### Jesus is Presented in the Temple

The time came for Joseph and Mary to perform the ceremony of purification, as the Law of Moses commanded. So they look the child to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, as it is written in the law of the Lord: "Every first-born male is to be dedicated to the Lord." They also went to offer a sacrifice of a pair of doves or two young pigeons, as required by the law of the Lord. At that time there was a man named Simeon living in Jerusalem. He was a good, God-fearing man and was waiting for Israel to be saved. The Holy Spirit was with him and had assured him that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's promised Messiah. Led by the Spirit, Simeon went into the Temple. When the parents brought the child Jesus into the temple to do for him what the Law required, Simeon took the child in his arms and gave thanks to God: "Now, Lord, you have kept your promise, and you may let your servant go in peace. With my own eyes I have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples: A light to reveal your will to the Gentiles and bring glory to your people Israel."

(Luke 2, 22-40)

### Reflection

Imagine the scene. How do Hannah and Simeon feel? How does Mary feel? Jesus was a child like you. He came to bring light His light is stronger than the darkness of our lies and all those things people are ashamed of.

Do you see any darkness around you? How could you bring light to others? is it hard for you to tell the truth sometimes?

### Activity and Prayer

With the children, make a list of things they can do to bring light to the world. Give a candle to each child. Present each child to God. As they express their desire to become light for the world, they light a candle. Then all together said the following prayer:






### **Friends of Jesus and Mary** 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 05, 2012

**Readings:** Job 7: 1-4, 67; Psalm 146, 1-2.3-4; 1Corinthians 9, 16-19, 22-23; Mark 1: 29-39



On leaving the synagogue Jesus entered the house of Simeon and Andrew with James and John. Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and Help her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them.



Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed. Simon and those who were with him pursued him and on finding him said, "Everyone is looking for you." He told them, Let us go on the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come. "So he went into their synagogues, preaching and driving out demons throughout the whole of Galilee.



When it was evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by demons. The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many, who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons, not permitting then to speak because they knew him.

### Reflection

Talk with the children about the times when they felt sick. What helped them get better? Is there a sick person in their family right now? What do others members of the family do? How do they feel concerned, sad, trusting in God? Do they know people who are always serving others? Do they pray to God each day to present the needs of people around them?

### Prayer

Lord, you came to earth and fully understand all our pains. Help us to serve one another and to seek the necessary means for the healing of the spiritual illnesses of our family. Give us strength to endure physical illness if it comes. **Amen** 

6° Sunday in Ordinary Time February 12, 2012

Readings: Leviticus 13: 1-2, 44-46; Psalm 32: 1-2, 5, 11; 1 Corinthians 10: 31-11:1; Mark 1: 40-45

A leper came to Jesus and kneeling down begged him and said, "If you wish, you can make clean." Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him, "I do will it. Be made clean." The leprosy left him immediately, and he was made clean. Then, warning him sternly, he dismissed him at once.

He said to him, "See that you tell no one anything, but go, show yourself to the priest and offer for your cleansing what Moses prescribed; that will be proof for them. "The man went away and began to publicize the whole matter. He spread the report abroad so that it was impossible for Jesus to enter a town openly. He remained outside in deserted places, and people kept coming to him from everywhere.

### Reflection

Jesus is near even to those that seem rejected by everyone else. Is there anyone in your school or neighborhood that seems to be rejected or feared? Do you reject anyone? The leper went to tell everyone what had happened, because he was grateful. When someone does something for you, do you show gratefulness?

### Activity

Act the gospel as it happened in the time of Jesus. Then relate the story to modern times. Who is rejected or left out? How do we invite those people to come into the circle?


### Prayer

Lord, in your great compassion, you don't rejected anyone. Teach us to see a beloved child of God in each person, so that we don't reject, judge, or separate anyone from the community. Give us the joy of your salvation so that we will announce it others.

### 7° Sunday in Ordinary Time – February 19, 2012

Readings: Isaiah 43, 18-19; 21-22; Psalm 40; 2-3 2 Corinthians 1:18-22 Marcos 2: 1-12

When Jesus returned to Capernaum after some days, it became known that he was at home. Many gathered together so that there was no longer room for them, not even around the door, and he preached the word to them. They came bringing to him a paralytic carried by four men.

Unable to get near Jesus because of the crowd, they opened up the roof above him. After they had broken through, they let down the mat on which the paralytic was lying. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, "Child, your sins are forgiven."

Some of the scribes were sitting there asking themselves, "Why does this man speak that way? He is blaspheming. Who but God alone can forgive sins?" Jesus immediately knew in his mind what they were thinking to themselves, so he said. "Why are you thinking such things in your hearts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, your sins are forgiven, or to say, rise, pick up your mat and walk? But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority to forgive sins on earth" He said to the paralytic, "I say to you, rise, pick up your mat, and go home. "He rose, picked up his mat at once and went away in the sight of everyone. They were all astounded and glorified God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this." (Mark 2: 1-12)

### Reflection

What is most surprising to you in this story? if you were the paralyzed man would you be a little disappointed at first because you still can't walk? If you are one in the crowd, what do you expect the man to do next? The man's friends made great efforts to help him come to Jesus. How do you help others? Jesus says he forgives.


Do you also forgive those who have hurt you?

### Activity

Cut out, in cardboard, figures of boys and girls. Two for each one. Ask them to write in one the name of the person they are helping this week, and in the other one the name of someone that has hurt them. And they are going to forgive. Take them home as a remainder of this week's commitment.

### Prayer



### The Son of God


Jesus is God's Son. He is with us always, he loves us very much. Jesus shows us how much God the Father love us.

### Friends of Jesus and Mary Ash Wednesday – February 22, 2012

Readings: Joel 2: 12-18; Psalm 51: 3-4, 5-6 2 Corinthians 5: 20-6:2; Matthew 6, 1-6, 16-18

Jesus said to his disciples: "Take care not to perform righteous deeds in order that people may see them; otherwise, you will have no recompense from your heavenly Father. When you give alms, do not blow a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets to win the praise of others. Amen I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms. Do not let your left hand know what your right is doing, so that your almsgiving may be secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you. "When you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, who love to stand and pray in the synagogues and on street corners so that others may see them.

Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you. (Matthew 6: 1-6, 16-18)

### Reflection

Remembering the forty days that Jesus pass in the desert preparing for His public life, we prepare ourselves to live the big celebration of Easter with prayer and penance. We need to have a complete change of heart dying to sin and preparing ourselves to live a resurrected life with Christ.

### Activity

Give each child a cross as a symbol of his commitment during Lent. They can decorate it and write on them their commitment. Ask them to bring the cross to the group and offer them in the altar, during prayer.

### Prayer

Lord, you remind us that you are our real home and life. Help us Lord, in our way to you, to live as real sons and daughters. Help us to be loving and take away what the things that hurt you.

### Ash Wednesday


### February 22

#### Jesus says no

The spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, temped by Satan. He was among wild beast, and the angels ministered to him. After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe the gospel." (Mark 1:12-15)

### Reflection

Jesus prepares for his mission by praying: He resists the temptation to look for something easier and goes out to preach inviting all to a new life. Do you sometimes feel tempted not to do what adults ask of you? Do you ask God to be with you when you are about to do something important? Of all the things you do daily. What do you need to change? Jesus spends 40 days in the dessert without eating. We Christians have a period of 40 days of Lent, to reflect on our lives and commitments. What do you plan to offer for Lent?

### Activity

Have the children write down what they would like to offer for Lent. Place the papers in a basket. Bring it to the altar. Every week pray asking God for strength to accomplish their commitments. You can start to pray this day the "Stations of the Cross"

### Prayer

Sometimes we find it easier to seek comfort for ourselves than to do good for others, because that demands sacrifice. Give us strength to overcome our temptations and help us to continue to follow you, serving others. **Amen** 




# We celebrate lent: Following Jesus

- 4. Play nicely with others


When you do something during Lent to show your love to God, color one of the blocks. It will help you remember your Baptism.




