


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Hits for December's Mystery Saints

A. He love Jesus very much and followed wit loyalty. He was there in the Calvary, along with Virgin Mary, At the foot of Jesus' cross. He wrote the fourth gospel, the Gospel of Love.

December 27

C. Her name means "full of light", and she is also known as the patron of good eyesight. Her mother was gravely sick and she took her to the miraculous tomb of Saint Agatha. The graces she received there were double, since her mom was physically and spiritually cured. She was accused of being a Christian by her fiancé, and died decapitated on December 13 of the year 300.

December 13

E. He was a bishop who loved little children and told them about Jesus. Children believed that he would leave presents in their shoes or stocking in December

December 6

B. He was born in Rome, around the year 305; the successor of Pope Liberio, in an era were there was an anti-pope. He faced many hardships and fought to keep all Christians united and expand the Christian faith. He is the patron of the catacombs and Christian arqueology

December 11

D. He was born in 1506, the same year that Columbus died. As a youth he studied in Paris, and met with Ignatius of Loyola, who made him realize that the most important thing is to save the soul. He joined the Company of Jesus and went to missions in India. He translated many prayers and Christian articles, and performed baptisms as well. He died in China, while planning one of this missions to go to Japan.

F. He was one of the first Christians. He was very kind and helpful to others. He was not afraid to tell about Jesus, even though people were cruel to him because he was a Christian. One of the first martyrs, he was stoned to death.

Second Sunday of Advent December 6, 2009

Readings: Baruch, 5:1-9; Psalm 125 Phil 1:4-6, 8-11 Luke 3: 1-6

The Preaching of John the Baptist

It was the fifteenth year of the rule of Emperor Tiberius; Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Phillip was ruler of the territory of Iturea and Trachonitis; Lysanias was ruler of Abilene, and Annas and Caiaphas were High Priests. At that time the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the desert.

So John went throughout the whole territory of the Jordan River, preaching, "Turn away from your sins and be baptized, and God will forgive your sins."

As it is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah:

"Someone is shouting in the desert: Get the road ready for the Lord; make a straight path for him to travel! Every valley must be filled up, every hill and mountain leveled off. The winding roads must be made straight, and the rough paths made smooth. The whole human race will see God's salvation!" (Luke 3: 1-6)

Reflection

John calls for a change of life to prepare the way of the Lord. We must straighten what is crooked in our lives, remove the obstacles and walls built by selfishness. John says that obstacle must be overcome so that Jesus can be with us. Is there anything in your home and family that you think is not totally right? What can you do to make things easier? What are some of the obstacles in their lives that are hard to overcome to prepare to receive Jesus?

Activity

Light the second candle of the Advent Wreath. Prayer together the prayer for this week and then share how they are preparing to receive Jesus. In the next page you will find and activity.

Prayer



Third Sunday of Advent December 13, 2009

Readings: Genesis 3:9-15, 20; Psalm Isaiah 12, 3.46 5-6; Philippians 4:4-7; Luke 3:10-18

The Preaching of John the Baptist

The people asked him, "What are we to do, then?" He answered, "Whoever has two shirts must give one to the man who has none, and whoever has food must share it." Some tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what are we to do?" Don't collect more than is legal, "he told them. Some soldiers also asked him, "What about us? What are we to do?" He said to them,

"Don't take money from anyone by force or accuse anyone falsely. Be content with your pay."

People's hopes began to rise, and they began to wonder whether John perhaps might
be the Messiah. So John said to all of them, "I baptize you with water, but someone
is coming who is much greater than I am. I am not good enough even to untie his
sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. He has his winnowing
shovel with him, to thresh out all the grain and gather the wheat into his barn; but
he will burn the chaff in a fire that never goes out." In many different ways John
preached the Good News to the people and urged them to change their ways.

Reflection

The coming of Jesus calls us to a change of life; to share, to free our hearts from selfishness, to give up any ambitions or power or money. Our greatest joy must be to give ourselves to others and to perform good deeds. John invites us to prepare to receive Jesus by sharing what we have with others. Tell Jesus about the things you have that you

would like to share with others. Tell him what you want to do this week.

The readings remind us that Christmas is close. As it gets closer, what give them joy?

Activity

This week the pink candle is light. Say the prayer for this week. Share with the children the things that give them joy and those they plan to share with others. Remind them to bring a toy or gift for someone who doesn't have any.

Prayer

Lord, you are near, and that fills us with joy. May the conviction of your presence motivate us to bring joy to one another in our family, and to all those around us. Amen



The Story of Our Lady of Guadalupe



Since the arrival of the first missionaries and thanks to the preaching of the Gospel, the people started their conversions to God.



A 57 years old Indian, named Juan Diego, had converted to the Christian faith and he loved Mary very much. He lived in Tulpetlac with his aged uncle, Juan Bernardino, and he went to Mass every Saturday.



On the 9th of December 1531, which was a Saturday, he was walking to Tlatelolco to attend Mass and to pay homage to the Blessed Virgin. As he reached the little hill called Tepeyac, the Blessed Virgin appeared to him calling him by his name: "Juan ... dearest Juan Diego" because She knows us by our names.



And when he reached the top of the hill, he saw a most radiant Maiden with her clothing shining like the sun. Then She talks to him: "Where are you going". "I am going to Tlatelolco, to my Lady's Mass". And She said: "I am the Ever Virgin Holy Mary, Mother of the True God, your Mother and the Mother of all men. And I want that they would build my Temple here for I, your compassionate Mother, will listen to all their needs." And She sent him to see the Bishop.



As soon as he found himself before the Bishop Fray Juan de Zumarraga, he knelt and revealed to him the message from the Queen of Heaven. The Bishop said to him: "You will come again and I will hear you calmly". The Bishop, thinking it was a fantasy, dismissed him and asked him to return some other time



Juan Diego retuned home and passing by the little hill, the Blessed Virgin was there waiting for him. "My dear Lady, Queen, my dear little girl, I did go to where you sent me but the Bishop doesn't think it's true". And the Virgin said: "Listen, my youngest and dearest son, go again tomorrow to see the Bishop".



Obedient to the wishes of the Blessed Virgin, Juan Diego went again to see the Bishop who asked him for a sign form the Queen of Heaven so that he could believe.



Juan Diego hurried in search of the priest, avoiding the place where he would meet Our Lady, but She came to block his way, asking: "Dearest of My sons, where are your going?" and he told Her everything, calling Her: "My little Maiden, My Daughter, my smallest Girl. And the Blessed Virgin answered: "Am I not here to help you? Are you not under My shadow and My protection? Do not fear, your uncle is well. Go up to the top of the hill, gather some flowers and bring them to me.



The Blessed Virgin took the flowers with Her precious hands and said: "My youngest and dearest son, these different kinds of roses are the proof, the sign that you will take to the Bishop."



When Juan Diego arrived at his house, he found that a sickness had struck his uncle Juan Bernardino. So next morning, instead of going to where the Blessed Lady was waiting, he went to get a priest, a s his uncle had asked.



Juan Diego climbed to the top of the hill and when he reached there, he was astonished to see so many beautiful roses, when it still was not their season. Then he began to cut them, placing them in his ayate.



When he came to the presence of the Bishop, he held out his ayate and just as the roses fell to the floor, the beloved image of the Perfect Virgin Holy Mary appeared in the form and figure which is now preserved in the Temple of Tepeyac with the name of "Virgin of Guadalupe", blessing all who go to see Her, especially the children, whose Mother She is.



Fourth Sunday of advent December 20, 2009

Readings: Micah 5:1-4a Psalm 79 Hebrews 10:5-10; Luke 1: 39-45

Mary Visits Elizabeth

Soon afterward Mary got ready and hurried off to a town in the hill country of Judea. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby moved within her. Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and said in a loud voice, "You are the most blessed of all women, and blessed is the child you will bear! Why should this great thing happen to me, that my Lord's mother comes to visit me? For as soon as I heard your greeting, the baby within me jumped with gladness. How happy you are to believe that the Lord's message to you will come true!" (Luke 1:39-45)

Reflection

Mary doesn't think of herself, but of what she can offer her cousin. The two women recognize the gifts and grace of God in each other.

Do you hurry up to help others when you see help is needed?

John jumped for joy when he recognized Jesus inside Mary. Do you rejoice when you see something that reminds you of Jesus' goodness?

Activity

Light the last candle of the Advent wreath. Give out paper. Ask the children to write The names of people in whom they recognize Jesus. Also write about the visitors who give them joy and why. Collect the toys or gifts they pledge to bring last week for the children who do not have any.

Prayer

Loving Jesus. True God and true man, we thank you for becoming one of us. Teach us to share your peace in our family, neighborhood, city and country. Amen





Holy Family December 27, 2009

Readings: Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14; Psalm 127; Colossians 3:12-21; Luke 2:41-52

The Boy Jesus in the Temple

Every year the parents of Jesus went to Jerusalem for the Passover Festival. When Jesus was twelve years old, they went to the festival as usual. When the festival was over, they started back home, but the boy Jesus stayed in Jerusalem. His parents did not know this; they thought that he was with the group, so they traveled a whole day and then started looking for him among their relatives and friends. They did not find him, so they went back to Jerusalem looking for him. On the third day they found him in the Temple, sitting with the Jewish teachers, listening to them and asking questions. All who heard him were amazed at his intelligent answers. His parents were astonished when they saw him, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been terribly worried trying to find you." He answered them, "Why did you have to look for me? Didn't you know that I had to be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand his answer. So Jesus went back with them to Nazareth, where he was obedient to them. His mother treasured all these things in her heart. Jesus grew both in body and wisdom, gaining favor with God and people. (Luke 2: 41-52)

Reflection

In the readings of this week, Paul gives us a whole list of attitudes to nurture at home: compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, patience, love, mutual forgiveness, support, encouragement.

Mary and Joseph soon learn that their son does not belong to them but to God.

Talk with the children about their families.

With whom do they get along best? What would they like to change about the ways they relate to family members?

Have they ever gotten lost or done something that has greatly worried their parents?

What did they learn from their experience?

Is it hard for them to obey?

Activity

Dramatize the scene of gospel.

Make a script to give to each child. Mary and Joseph looking for Jesus and the great joy they felt when they find him. What did Jesus said to his parents?

When the presentation is finish, all are unite in prayer. Each child name one adult of his home and pray for something that seems to be worrying a certain family member.

Prayer

Lord , we often suffer anxiety and worry about the future of our family and friends. Help us to foster trust and to freely speak to one another and forgive, help, and encourage one another, so that our family may become what you calls us to be. Amen

the purest of virgins.


The big red stripes speaks of God's great love,
and the blood that Jesus shed for us.


The thin red stripes tell about us, God's children,
joined in God's love.


The sweetness says how good God is.

like God's love, which lasts forever.

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






BOOKMARK WITH CHILD JESUS

Instruct the children to cut our the window and door only through the 3 thick lines, so that they to open up and the project works correctly.




ADVENT SCENCES
