MARY, MOTHER OF GOD JANUARY 1







Prayer Service

God gives us the gift of life. He asks us to treasure our own lives and the lives of others. Write on the Treasure Chests how you can respect and protect life. Color the Treasure Chests. Now you are ready to begin your Prayer Service:

- 1. Begin with the Signing Song, "The Treasure of Life".
- Opening Prayer (Say it together): "Lord, you ask us and command us not to kill. We come to You today, and we ask You to help us to respect life. Help us to respect one another".
- Let each person read his/her words forms the Treasure Chests. After each person, everyone responds, "Lord, help us to choose life"
- 4. End with the Lord's Prayer.

Jesus says that his family is made up of those who listen to his word and carry it out.


Do you listen to adults and try to behave?

We can:


- Live the Law of Love and the Ten Commandments.

Talk about the story. Have they ever gone on a long trip? Where were they going and why? Were they looking for something? Were they lost at any time?

Tell them how the Kings came from afar and Mary and Jesus received them well. How are people who are different, or strangers, received in their neighborhood or school?

Activities. Ask the children to draw and cut out a star. They can write on it the gift they want to give Jesus. They could also draw the gift chests of the Wise Men.

Final Prayer. Have the children present their gifts and express their commitment.

- Do you offer them something to eat or drink? What do Mary and Joseph do when they see them?

Jesus, our friend, invites you:


The wise men offered gifts to Jesus. What can you offer Jesus as a gifts?







The Story of this Feast

Great crowds came out to hear John preach in the desert, near the Jordan River. Many of the people were sorry for their sins and asked to be baptized.

One day John saw Jesus Himself coming among the people to be baptized, and Jesus was at prayer after also baptized, the skies opened and the Holy Spirit came on Him like a dove. And a voice came from heaven:"You are My beloved Son. I am pleased with You."

The meaning of this Feast...


The Holy Spirit came upon Jesus not to make Him holy, but to anoint Him for His mission off saving the world. The voice of heavenly Father made Jesus known as His own Son Whom He Loved, and Whom He was sending to be the Messiah and King, the Savior Who was to offer Himself as a sacrifice on the Cross

Jesus did not need to be baptized, because He was without sin as God's Son. When we are baptized we became children of God and the sin we got from Adam and Eve is washed away.

Te Feast of the Baptism of Jesus is on the Sunday after January 6







This game is about the life of Saint Henry de Osso.

The game is played with tokens and dice.

All player put their tokens on the number one space. Each player, in turn, rolls the dice and moves his/her token the number of spaces totaled on the dice. The first player to reach the # 27 space is the winner "Lucky Spaces".

If a player lands on a space containing a vine of grapes, that player is allowed to advanced his/her token to the next space with another vine of grapes. The player says "from vine to vine I get closer to St. Henry".

If the player lands on a space with a river (#5) that player advances immediately to the next river space (#13) the player says: "I smile from river to river".

If a player lands on # 10 space he/she immediately advances to (#22) space

January 22: Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jon 3,1-5.10 1Cor 7,29-31 Mark 1,14-20

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about the reading. Have they ever been in charge of something very important? How did they feel? How did they do it? Do they know when Jesus is asking something important of them? Do they look for excuses not o do it (for instance, playing, watching TV, or feeling lazy)?

Activities. Take some yarn to class and ask the children to make knots. Ask the children to think about things that hinder them from doing what they are asked. You can suggest some of knots. Each child breaks a knot and says: this week I will try... All answer: I want to follow you, Jesus.

You are there

Imagine you doing something really important and suddenly Jesus calls you to go somewhere. How do you react? Do you ask Jesus to wait or do you tell him you cannot go because you are too busy?


Jesus, our friend, invites you:

Jesus invites you to be with him, and just as he did Andrew, Simon, James, and John, he calls you by name. How do you respond? In the first reading, Jonah did not want to preach in the city where God had sent him. Do you sometimes resist doing what adults ask you to do?

What am I going to do?


Speak to Jesus and tell him you how it is sometimes hard for you to obey fast. Ask him for help to realize what is best for you and for people around you. Tell him what you want to do this week:

- For example: I will do what adults ask me to do, quickly and without complaining.
- For example: *I will not give any excuses for not doing my homework.*



Q: Simon, Andrew, James, and John put down their fishing nets to follow Jesus. Has anyone ever asked you to stop what you were doing so that you could do something else? How did you react when they asked you?

The first followers Jesus ever had were fishermen. He told them than, from now on, their job would be to gather up a lot of people instead of gathering up a lot fish. What qualities does a good "fisher of people" need if they are going to tell the world about Jesus' love and care?

St. Frances of Sales

January 24



Always tried to help people find their special way to God. He was kind and gentle.

Francis was born a of Sales castles in Savoy, France, on August 21, 1567. His wealthy family provided him with an excellent education. By the age of twenty-four, Francis was a Doctor of Law. He returned to Savoy and led a hardworking life. He did not seem interested in important positions or a social life. In his heart, Francis was listening to a call that kept coming back like an echo. It seemed to be an invitation from the Lord to become a priest. Francis finally tried to explain his struggle to his family. His father was very disappointed. He wanted Francis to be a great man of the world. Family influence could have accomplished that goal. Instead, Francis become a priest on December 18, 1593.

Father of Sales lived in times when Christmas were bitterly divided. He volunteered to go to a dangerous area of France to win back Catholics who had become Protestants. His father protested. He said it was bad enough that he had permitted Francis to become a priest. He was not going to let him be a martyr as well. But Francis believed that the Lord would protect him. He and his cousin, Father Louis of Sales, set out on foot for the Duchy of Chablais. The two priest, soon learned how to live with insults and physical discomforts. Their lives were frequently in danger. Little by little, however, people returned to the Church.

Francis eventually became the bishop of Geneva, Switzerland. With the help of St. Jane of Chantal, he started a religious order of sisters in 1610. These women are called the order of the Visitation. Francis wrote wonderful books about the spiritual life and the way to become holy. The books, *Treatise on the Love of God and Introduction to the Devout life*, are still in print today. They are considered spiritual "classics".

Bishop of Sales died on December 28, 1622, at the age of fifty-six. He was declared a saint Pope Innocent X in 1665. Because of his heroic dedication to the Church, he was given the special title "Doctor of the Church". He is also the patron saint of journalists.



OUR FRIENDS THE SAINTS

He is a very happy boy: he does not how to read but the has a very good memory and he is capable and athletic.

Twice a week he goes with his brother Joseph and his Mom Margaret to the nearby town of Castelnuovo, to sell a little cartload of products: maize, potatoes, loaves of bread... Many people go to the market of Castelnuovo, and street performers who, after putting on their show -of magic, juggling and acrobatics -pass around a hat into which the astonished spectators throw their coins. John watches them attentively. He wants to learn too. But for what? Can it be that he also wishes to earn his living by coaxing money out of others? No.



At nine years of age John had a dream that remained with him throughout his hole life: *he found himself in the middle* of a group of boys who were swearing a they played. John, wounded by their blasphemous words, throws himself upon them and commences to deal out punches right, left and centre Then he hears a voice (the voice of God) which says to him: "Not with blows, John, but with sweetened and charity, you will attract them and you will make them your friends and you will teach them".

To work! He began to practice in secret the tricks he saw in Castelnouvo, and to learn the catechism and the sermons of the priest in his church. When he had *learned everything* one Sunday after Mass, in a powerful voice, he cried out: Come, come, тy friends!... Come and be entertained. When all the people had gathered around him, he began to repeat the sermon of that day, adding in jokes and funny incidents that made it more pleasant and entertaining.

St. John Bosco was born on the 16th of August 1815 in Becchi, near the Italian city of Turin. He is the patron Saint of the youth because of the good he did and continues to do from heaven, for children and young people.

Afterwards, he continue with magic tricks, acrobatics and pirouettes, he cut off a chicken's head, and, when he had caught everyone's interest, he invited everyone to pray the Rosary, saying that he would resurrect the chicken afterwards.

In this way, with humor and charm, with a lot of effort on his part, and above all with a lot of love for souls, **he succeeded in bringing many, many souls closer to God,** so that instead of wasting their time and doing bad things, they were with him having fun and learning good things.
