





#### Jesus Teaches about Divorce

Some Pharisees came to him and tried to trap him. «Tell us", they asked, "does our law allow a man to divorce his wife?" Jesus answer with a question, "What law did Moses give you?" 'Their answer was, "Moses gave permission for a man to write a divorce notice and send his wife away. "Jesus said to them, "Moses wrote this law for you because you are so hard to teach. ! But in the beginning, at the time of creation, 'God made them male and female,' as the scripture says. 'And for this reason a man will leave his father and mother and unite with his wife and the two will become one.' So they are no longer two, but one: No human being must separate, then, what God has joined together. "When they went back into the house, the disciples asked Jesus about this matter. He said to them, "A man who divorces his wife and marries another woman commits adultery against his wife. In the same way, a woman who divorces her husband and marries another man commits adultery. "Some people brought children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them, but the disciples scolded the people. When Jesus noticed this, he was angry and said to his disciples, "Let the children come to me, and do not stop them, because the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I assure you that whoever does not receive the Kingdom of God like a child will never enter it. Then he took the children in his arms, placed his hands on each of them, and blessed them (Mark 10:2-16)


#### Reflection

#### The Rich Man

As Jesus was starting on his way again, a man ran up, knelt before him, and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to receive eternal life?" "Why do you call me good? "Jesus asked him. "No one is good except God alone. You know the commandments: 'Do not commit murder, do not commit adultery; do not steal; do not accuse anyone falsely; do not cheat; respect your father and your mother.' "Teacher," the man said, "ever since I was young, I have obeyed all these commandments."

Jesus looked straight at him with love and said, "You need only one thing. Go and sell all you have and give the money to the poor and you will have riches in heaven; then come and follow me." When the man heard this, gloom spread over his face, and he went away sad, because he was very rich. Jesus looked around at his disciples and said to them, "How hard it will be for rich people to enter the Kingdom of God!" The disciples were shocked at these words, but Jesus went on to say, "My children, how hard it is to enter the Kingdom of God!" It is much harder for a rich person to enter the Kingdom of God than for a camel to go through the eye of a needle." At this the disciples were completely amazed and asked one another, "Who, then, can be saved?" Jesus looked straight at them and answered, "This is impossible for human beings but not for God; everything is possible for God." then Peter spoke up, "look we have left everything and followed you." "Yes," Jesus said to them, "and I tell you that those who leave home or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children for me and for the gospel will receive much more in this present age. They will receive a hundred times more houses, brother, sisters, mothers and fields and persecutions as well; and in the age to come they will receive eternal life (Mark 10,17-30)

#### Reflection

The young men is honest and good, but locus calls him to a greater genera

but Jesus calls him to a greater generosity. Do you think asking for so much is unrealistic on Jesus 'part? Imagine you are the young man What does Jesus tell you? What's hard for you to share?


Speak to Jesus and tell him about the things you have that you really don't like to share. Ask him to help you to be generous. Tell him what you will like to do this week.


#### Activity

Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Jesus: "Teacher," they said, "There is something we want you to do for us." "What is it?" Jesus asked them. They answered, "When you sit on your throne in your glorious Kingdom, we want you to let us sit with you, one at your right and one at your left." Jesus said to them, "You don't know what you are asking for. Can drink the cup of suffering that I must drink? Can you be baptized in the way I must be baptized?" "We can," they answered.

Jesus said to them "You will indeed drink the cup I must drink and be baptized in the way I must be baptized. But I do not have the right to choose who will sit at my right and my left. It is God who will give these places to those for whom he was prepared them." When the other then disciples heard about it, they became angry with James and John. So Jesus called them all together to him and said, "You know what those who are considered rulers of the heathen have power over them, and the leaders have complete authority. This, however, is not the way it is among you. If one of you wants to be first, you must be the slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served;

he came to serve and to give his life to redeem many people." (Mark 10, 35-45)

#### Reflection



Do you appreciate the many sacrifices they make so that you can have what you need? Which persons are more important for you? What is society, particularly television, teaching them about who is important and powerful? What examples of service do they see around them? #### Activity



#### Jesus Heals Blind Bartimaeus

They came to Jericho, and was leaving with his disciples and a large crown, a blind beggar named Bartimaeus son of Timaeus was sitting by the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout, "Jesus! Son of David! Have mercy on me!" Many of the people scolded him and told him to be quiet. But he shouted even more loudly, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" Jesus stopped and said, "Get up, he is calling you." So he threw off his cloak, jumped up, and come to Jesus. "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asked him. "Teacher" the blind man answered, "I want to see again." "Go, Jesus told him, "your faith has made you well." At once he was able to see and followed Jesus on the road. (Mark 10: 46-52)

#### Reflection

Bartimeus was able to see because he trusted in Jesus. Do you trust Jesus and talk to him when you have problems? Sometimes when we are in doubt about something or don't know what to do about a problem, We say we aren't seeing things clearly. Is there something you would like to see more clearly? Do you tell Jesus about your problems? Bartimeus decided to follow Jesus when he was healed. Sometimes Jesus asks us difficult things. Are you always willing to follow Jesus?


#### Activity

Do a trust walk. Blindfold some of the children and ask others to lead them around the room. Then have them change places. Talk about what they felt when they were being led.


Did they trust the person who was leading them?

## How to Pray the Rosary



#### Instructions

- 1. Paste this entire page onto a piece of thin cardboard.
- 2. Cut out the mysteries to make them like a deck of cards.
- 3. Shuffle them.
- 4. Place the cards face down on a table and try to see how many pairs you can make.
- 5. Pairs are made by matching the cards with the same letters or numbers. Each letter stands for a group of mysteries. When you find a match, you have a name the group that they belong to and to mysteries that they stands for "for example: if you pick SI and S3, you would have to say "Sorrowful mysteries". SI is the agony in the garden and the S3 is the Crowing with Thorns.) If you don't know the answer you have to lay the cards back down.
- 6. The one who makes the most matches wins.
