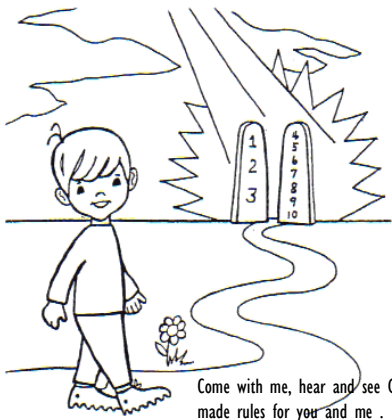

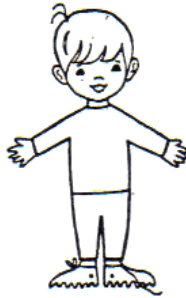

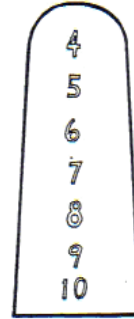

They are even more important than the traffic light that tells us when to stop and when to go.



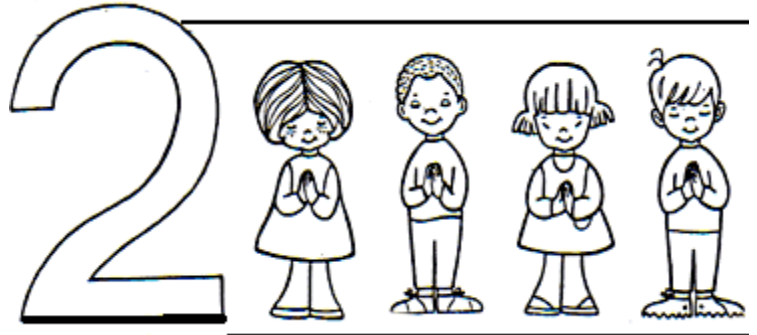

These Stations of the Cross are based on the Gospel and promote Christian unity.

The City of Jerusalem Welcomes Jesus

April 1:
Palm Sunday

Isa. 50:4-7;
Phil. 2:6-11;
Lucas 22:14-23,56

Talk about the story. Speak with the children about a time when they saw some famous person. Were they very excited? Speak about the story in the gospel. Would they be very excited if they saw Jesus? How can they recognize Jesus around them?

Jesus knew he would suffer if he was to be faithful to what God wanted from him. What makes them suffer? Do they complain a lot, or do they try to endure it with courage?

Activities and prayer. Weave palms and ask the children to write their commitments in little pieces of paper which they can place between the folds of the palms.

All say: we recognize you as our Lord. Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!

You are there. Do the shouts “Blessed is He who comes,” and “Hosanna” sound familiar? Where have you heard that? Are you among the people who receive Jesus? Are you happy that Jesus is entering the city? Are you among the friends of Jesus who will eat the Passover tonight?



Jesus, your friend, invites you:

- ☞ Jesus did not want any privileges even though he was the son of God. Do you sometimes demand from your family praises, or things you want them to buy for you?
- ☞ People recognize that Jesus comes in the name of God. Do you see when adults tell you what God wants of you?

What am I going to do?

Speak with Jesus and tell him about people you like to welcome. Tell him you would like to listen well so that you can recognize him in others. Tell him what you would like to do:

- ☺ For example: I will do my homework even if I find it difficult.
- ☺ For example: When someone praises me for something, I will thank God who always help me.

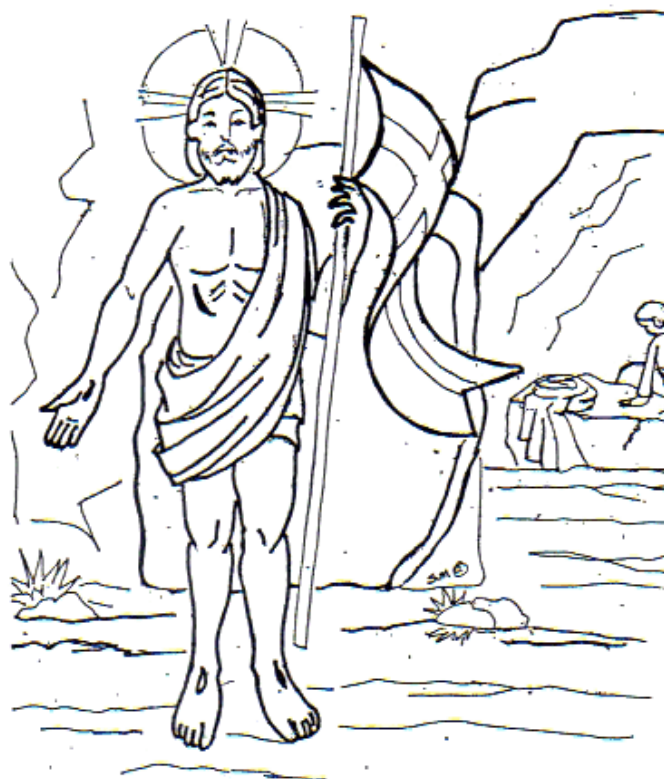
April 8:
Easter Sunday

Acts 10:34-37-43;
Col. 3:1-4;
Luke 24:1-12

Talk about the story. Speak with the children about spring, and how some plants that seemed to be dead are re-viving. Speak also about the cocoons which become butterflies. Tell them about the empty tomb and how the women must have felt when they saw Jesus was not there. Explain the custom of Easter representing Jesus' tomb, but they have many colors indicating life and joy.

Activities and prayer. Bring Egg shells to class. Ask the children to write in colorful pieces of papers some of the things they would like to change in their homes, families, or communities. Make a prayer to Jesus asking him to change all those things into life, joy, and hope.

You are there. How do you react when you see that Jesus, who was really dead last time you saw him, is not in the tomb? Are you scared? What about when the angel comes and says Jesus is alive? Do you believe it?



Q: Jesus' friends go to his tomb and Jesus' body is gone. He has risen from the dead. How would you feel if you came to Jesus' tomb and it was empty? Would you be afraid or excited that he has risen from the dead?

Jesus, your friend, invites you:

Jesus had announced that God is stronger than evil and death. Do you believe God can raise the dead? What are some of the things you think are so very bad that they have no solution?

What am I going to do?

Speak with Jesus and tell him about something really, really bad. Ask him for help to trust that God is stronger than that. Tell him what you would like to do:

☺ *For example: I will trust that God is present in everything and gives us strength to overcome difficulties.*

☺ *For example: I will be joyful to make life more pleasant for others.*

Jesus greets his fearful friends

April 15:
Second Sunday of
Easter

Acts 5:12-16;
Rev. 9:1-13, 17-19;
John 20:19-31

Talk about the story. Speak with the children about things they believe. For instance, do they believe that the messages of horoscopes and Walter Mercado are true? Why? What do adults in their homes think? Do the children believe what adults at home and teachers tell them? Speak about the story of today's gospel. How would Thomas have felt when they told him they had seen Jesus?



Activities. Dramatize the story, changing the end. Thomas believes what they tell him. What is his reaction? Surprise, joy, hugging friends?

Final prayer. Ask the children to write down things that would give them peace and tranquility and that would help them to calm their fears down (changes at home or school ...) As they present their papers, all say: you are our peace, Jesus.

You are there. Are you like Thomas and do not believe that the others have seen Jesus? Are you scared thinking that he has gone through the walls, like a ghost?

Q: When Jesus reappears to his friends after his death, his friend Thomas does not believe it is him at first. Can you remember a time when someone asked you to believe something you did not understand? What did you do?

Jesus, your friend, invites you:

📖 Jesus tells us that he gives us peace, because he alone brings us life. What are you scared of? What do you ask Jesus for?

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus and tell him what bothers and scares you, the things that happen at home or in your neighborhood. Ask him for help to be at peace. Tell him what you would like to do:

☺ For example: I will trust what the adults at home tell me.

☺ For example: I will ask Jesus for help not to be afraid.

Talk about the story. Speak about the times when we really make an effort to do something and it seems we fail. Do we easily give up?

Speak about the story of the miraculous catch. Why did they fish so much? Was it only a miracle, or was it also because they trusted Jesus and changed their attitude? How would have Peter felt when Jesus asked him if he loved Jesus? Have they ever felt that someone they had hurt forgave them? How did they feel?

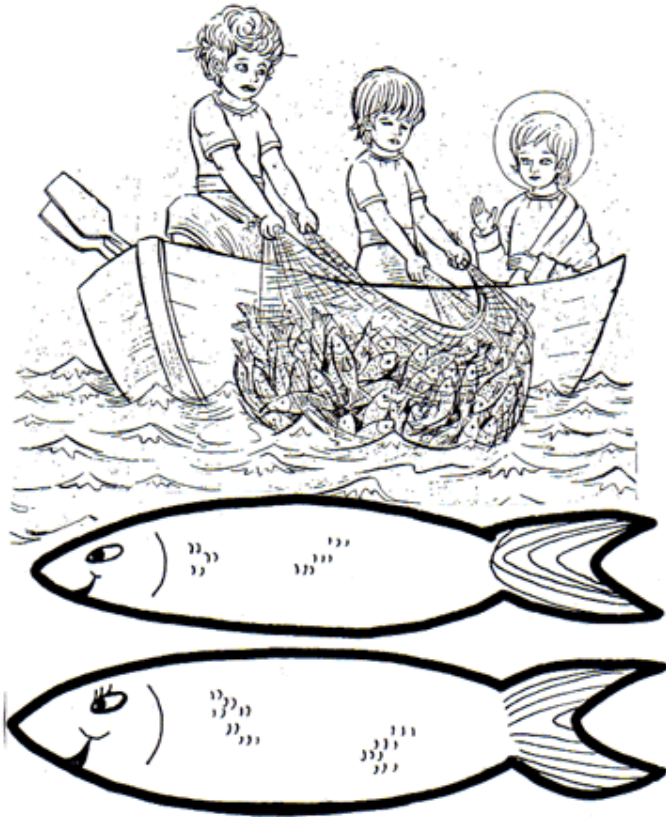
Activities and prayer. Let the children draw, color, and cut out fish where they can write their commitments for this week. As they leave them in a basket, all say: You know I love you, Jesus.

You are there. What do you think seeing so much fish?

Do you think Jesus is a ghost?

Are you scared when you see him appear?

Imagine you are Peter and Jesus asks you if you love him. What do you say?



Q: Peter is sad that he denied knowing Jesus, but Jesus forgives him and asks him to lead his followers. Are you ever sad about something bad you have done? Do you ask Jesus to forgive you?

Jesus is a good shepherd

Acts 13:14,43-52;
Rev. 7:9,14-17;
John 10:27-30

April 29:
4th Sunday of Easter

Talk about the story. Speak with the children about shepherds. Have they ever seen a shepherd in their towns? What do shepherds do? Have they seen how the sheep follow the shepherd and do as he tells them?

Who knows them well? What voice do they like to listen to? When a person in the family tells them something, do they listen immediately, or do they play deaf so that they do not have to do what they are told? Do they realize that those voices are often the voice of Jesus?

Activities and prayer. Let the children draw, and cut out sheep and write on them their names on one side and what they want to do on the other. Have a picture or painting of the Good Shepherd in class. Ask the children to place their sheep close to the shepherd. As they do it, all say: You are our shepherd, Jesus.



You are there. Who are the sheep Jesus is talking about?

Do you recognize the voices of people close to you? Whose are the voices you like to hear?

Q: Jesus tells his friends that he is like a good shepherd, who listens and cares for his sheep. How is Jesus a good shepherd for you? Do you listen and run to him when you are in need of his help?

Jesus, your friend, invites you:

- ☞ Jesus says that he knows his sheep by name. Who knows you well?
- ☞ Jesus says that his sheep recognize his voice. That is, what Jesus wants you to do?
- ☞ Jesus says his sheep follow him. What can you do to follow Jesus?

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus and tell him whom you would like to listen to. Tell him you want to recognize his voice in the people around you when they ask you to do good things. Tell him how you felt. Tell him what you would like to do:

- ☺ For example: I will do my homework without waiting to be reminded many times.
- ☺ For example: I will help at home as soon as I realize my mom, or another adult, needs something.

St. Francis of Paola

April 9

St. Francis was born in the tiny village of Paola, Italy, around 1416. His parents were poor but humble and holy. They had prayed to St. Francis of Assisi for a son. When he was born, they named him after the saint. The boy went to school taught by the Franciscan priests. There he learned to read. When he was fifteen, with his parents' permission, he went to live in a cave. He wanted to be a hermit and spend his life for God alone.

When he was twenty, other young men joined him. St. Francis left his cave. The people of Paola built a church and monastery for him and his followers. He called his new religious order the "Minims". "Minims" means "the least of all".

Everyone loved St. Francis. He prayed for them and worked many miracles. He told his followers that they must be kind and humble, and do much penance. He himself was the best example of the virtues he preached. Once someone visited the saint and insulted him to his face. When the man was finished, Francis did something unusual. He quietly picked up some hot coals from the fireplace and closed his hands tightly around them. But he was not burned at all. "Come, warn yourself," he said to his accuser kindler. "You are shivering because you need a little charity". At such a miracle, the visitor changed his mind about Francis. From then on, he admired him greatly.

King Louis XI of France had not lived a very good life. He called for St. Francis when he was dying. Just the thought of dying made the king terrified. He wanted Francis to work a miracle to cure him. Instead, the saint gently helped the frightened man to prepare well to die a holy death. The king had a change of heart. He accepted God's will and died quietly in the arms of the saint.

St. Francis lived a long life praising and loving God. He died on Good Friday in 1507, at the age of ninety-one.

Sometimes we can get so wrapped up in loud music, television shows, videos, and computer games that we can find ourselves just living for now. We might not even give any thought or time for our schedule that will help us reach eternal happiness with God? Daily Mass? Morning



HE WROTE MANY LETTERS TO HIS FOLLOWERS

St. John Baptist de la Salle

April 7

St. John Baptist de la Salle was born in Rheims, France, on April 30, 1651. His parents were from the nobility. John was used to elegant living. But he was a devout boy, too. He loved Jesus and his Church. In fact, he was studying to become a priest when both his parents died. He had to leave the seminary and go home to take care of his brothers.



But while he was teaching and training them, he kept on studying too. His brothers turned out to be fine young men. When their studies were completed, John Baptist was ordained a priest.

At that time, the nobles, like Father de la Salle's family, had the chance to be well-educated. However, the common people remained poor and ignorant. They had no opportunity to go to school. St John Baptist felt very sorry for the children of the poor. He decided to do something about the situation. He began to open schools for them. To provide teachers, he started a new order, the Brothers of the Christian Schools. Although Father de la Salle also taught the children himself, he spend most of his time training the teaching brothers. For them he wrote a rule of life and a book explaining the best way to teach. He was one of the best educators of all time. He believed in teaching in the language of the people, not in Latin, as others did. He grouped the students into classes. He stressed the importance of silence while the lesson was being taught.












After a while, the brothers opened more schools. They taught the sons of the working people and nobles, too. Many difficulties faced the new order. St. Baptist's constant prayer and sacrifices blessed the work. It continued to grow and spread. Father de la Salle's health was never good. His asthma and arthritis caused him constant pain. Despite this, he would never allow himself to take on an easier lifestyle. He died on Good Friday, April 7, 1719, at the age of sixty-eight. He was proclaimed a saint by Pope Leo XII in 1900. Pope Pius XII declared him the patron of teachers in 1950.

St. John Baptist de la Salle and his religious congregation teach us the value of an education. Do we take advantage of our opportunities to acquire an education? Apply ourselves in class? Do our homework? When we do not feel like studying, we can whisper a prayer for help to St. John Baptist de la Salle.

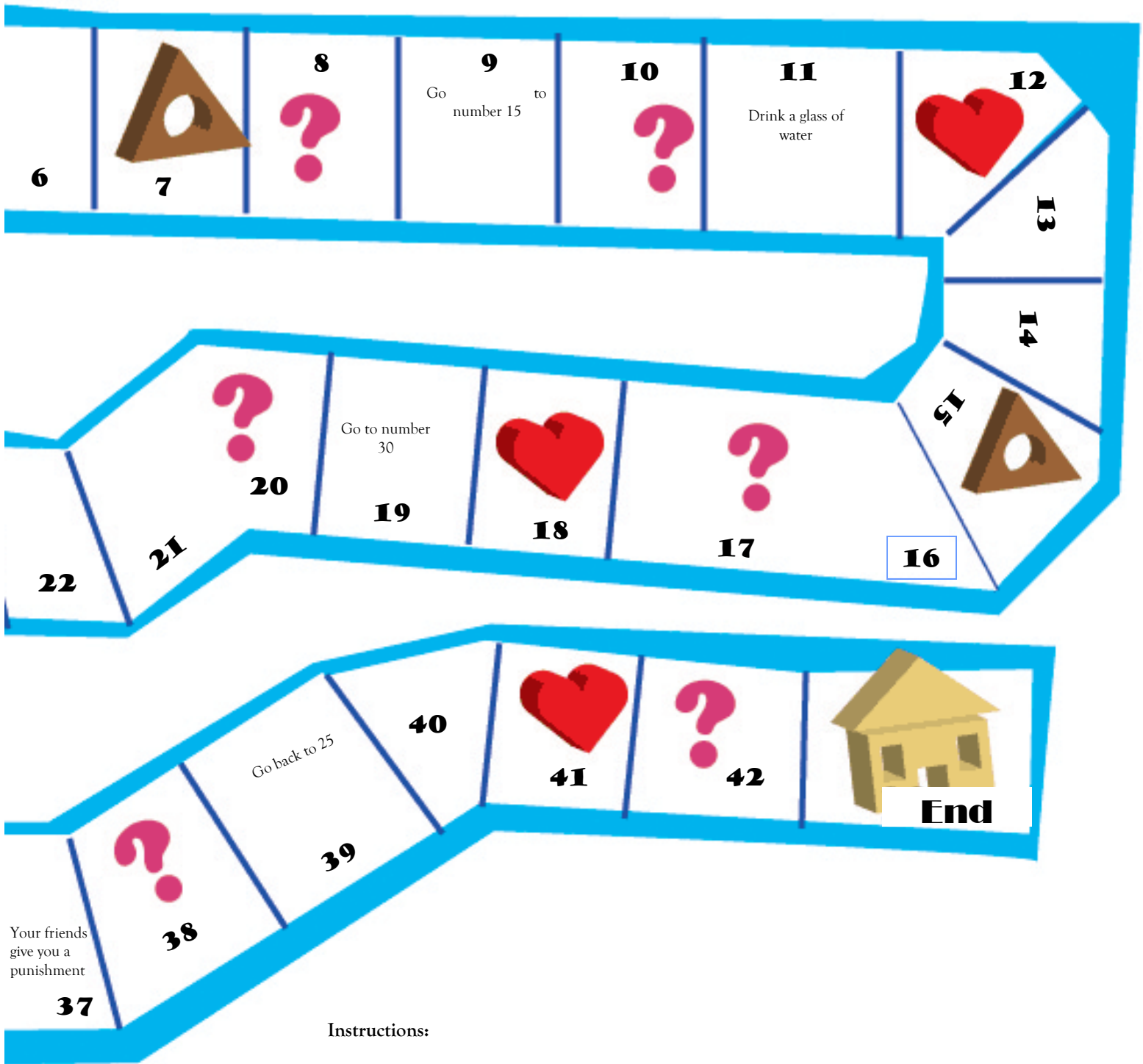
