

> Virtue: OBEDIENCE


- She belonged to nobility.
- Since a child, she imitated Christ.
- She lived during a time when Christians had to hide in the Catacoumbs to celebrate mass.
- She mingled with the slaves and would help them with their most difficult tasks. She even washed the feet of their masters and of the slaves themselves as Christ did.
- During that time, Christians that were discovered were put to death. She knew this but the thought of dying for Christ made her happy.
- She would go to the secret meetings with the Christians in the Catacoumbs. She prayed much.
- Since she was young, she offered her virginity to Christ. She wanted to be his wife only. Now, all her life belonged to him. Since that day, she had a special angel that cared for her and she felt his presence
- Her parents do no know of this offering and promise her hand in marriage to Valerio.
- She accepts marring him with the assurance that thanks to her prayers and sacrifices, he also would convert and no longer worship false gods.
- The night of her wedding, she tells her husband her secret: "An angel of God watches over me because I belong to Jesus. If my angel sees that you do not love me with a holy love, he will defend me and you will die. But if you respect my virginity, he will love you with the same love as me and will protect you". He responded that he also wanted to see the angel but if it was a lie, he would kill her.
- "To see hem, you must believe in Jesus, be baptized, and become Christian." He did.
- He returned to where Cecilia was kneeling in prayer surrounded by a bright light. There appeared a beautiful angel that floated close to her with two crowns of flowers that he placed on the heads husband and wife. He told them that these flowers were from the garden of heaven and would protect their purity.
- Valerio showed his brother Tiburcio everything he had learned. He also converted and was baptized.
- Both brothers were discovered, accused, and decapitated.
- Because Cecelia also refused to adore the false gods, she also was accused and sentenced to death. They tried to boil a caldron of water but the water would not heat. So they sent her to be decapitated.. Although they tried three times, she only bed a little.
- She finally died. Her wish to die for Christ was grated and she went to heaven to be with her spouse, Jesus.





- She was the youngest of 7 children.
- She had many friends. She has a pleasant personality, was amiable and joyful.
- Her family prayed the Rosary daily.
- She loved to read. She loved to entertain and take care of young children. She was particularly loving with the elderly, especially her grandmother.
- She helped her mother clean the house.
- Her family was very close and they shared everything.
- One day she became ill and suffered severe headaches.
- The sickness prevented her form writing.
- Her mother encouraged her and the rest of the family to offer up this suffering for the conversion of sinners. And they did.
- She explained that pain, for the children of God was a treasure that should not be wasted.
- She was operated many times. She had to be in a wheel chair but she never lost her joy.
- She asked that they write a list of her petitions for after Communion. She saved them in an envelope. She was so weak she could not pray well. After Communion, she would squeeze the envelope and say quietly, "I pray for all this".
- She was always patient and docile to the directions of those who cared for her.
- She died at age 14.



For the People for God





March 4: Second Sunday of Lent Gen. 15:5-12,17-18; Phil. 3:20-4:1;

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about what they think happiness is. What must a person do to be happy? What do their parents do to make the family happy? What makes the children happy?

Activities and prayer. Have the children draw and cut out construction paper objects or symbols of what makes them happy. Ask the children to express what they need to be happy and their commitment for the week. As each child speaks up, respond: "Jesus, we want to walk with you"

You are there. Imagine the scene on the mountain. How do you feel? Are you happy to be there? What do you tell Jesus when he says you must go back to work? Do you ask to say on a little longer?



Q: One day Jesus appeared to his friends as dazzling and bright as the sun. How would you describe what Jesus might have looked like when he appeared to his friends? Is this the way you think of Jesus?


Jesus, your friend, invites you:

- ☐ What do you find difficult or boring to do?
- ☐ What do you think Jesus wants you to do?

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus and tell him about things you really do not like to do. Tell him about a time when you felt really happy. Did the happiness last? Ask Jesus for the help to do the right things, even if they are difficult or boring. Tell him what you would like to do this week:

- © For example: <u>I will make an effort to do my homework well.</u>
- © For example: I will not complain if I have to do something I do not want to

March 11: Third Sunday of Lent

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about the things they usually what right away and those for which they are willing to wait. What type of things do their parents constantly ask them to do? Why do their parents have to repeat these requests? When their parents or teachers are about to punish them, do the children ask for another chance? Do they usually get it? Are the children patient with younger children?

Activities and prayer. Prepare a construction-paper tree. The tree should have leaves but no fruit. Ask the children to draw and cut fruit. On the fruit they should write what they would like to work on —such as well done homework, helping around the house, forgiving someone, listening better. As they place their fruits on the tree, they should express their commitment for the week. As each child places his or her fruit, all respond: "Thank you, Jesus, for being patient with me".

You are there. Would you cut down the fig tree? What do you think Jesus was trying to say by telling this story? What does the fig tree represent?

Could the fig tree be you?



• A man became impatient with his tree and wanted to cut it down because it did not produce enough fruit. Are you ever impatient with things that do not go your way or people who do not do what you want them to?




What am I going to do?



The story of a good father

March 18: Fourth Sunday of Lent Jos. 5:9, 10-12; 2 Cor. 5:17-21; Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about a time when they felt separated from someone they love because of a family feud. How did they feel? When they do something wrong, do they feel confident that their parents will forgive them? What do they think is unforgivable? Does God forgive everything? What does a person who needs forgiveness have to do?

Activities. Act out the story of the prodigal son and let the children make up different endings. How does the older brother react? Does he go to the party?

Final Prayer. As each child expresses his or her commitment for the week, all answer: "You always welcome me to your home. Thank you, Jesus"

You are there. If you were the younger son, how would you feel when you return home? If you were the father, what would you said to your son? If you were the older brother, what would you say to your father and to your younger brother?



• A sorry young man who has been bad return home, and his father welcomes him back with a big party. Would you forgive the young man if he was your brother? Is it easy for you to forgive those who have hurt you?

Jesus, your friend, invites you:

Think of a time when you did something bad and thought you would not be forgiven. Did you ask for forgiveness? How dod you feel when you were forgiven?

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus and tell him how you feel when you do something bad and are forgiven. Tell him how you feel when your parents forgive your brother or sister and you think he or she does not deserve forgiveness. Tell him what you would like to do this week:

- © For example: <u>I will ask for forgiveness when I have hurt someone.</u>
- For example: <u>I will rejoice when someone else is forgiven</u>



No one could throw the first stone

March 25: Fifth Sunday of Lent Is. 43:16-21; Phil. 3:8-14; John 8:1-11

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about criticism. What do they criticize in other children, their teachers, or neighbors? Do they hear a lot of criticism at home? Why is it better not to criticize others all the time? Is it hard for them to admit when they have done something wrong?

Activities and prayer. Give each of the children a stone. Ask them to paint something they are sorry about on the stone. They should place the stones in a basket to be taken up at the Offertory. As they express their commitment or prayer for the week, all say: "Lord, I want to start".

You are there. What do you think Jesus was writing in the dirt? What would you have done if you had a stone? Do you think the woman deserved to be punished? How do you think she felt when she left? Do you think she sinned again?



A crowd wanted to stone to death a woman who had sinned. But Jesus told the crowd that only those who had never sinned could throw a stone. Do you judge your friends or family harshly or do you forgive like Jesus?

Jesus, your friend, invites you:

Jesus forgives and invites you to try to stop doing wrong and bad things. Do you need forgiveness for something right now?

What am I going to do?

Speak to Jesus and tell him about things have done that you are sorry about. Ask him for strength no to do them again. Tell him what you would like to do this week:

- For example: I will try to be patient with someone who is bothering me.
- © For example: <u>I will forgive someone who has hurt me and will</u>

ask for forgiveness from someone I have hurt.
