

Palm Sunday, April 1, 2012

Readings: Isaiah 50, 4-7; Psalm 21; Philippians 2, 6-11; Mark 14, 1-15, 47

It was now two days before the Festival of Passover and Unleavened Bread. The chief priests and the teachers of the law were looking for a way to arrest lesus secretly and put him to death. We must not do it during the festival," they said, "or the people might riot." Jesus was in Bethany at the house of Simon, a man who had suffered from a dreaded skin disease. While Jesus was eating, a woman came in with an alabaster jar full of a very expensive perfume made of pure nard. She broke the jar and poured the perfume on Jesus' head. Some of the people there became angry and said to one another, "What was the use of wasting the perfume? It could have been sold for more than three hundred silver coins and the money given to the poor!" And they criticized her harshly. But Jesus said, "Leave her alone! Why are you bothering her? She has done a fine and beautiful thing for me. You will always have poor people with you, and any time you want to, you can help them. But you will not always have me. She did what she could; she poured perfume on my body to prepare it ahead of time for burial. Now I assure you that wherever the gospel is preached all over the world, what she has done will be told in memory of her." Then Judas Iscariot, one of the twelve disciples, went off to the chief priests in order to betray Jesus to them. They were pleased to hear what he had to say, and promised to give him money. So Judas started looking for a good chance to hand Jesus over to them. On the first day of the Festival of Unleavened Bread, the day the lambs for the Passover meal were killed, Jesus' disciples asked him, "Where do you want us to go and get the Passover meal ready for you?" Then Jesus sent two of them with these instructions: "Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him to the house he enters, and say to the owner of the house: 'The teacher says where is the room where my disciples and I will eat the Passover meal?' Then he will show you a large upstairs room, fixed up and furnished, where you will get everything ready for us." (Mark 14, 1-15)

Reflection

Speak with the children about the Jewish Passover and what is celebrated there. How is that meal similar to our Mass? Have they heard sometimes "Lamb of God"? Who is being talked about? Tell the children the story of the Exodus 12, 1-8, 11-14. How is Jesus the "Lamb of God" for us? Why? Jesus' generosity in giving his own Body and Blood challenges us to give of ourselves to others. The Eucharist invites us to commit to serve others, to share and to give our own lives, like Jesus. How can you offer your service to others? How do you react when Jesus wants to wash your feet? Are you embarrassed? Share.

Activity

Dramatize the Last Supper. Dress 12 children as the Apostles and prepare the supper as Jesus did with his disciples. In our web page you can find more information in the file for Lent. You can use these readings: Exodus 12, 1-8, 11-14; washing of the feet John 13, 1-15; and the Last Supper 1 Corinthians 11, 23-26.

Prayer

Lord, by the Eucharist, the gift of yourself, by your body given to us and your blood poured out for us, you have remained with us forever. We give you thanks, Lord. And pray that your nourishment may always strengthen us so that we, too, will reach out to share with and serve one another. **Amen.**





Easter Sunday April 08, 2012

Readings: Acts 10:34a, 37-43; Psalm 117; Colossians 3, 1-4; John 20: 1-9

The Empty Tomb

Early on Sunday morning, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been taken away from the entrance. She went running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!" Then Peter and the other disciple went to the tomb. The two of them were running, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent over and saw the linen cloths, but he did not go in. Behind him came Simon Peter, and he went straight into the tomb. He saw the linen cloths lying there and the cloth which had been around Jesus' head. It was not lying with the linen cloths but was rolled up by itself. Then the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went in; he saw and believed. (They still did not understand the scripture which said that he must rise from death.) Then the disciples went back home. (John 20: 1-9)

Reflection


God raised Jesus because death can never have the last word. A woman, an outcast in that society, is the one who receives the announcement of the new life of Jesus. Mary Magdalene really loved Jesus, and that's why she went to see the tomb, although those who killed Jesus might still be looking to kill his friends. Imagine that you go to the cemetery to see the tomb of someone you knew and it is empty. What do you do? How do you feel? Afraid, concerned, happy? Would they like someone to come back to life? Share.


Activity

Prepare a basket with Easter eggs that are a symbol of life and decorate them as a group. Choose a group of persons that no one remembers and bring them the basket. Prepare cards with messages of the bible that show us the love and presence of God in our lives. Place this card in the baskets you prepare for the persons to be visited.


Prayer




Jesus' teaching about prayer and love for even the least of God's children caused many to follow Him. He was honored by the people but He knew some would not accept Him.





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


Commemoration of the Institution of the Holy Eucharist













Adoration of the Holy Cross









St Gemma Galgani APRIL

St Gemma Galgani was born at Camigliano near Lucca, Italy, on March 12, 1878. At twenty years of age, St. Gemma was attacked by tuberculosis to be hopelessly incurable. After countless novenas to St. Gabriel, she was completely cured on the fist Friday of March, 1899. At this time, apparently free from her recent illness, the Saint sought to fulfill her lifelong wish of pursuing her religious vocation with the Passionist nuns, but her application, as previously, was rejected.

From 1899 on, this quiet and unexcitable girl who was endowed with a remarkably fervent religious experiences –all of which were carefully investigated by her confessor and spiritual director Father Germano. The marks of Christ's crucifixion (Stigmata) appeared intermittently for over eighteen months on her hands and feet, and she had ecstasies and visions.


In 1902, she was again stricken with an illness that was thought to be tuberculosis and she fell asleep in the Lord in 1905. The fame of her sanctity spread rapidly all over the world. She was beatified by Pius XI on March 14, 1933, and canonized by Pius XII on Ascension Day, 1940.

St. Gemma's mother died when she was very young. Once, during one of Gemma's long illnesses Jesus told her, "My daughter, I give myself all to you, and you must belong entirely to me. I am your father, and my mother will be your mother."

St. Gemma often though of the pains of Jesus on the cross. On Holy Thursday and Good Friday she felt sufferings like those of Jesus.


Saint Catherine of Siena

My Prayer


Saint Catherine, you were brave when you cared for people no one else would care for and when you spoke for what you believed was right. Help me to be brave. Amen.

Second Sunday of Easter April 15, 2012

Readings: Acts 4:32-35; Psalm 117; 1 John 5, 1-69; John 20, 19-31

Jesus Appears to His Disciples

It was late that Sunday evening, and the disciples were gathered together behind locked doors because they were afraid of the Jewish authorities. Then Jesus came and stood among them. "Peace be with you," he said. After saying this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy at seeing the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so I send you." Then he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive people's sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven." One of the twelve disciples, Thomas (called the twin), was not with them when Jesus came, so the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!" Thomas said to them, "Unless I see the scars of the nails in his hands and put my finger on those scars and my hand in his side, I will not believe." A week later the disciples were together again indoors, and Thomas was with then. The doors were locked, but Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and look at my hands; then reach out your hand and put it in my side. Stop your doubting, and believe!" Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Do you believe because you see me? How happy are those who believe without seeing me!" In his disciples' presence Jesus performed many other miracles which are not written down in this book. But these have been written in order that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through your faith in him you may have life. (John 20, 19-31)

Reflection

Peace is the best gift of Jesus's presence among his disciples. Share with the children about the things they find very hard to believe. Talk also about movies or television stories they believe easily. See if they can distinguish between fiction and reality and the difference with what Jesus says. In today's gospel Thomas believes when he sees the wounds of Jesus. Jesus is hurt in many of our brothers and sisters in our world. Do we see his wounds? Thomas believes only when he sees. Do you believe what adults tell you about God and what you learn in the group?

Activity

Dramatize Thomas story. How do others react when Thomas refuses to believe? Are they angry? What do they say? What do they say later when Thomas sees Jesus?

Prayer

Lord, we are worried and afraid about so many things. Be present among us with your peace. Give us the faith that finds you in the suffering of others. Unite us in community so that we will share everything we have and so there won't be any needy among us. Amen.





Third Sunday of Easter April 22, 2012

Readings: Acts 3, 13-15. 17-19; Psalm 4; 1 John 2, 1-5; Luke 24, 35-48

The two then explained to them what had happened on the road, and how they had recognized the Lord when he broke the bread. While the two were telling them this, suddenly the Lord himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were terrified, thinking that they were seeing a ghost. But he said to them, "Why are you alarmed? Why are these doubts coming up in your minds? Look at my hands and my feet, and see that it is I myself. Feel me, you will know, for a ghost doesn't have flesh and bones, as you can see I have." He said this and showed them his hands and his feet. They still could not believe. They were so full of joy and wonder; so he asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of cooked fish, which he took and ate in their presence. Then he said to them, "These are the very things I told you about while I was still with you: everything written about me in the Law of Moses, the writings of the prophets, and the Psalms had to come true." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, and said to them, "This is what is written: The Messiah must suffer and must rise from death three days later, and in his name the message about repentance and the forgiveness of sins must be preached to all nations, beginning in Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things." (Luke 24, 35-48)

Reflection

If you were there, how do you feel when you touch Jesus's hands and feet? Do you think Jesus was truly hungry when he asked for something to eat? How do you feel? What do you want to ask Jesus? Jesus is very kind to his friends and tries to calm down their fears. Do you help a younger brother or sister feel less afraid of something? Jesus brings us peace. Do you try to help people reconcile, who are mad at each other? Once we have experienced the Resurrection of Jesus, we are sent to give witness to our faith through our changed lives.

Activity


Ask the children to draw and cut fish and write on them what type of food (their commitment) they are going to offer to the risen Jesus. Place the fish on a basket and pray to Jesus so that they will accomplish what they promise.

Prayer



Whenever you do to visit Jesus:

Enter slowly, with respect, knee down, and make the sign of the croos with reverence.

Greet Jesus in the Tabernacle! Make an act of faith and of love. This means: that you believe that He is present there and that you love Him all your heart.

Praise Him, because He is God and deserves all your praise. Tell Him: May the Most Holy Sacrament be praised!

Give Him Thanks. Jesus likes when you thank Him. Thank Him for all you have: for your mother and father, for your brothers and sisters, for your friends and teachers. Thank Him for the gift of life.

As Him, whatever you want. Tell Him everything; and Jesus, who is very happy with your visit, will hear you and will give you everything that is good for you.

He is always your friend, even though you may not visit Him in Church or talk to Him, He will always love you!





Fourth Sunday of Easter April 29, 2012

Readings: Acts 4, 8-12; Psalm 117; 1; John 3, 1-2; John 10:11-18

Jesus the Good Shepherd

I am the good shepherd, who is willing to die for the sheep. When the hired man, who is not a shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees a wolf coming, he leaves the sheep and runs away; so the wolf snatches the sheep and scatters them. The hired man runs away because he is only a hired man and does not care about the sheep. I am the good shepherd. As the Father knows me and I know the Father, in the same way I know my sheep and they know me. And I am willing to die for them. There are other sheep which belong to me that are not in this sheep pen. I must bring them, too; they will listen to my voice, and they will become one flock with one shepherd. "The Father loves me because I am willing to give up my life, in order that I may receive it back again. No one takes my life away from me. I give it up of my own free will. I have the right to give it up, and I have the right to take it back. This is what my Father has commanded me to do." (John 10: 11-18)

Reflection

Jesus says that he knows us by name. How do you listen in order to recognize when Jesus wants to tell you something? Who are your good shepherds? Do you have bad shepherds in your community? How can they harm you? Jesus gives up his life for the people he loves. Are you willing to sacrifice something for the people you love? Let us share.

Activity

Bring to the meeting place a big poster with a picture of a Good Shepherd. Cut and bring some sheep so that the children can decorate them and write their name. Encourage them to make their weekly commitment and write it on the back. As you get together to pray each child brings his sheep and places it on the board and says: "Thank you Jesus, for always protecting me and been important to you."

Prayer

You know us by name, Lord. You know what we are and what we can do. We thank you, Lord, because you love us, without condition. Give us good ears to listen to your voice, to know when you call us. Give us readiness to go out to meet you. **Amen.**
