this week. Thank him for giving you things you can share with others. Tell him what you want to do this week.


- For example: I will give thanks when I see other do good or notice good qualities in another.
- For example: I will pay attention to members of my family who need my help.

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about times when they have felt included or excluded. How did they feel? Have they ever excluded others? Why? What do they think about the story of Mary and Joseph looking for shelter? What does the story of the birth of Jesus tell them about the importance of people?

Activities. Make a live nativity scene. Draw lots to assign the different roles to the children. Ask the children to imagine what each character or thing in the story would tell the Child Jesus.

You are there. Imagine you have a house. Do you offer it Joseph and Mary even if you don't know them?





Jesus, your friend, invites you:

- Jesus, who is God, is born poor and in a poor place. Do you think people are more or less important according to what they have?
- Mary and Joseph did not find a place to stay. Do you know someone who is rejected? (for instance, someone in school who is never invited to play or to parties?)

What am I going to do? Speak to Jesus and thank him for becoming one of us. Tell him what you want to do this week.

- **♥** For example: *I will invite someone ho is alone to play with me.*
- ♥ For example: *I will give something of what I have for a child who is poorer that I.*

What is your best Christmas gift of all? Draw a picture of what you think is the best Christmas gift.



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Was Jesus lost?

December 31: Holy Family Sir. 3:2-6, 12-14; Col. 3:12-21; Luke 2:41-52

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about their families. With whom do they get along best? What would they like to change about the ways they relate to family members? Have they ever gotten lost-or done something that has greatly worried their parents? How did they feel when they realized what they had done? What did they learn from the experience?

Activities. Dramatize the scene of Joseph and Mary looking for and then finding Jesus. What do they do and say to each other?

Final Prayer. Ask each child to name one of the adults at home. Next, ask them to compose a prayer about something that seems to be worrying that certain family member.

You are there. Do you want to scold Jesus for the scare he gave Mary and Joseph?



Q: When Jesus was 12 ears old he spoke in the Temple, but Joseph and Mary were afraid he was lost. Do your parents worry about you sometimes? What causes them to worry about you?

Jesus, your friend, invites you:

♦When he was 12, Jesus was helping do God's work. But realizing how much his mother suffered when he was lost, he was obedient after his return to Nazareth. Do you listen to the adults in your family? Is it hard for you to be obedient?

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus and thank him for the adults in your family. Tell him how you would like to improve your relationships with them. Tell him what you want to do this week.

- **♥**For example: *I will talk more with my mother (o other adults) so that we understand each other better.*
- **◆**For example: *I will respectfully and calmly express hoe I felt about things going on around me.*
