Readings: Revelation 7:2-4, 9-14; Psalm 23; 1John 3:1-3; Mathew 5:1-12a **The Sermon on the Mount**

Jesus saw the crowds and went up a hill, where he sat down. His disciples gathered around him, and he began to teach them:

"Happy are those who know they are spiritually poor; the kingdom of heaven belongs to them! "Happy are those who mourn; God will comfort them!

"Happy are those who are humble; they will receive what God has promised!

"Happy are those whose greatest desire is to do what God requires; God will satisfy them fully!

"Happy are those who are merciful to others; God will be merciful to them!

"Happy are the pure in heart; they will see God!

"Happy are those who work for peace; God will call them his children!

"Happy are those who are persecuted because they do what God requires;

the Kingdom of heaven belongs to them!

"Happy are you when people insult you and persecute you and tell all kinds of evil lies against you because you are my followers.

Be happy and glad, for a great reward is kept for you in heaven. This is how the prophets who lived before you were persecuted. (Mathew 5:1-12a)

Reflection

The saints we celebrate are not just those on our altars, but all those people, past and present, who are generous, peace makers, just and prayerful.

Do they know people who seem holy to them? Who is their favorite saint? Talk with them about the saints. Do they know anyone who does some of the things that Jesus says we need to do to be happy?

How do you feel when you are kind, generous, or a peacemaker? Do they possess any of the

qualities that Jesus lists? Give opportunity to



Readings: Deuteronomy 6:2-9; Hebrews 7:23-21; Mark 12:28b-34

The Great Commandment

A teacher of the law was there who heard the discussion. He saw that Jesus had given the Sadducees a good answer, so he came to him with a question: "Which commandment is the most important of all?"

Jesus replied, "The most important one is this: Listen Israel! The Lord our God is the only Lord. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, withal soul, with all mind, with all your strength. The most important commandment is this: "Love your neighbor as you love yourself." There is no other commandment more important than these two." (Mark 12:28b-34)

Reflection


Talk with the children about laws, rules, and Commandments. What are they for? Are they imposed because someone wants to make our lives difficult? For instance, what are traffic laws for? Review the Ten Commandments with the children, emphasizing how all of them are related to the first two.

Activities

Ask the children to draw their heart on a piece of paper. Then ask them to write on their hearts what they can do to show love, such as to help or visit someone or to tell the truth. Bring a big poster-board heart to class, to represent God's heart and ask the children to stick their paper hearts on this larger one.

Prayer

Ask the children to pray for the needs of the people they love. All answer: "Teach us to love you as you love us, **Jesus**











Readings: 1Kings 17:10-16; Psalm; 145 Hebrews 9: 24-28; Mark 12: 38-44

Jesus warns against the teachers of the law / The offering of poor the widow

A large crowd was listening to Jesus gladly. As he taught them, he said, Watch out for the teachers of the law, who like to walk around in their long robes and be greeted with respect in the marketplace, who choose the reserved seats in the synagogues and the best places at feasts. They take advantage of widows and rob them of their homes, and then make a show of saying long prayers. Their punishment will be all the worse!"

As Jesus sat near the temple treasury, he watched the people as they dropped in their money. Many rich men dropped in a lot of money; then a poor widow came along and dropped in two little copper coins, worth about a penny.

He called his disciples together and said to them, "I tell you that this poor widow put more in the offering box than all the others. For the others put in what they had to spare of their riches; but she, poor as she is, put in all she had she gave all she had to live on." (Mark 12:38-44)

Reflection

What do their families, schools, and the society around them teach them about generosity? Do they generously give of their material possessions, talents and time?

Jesus says that the poor woman has given more than others because the others gave what they did not need.

What do you have that you could share with others? Is it difficult for you to give what you have? Do you give from what is not necessary needed, or do you sometimes give something important to you?


Have they ever seen a member of the community or a friend give up something that was very valuable to them? **Share.**

Activity

Give out flash cards. Ask them to write Something they can give. Example: share a lunch, give your favorite toy or clothe. Place a basket on the altar and ask them to place in the cards. Then they do a prayer asking Jesus to teach us to be generous.

Prayer

Lord, because of your great generosity we have received life, and all we are and have open the doors to our hearts to make us generous in the service of others. **Amen**

Readings: Daniel 12: 1-3; Psalm 15; Hebrews 10:11-14; Mark 13, 24-32

The Coming of the Son of Man

"In the days after that time of trouble the sun will grow dark, the moon will no longer shine, the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers in space will be driven from their courses. Then the Son of Man will appear, coming in the clouds with great power and glory. He will send the angels out to the four corners of the earth to gather God's chosen people from one end of the world to the other.

"Let the fig tree teach you a lesson. When its branches become green and tender and it starts putting out leaves, you know that summer is near. In the same way, when you see these things happening, you will know that the time is near, ready to begin. Remember that all these things will happen before the people now living have all died. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away. "No one knows, however, when that day or hour will come, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son; only the Father knows. (Mark 13, 24-32)

Reflection

The end of the world will mean the final victory of Jesus. We don't know when it will come, but we have to trust in Jesus. Talk with the children about what they know about astrologers or psychics and their predictions.

Compare those visions with Jesus words that promise victory. How do they prepare for a trip? What do them enjoy about traveling? Explain how sometimes our life is like a journey: if we prepared we will be able to enjoy it, despite some of the difficulties.

How can we prepare for the journey of life? **Share.**

Activity

Give to each child a blank piece of paper. Tell them to make a list of the things they will need to take for a trip. (bag, clothes, food) Then ask them to write the things they will need in the journey to God. What actions and attitudes do we need to take? **Share.**


Prayer



The Presentation of the Virgin Mary in the Temple



Joachim and Anne knew that Mary was a special gift from God. Soon after she was born they went to the temple and dedicated their child to God.

When she was very young Mary went to temple school. Here she learned more about God and listened to the Bible stories of God's promise and plan

Readings: Daniel 7: 13-14; Psalm 92; Revelation 1:5-8; John 18:33b-37

Pilate went back into the palace and called Jesus, "Are you the king of the Jews?" he asked him. Jesus answered, "Does this question come from you or have others told you about me?" Pilate replied, "Do you think I am a Jew? It was your own people and the chief priests who handed you over to me. What have you done?" Jesus said, "My kingdom does not belong to this world; if my kingdom belonged to this world, my followers would fight to keep me from being handed over to the Jewish authorities.

No, my kingdom does not belong here!" So Pilate asked him, "Are you a king, then?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. I was born and came into the world for this one purpose, to speak about the truth. Whoever belongs to the truth listens to me," (John 18:33b-37)

Reflection

Christ loves us. Jesus freed us from our sins and built a new kingdom for us.

The reign of God is not one of power, dominion or violence, but of truth, justice and love.

How does the role of kings, queens and other rules, compare and contrast with that of Jesus.

Which kingdom do you think is better? Why?

Activity


Pick one child to represent Jesus. Prepare some Flash cards with good actions and others with bad actions. (example: help a classmate, visiting someone, fighting, lying, visiting the sick and many more.) Each child presents the action to Jesus. The child in the role of Jesus should decide whether with his or her deed, can come into God's kingdom. Those who have bad actions may change them to an action that would allow them to enter God's kingdom. When they are accepted they said: Jesus you are our king.

Prayer



Amen



















He died of typhus on November 29,1735.

Conversion Trivia






Begin with four teams, it doesn't matter how many people are on each team.

Each team begins with a black heart and has to turn it back to white.

Start at the black square that is in the center of the board. You get a white heart if you overcome the four vices, which are the tv, cell phone, bad friends, and vanity.

Before beginning the game, place the little white squares with colored dots on top of the black triangles that are on the board.

Then the game begins. To return to a white heart, the players have to reach the vices by throwing the dice, and do what they say. If they complete it, they earn a white square with the color of their team, which they place in their spot at the center black square. If they didn't complete it, in their next turn they have to move on to another vice, returning to this one at another time.



In each one of the other spots, the team has to answer a question, depending on which spot they've landed.




