

4th Sunday of Easter May 3, 2009

Readings: Acts 4:8-12; Psalm 117; 1John 3: 1-2; John 10: 11-18

I am the good shepherd, who is willing to die for the sheep. When the hired man, who is not a shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees a wolf coming, he leaves the sheep and runs away; so the wolf snatches the sheep and scatters them. The hired man runs away because he is only a hired man and does not care about the sheep. I am the good shepherd. As the Father knows me and I know the Father, in the same way I know my sheep and they know me. And I am willing to die for them. There are other sheep which belong to me that are not in this sheep pen. I must bring them, too; they will listen to my voice, and they will become one flock with one shepherd.

The Father loves me because I am willing to give up my life, in order that I may receive it back again. No one takes my life away from me. I give it up of my own free will, I have the right to give it up, and I have the right to take it back. This is what my Father has commanded me to do." (John 10: 11-18)

Reflection

Jesus says that he knows us by name.
How do you listen in order to recognize when Jesus wants to tell you something?
Who are your good shepherds?
Do you have bad shepherds in your community? How can they harm you?
Jesus gives up his life for the people he loves. Are you willing to sacrifice something for the people you love? Let us share.

Activity


Bring to the meeting place a big poster with a picture of a Good Shepherd. Cut and bring some sheep so that the children can decorate them and write their name. Encourage them to make their weekly commitment and write it on the back.


As you get together to pray each child brings his sheep and place it on the board and says: "Thank you, Jesus, for always protecting me and been important to you."

Prayer

You know us by name, Lord. You know what we are and what we can do. We thank you, Lord, because you love us thus, without conditions. Give us good ears to listen to your voice, to know when you calls us. Give us readiness to go out to meet you. Amen









5th Sunday of Easter May 10, 2009

Readings: Acts 9:26-31; Psalm 21; 1John 3: 18-24; John 15: 1-8

Jesus the real vine


"I am the real vine, and my Father is the gardener. He breaks off every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and he prunes every branch that does bear fruit, so that it will be clean and bear more fruit. You have been made clean already by the teaching I have given you. Remain united to me, and I will remain united to you. A branch cannot bear fruit by itself; it can do so only if it remains in the vine. In the same way you cannot bear fruit unless you remain in me. "I am the vine, and you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I in them, will bear much fruit; for you can do nothing without me. Those who do not remain in me are thrown out like a branch and dry up; such branches are gathered up and thrown into the fire, where they are burned. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, then you will ask for anything you wish, and you shall have it. My Father's glory is shown by your bearing much fruit; and in this way you become my disciples. (John 15: 1-8)

Reflection

In the readings or this week we find this message:
a) with trust in God's protection, the church finds
peace and continues to grow and flourish.
b) The authenticity of love must be demonstrated
in concrete actions. c) Christ depends on us to be his
hands and the voice to bring salvation to others.
What happens to the branches if they are torn from the
trunk and are no replanted? By itself it will die.
Whom do they need? Be united to the branch in the same way
we need to be unite to Jesus to grow. What does being very
close to another person mean? To whom do they feel united?
What does "giving fruit" mean? What good fruits can they give?
Do they think that giving fruit means earning lots of fame and
money?

Prayer

Sometimes, Lord we get separated from you, or we forget your presence. And then it seems life ceases to have meaning and joy. Remind us always that, in order to live and give fruit, we need to be united among ourselves and with you like the vine. Amen





Activity

What kinds of good fruits do you think Jesus likes? In the picture there is a vine and some branches. On each leaf, write a word that describes a way Jesus would like people to behave.



6th Sunday of Easter May 17, 2009

Readings: Acts 10: 25-26, 34-35, 44-48; Psalm 97; 1John 4:7-10; John 15: 9-17

I love you just as the Father loves me; remain in my love. If you obey my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have obeyed my Father's commands and remain in his love.

I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. My commandment is this: love one another, just as I love you. The greatest love you can have for your friends is to give your life for them. And you are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because servants do not know what their master is doing. Instead, I call you friends, because I have told you everything I heard from my father. You did not choose me; I chose you and appointed you to go and bear much fruit, the kind of fruit that endures. And so the Father will give you whatever you ask of him in my name. This, then, is what I command you: love one another. (John 15: 9-17)

Reflection

Make a list of the persons that love you. What do those people do for them? What would they do for them? What are you willing to sacrifice for the people you love? Jesus gave His life for us. How can we thank Jesus for what He did for us? Give enough time to share.

Activity


Prepare a poster board with a big picture of Jesus. Cut one heart for each child. Ask them to write on them their name and name of the person that loves them on front. In the back they can write what they would do for them this week. Each child paste the heart on the poster. Before the group ends they pick up their heart to take to the special person? You have a model on the next page.

Prayer

We use the word love frequently, Lord, but sometimes we don't think about how much it demands from us. It demanded your own life. Look with mercy, Lord, on the sacrifices we make for our families and friends. Give us courage to give of ourselves to others and to bring your message everywhere. Amen

Ascension of the Lord-May 24, 2009

Readings: Acts 1:1-11 Psalm 46 Eph 4: 1-13 Mark 16:15-20

He said to them, "Go throughout the whole world and preach the gospel to all people. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned. Believers will be given the power to perform miracles: they will drive out demons in my name; they will speak in strange tongues; if they pick up snakes or drink any poison, they will not be harmed; they will place their hands on sick people, and these will get well."

After the Lord Jesus had talked with them, he was taken up to heaven and sat at the right side of God. The disciples went and preached everywhere, and the Lord worked with them and proved that their preaching was true by the miracles that were performed.

Reflection

Jesus has shown a great love and now He wants his friends to help him in the mission to tell others how good God is, not only with words but with actions. How can you help Jesus to proclaim the Good News?

Activity

Prepare a small box to place some white index cards in it. In each card write a message from Jesus for each children (The mission God ask them to do). Example:

I will like you to smile often
I will like you to do your homework
without being ask.

3)I want you to help someone that is in need. 4) Help your mother with the house works.5) Visit a friend that is sick. You can add a lot more similar to this. Have the children pick up a card from the box. Each child will promise to do the mission that he or she has receive this week.

Prayer

Lord, you send us to announce God's love for all, and the salvation that comes from you. Sometimes we don't even know how to start. Give us your light and wisdom to recognize each moment of the day in which we can be your witness through our actions of honesty, justice, love and service to all. Amen





Pentecost May 31, 2009

Readings: Acts 2: 1-11; Psalm 103; 1Corinthians 12, 36-7.12-13 John 20, 19-23

Jesus Appears to His Disciples

It was late that Sunday evening, and the disciples were gathered together behind locked doors, because they were afraid of the Jewish authorities.

Then Jesus came and stood among them. "Peace be with you," he said.

After saying this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy at seeing the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you.

As the Father sent me, so I send you. "Then he breathed on them and said, Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive people's sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."

Reflection

The readings of this week give us the message that The Spirit of God cast out fear and turns the disciples into proclaimers of the Resurrection of Jesus.

Explain us the gifts and talents of each other are different, but all of us are called to serve God. Jesus gives the Spirit to the disciples and sends them out to proclaim his word and forgive sins. In which ways is the Spirit of God present in us? In their families?


Activity

Act the first reading with the children. (Acts 2,1-11 Prepare tongues, one for each. Write on them the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Form them in a circle and begin to pray. Place one in each children head, at time the wind blows. Pray over them asking for the gift he or she has receive. All hold hands in a circle and pray together.

Prayer

Send us your Spirit Lord, who brings us peace and courage to face problems. Give us the fruits of generosity, kindness. love, joy, peace, and patience to lead our family and our group to harmony and to use it to serve others. Amen






"Drive Winds and Tongues of Flame, these are the ways the Holy Spirit came!

On each of the flames is a prayer asking for help to live out one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit.


Write the word which is underlined (the gift) on the other side of the flame. Cut out and color the flames. Pray for a different gift every day. You can hang these flames,

Fruits of the Holy Spirit


















Margherita was born in Italy on April 1, 1788. She was born during a difficult time in history, a time of wars and revolutions. She was always a brave girl with a very strong faith.


Margherita, why don't you come with us to the dance?

She tenderly loved each one of her children. Soon she realized that the Lord was calling her youngest son, John Bosco, to a special mission...




Many orphan boys and young men worked in factories, without a family... Don Bosco welcomed them into his house. Mama Margherita was a mother to them.




We love you, Mama Margherita!
