Then the angel Gabriel said the Holy Spirit will rest upon you, and God's power will rest upon you. For this reason the holy child will be called the Son of God.





May 7: 4th Sunday of Easter


Talk about the story. Speak with the children about their friends. Tell them to describe their friends. Would Jesus be their friend?

Activities and Prayer. Bring to class a drawing of the good shepherd cut out of felt figures or on a big poster. Ask the children to draw sheep and to write their name on them. On the other side of the sheep they can write their commitment for the week. As they stick their sheep on the poster, all say: "Thank you, Jesus, you know us by name"

What am I going to do?


Speak to Jesus and tell him how there are sometimes people who want you to take the wrong path, or to join a gang, or to try drugs, alcohol, or tobacco. Ask him for strength not to listen to those bad shepherds. Tell him what you want to do:

- For example: I will listen to the adults at home and school so that I can know what Jesus wants of me.
- For example: When someone asks me to do the wrong thing, I will say no, and tell my parents immediately.

Scripture References: Luke 15:1-7; Mathew 18:11-14; John 10:11

- 1. One evening, Jesus was invited to a certain house for a dinner. <u>Two men</u>, dressed in fine clothes, were passing by. When they saw the guests arriving, they stopped to look. One of them said, "Let's pretend we are talking, and let's watch and see who was invited this time to eat with Jesus." As they saw people coming, one said: "I can't believe it! Look who's coming!"
- 2. "It's the <u>store keeper</u>," said the other. "Everyone knows he charges too much; he's not fair!" "Look right behind him," said the other one, "there's the <u>biggest liar</u> in town! Don't tell me <u>he's</u> invited to the same dinner with Jesus! Everyone knows how stingy that man is with his money. He doesn't trust anyone; he carries his money with him all the time!" (Remove these three men.)

<u>Many more people</u> came to watch. The news spread fast amongst them: "Jesus is eating with people who are bad and don't care about anyone but themselves! Jesus is eating with sinners"

Did Jesus care about these people? Ye, he did. Do you think he cared about those who were outside watching too? He did, and He wished that they would understand how He felt about people who were called sinners. Later, when <u>Jesus</u> had a chance, He helped them to understand by telling them a story (Remove house):

- 3. One there was a good <u>shepherd</u> who had a hundred <u>sheep</u> and knew each one by name. Of course he noticed when one of his lambs was missing. He left the ninety-nine in a grassy field (Remove shepherd) and went right away to look for the one that was lost.
- 4. <u>He</u> searched among the <u>rocks</u> and <u>bushes</u> until he found the <u>lamb</u>. It was caught in a <u>thorn bush</u>. Do you think he was angry? No, he was very happy and looked at his lamb so gently. He bent down (Shepherd by thorn bush) and carefully freed it from the sharp thorns that were tearing its skin. The poor lamb was crying; it was so helpless.

The shepherd put the lamb on its feet (Remove the lamb from thorn bush), but is was shaking so badly that it couldn't even take a step. The shepherd picked his lamb up gently (Remove) and put it <u>on his shoulders</u>. He carried it all the way back through the thorns, bushes and rocks, so that the lamb wouldn't hurt itself anymore.

- 5. When he arrived home (<u>Shepherd with sheep</u>), the shepherd called his friends and neighbors and said, "Let's celebrate! I have found my sheep that was lost!" When Jesus finished the story about this good shepherd, He asked the people, "Do you understand what I am saying? I am like this Good Shepherd. I care about each one of you. I want to help those who have wandered away from God, because they are suffering and need me to bring them back."
- 6. Many of the people understood what Jesus was saying. They were sorry for being jealous of those who needed Jesus' help so much.

Suggestions for Deepening

(Numbers correspond to paragraph numbers)

3. Ask the children if they know how many one-hundred is. Show them by having ten of them raise their hands an show their then fingers.

Ask children if they have ever seen sheep; what do they look like; what kind of sound do they make, etc.?

- 4 Ask the children where they think the shepherd looked for the lost lamb. The children might not know what a thornbush is. Explain if necessary . Ask: Why did the shepherd carry the lamb back?
- 5. Ask the children if they ever heard of someone who ran away from home and got into trouble; ask how they think the parents felt (e.g. sad, worried, etc)
- 6. Ask how they would feel if their brothers or sister ran away. (Some might say things just to show off; help them to speak sincerely.)

Discuss how we can sometimes be like lost sheep (e.g. by not coming to class to learn more about Jesus; going with "bad" friends; playing outside instead of going into church for Mass, etc.) Also discuss ways of coming back.




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Teacher of God's Law of Love




- Play in twos or threes. Each player needs a marker.

May 14: 5th Sunday of Easter

Talk about the story. Speak with the children about plants. What happens to the branches if they are torn from the trunk and are not replanted? Can they do everything on their own? Whom do they need? What doe being very close to another person mean? To whom do they feel united? What does "giving fruit" mean? What good fruits can they give?

Activities and Prayer. Bring grapes to class. Observe how grapes are united to little branches. The branches, in turn, are united to a trunk. The grapes are the fruits of the branches. Ask the children to place in a basket a small cluster of grapes for each good action they have done this week. All answer: "Thank you, Jesus, for wanting us so close to you." They can place another cluster for each good work they have committed to do for the week.




- Jesus promises to helps us and to be with us always. Do you also want to be with Him?

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about people they really love. What do those people do for them? What would they do for those people? What is very important for them that they would be willing to do anything for it? It seems we are extremely important to God, since Jesus is ready to give up his life for us. What can we say to Jesus?

Activities and Prayer. Have the children cut out big letters spelling joy. On the back they can write their commitments and their names on front. They can present the letters at the Offertory.

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
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
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JESUS RETURNS TO THE FATHER THE ASCENSION

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about the story. How do they feel when they are entrusted with something by an adult? Are they proud, scared, or happy?

Activities. Hand out a letter in an envelopes that you have already prepared to each child. Each envelope should contain a letter that is a "message form Jesus". For example, some messages may include: "I want you to smile lot;" "I want you to help someone;" "I want you to remember to do your homework".

Final Prayer. As each child reads the message he or she received, all respond: "I will announce your love, Jesus"
