

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Teacher: Prepare a small brown lunch bag for each child by cutting off the top of the bag so that the remaining bag is only about 3 1/2 inches tall. (Cutting is done most easily while the bag is still folded.) Then help the children follow these directions: 1) Open the bag. 2) Carefully fold down a one-inch rim. 3) Carefully fold down a one-inch rim again. This is the basket. 4) Color the baby Moses. Cut him out along the heavy back lines. 5) Fold the piece in half along the long dotted line, keeping the baby facing out as you fold. 6) Then fold on the other dotter line, again keeping the baby out as you fold. 7) Put the baby Moses in the basket.

# Everyday we have an "appointment" with JESUS





XXII Sunday in Ordinary Time, September 2, 2012
Readings: Dt.4, 1-2.6-8 Psalm 14, James 117-18; Mark 7, 1-8.14-15

#### The Teachings of the Ancestors

Some Pharisees and teachers of the law who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus. They noticed that some of his disciples were eating their food with hands that were ritually unclean, that is, they had not washed them in the way the Pharisees said people should. For the Pharisees, as well as the rest of the Jews, follow the teachings they received from their ancestors: they do not eat unless they wash their hands in the proper way; nor do they eat anything that comes from the market unless they wash it first. And they follow many other rules which they have received, such as the proper way to wash cups, pots, copper bowls, and beds. So the Pharisees and the teachers of the law asked Jesus, "Why is it that your disciples do not follow the teachings handed down by our ancestors, but instead eat with ritually unclean hands?" Jesus answered them, "How right Isaiah was when he prophesied about you! You are hypocrites, just as he wrote: These people, says God, honor me with their words, but their heart is really far away from me. It is no use for them to worship me, because they teach human rules as though they were my laws! You put aside God's command and obey human teachings." Then Jesus called the crowd to him once more and said to them, "Listen to me, all of you, and understand. There is nothing that goes into you from the outside which can make you ritually unclean. Rather, it is what comes out of you that make you unclean." (Mark 7, 1-8.14-15)

#### Reflection

Talk with the children about the Importance and meaning of laws and regulations. For instance, what are the traffic lights for? Why we do we have rules in the classroom? Do they ever break rules? When they Play, do they make sure that rules are followed? What are the rules at home? How do we feel about them? What is more important: to appear to be good or to really be good?

#### Activity

Compose your own Commandments of Jesus for the class. Ask each child to add Another commandment, such as "Jesus wants us to smile or "Jesus wants us to help," and so on. Read the class commandments out loud and talk about how these rules come from the heart. Discuss how Jesus would like these commandments.

#### Prayer

Jesus, I want to follow you with all my heart. I wish to be a good example for all my friends. Help me please.

Amen.



XXIII Sunday in Ordinary Time September 09, 2012

Readings: Isaiah 35, 4-7; Psalm 145; James 2, 1-5; Mark 7, 31-37

#### Jesus Heals a Deaf-Mute


Jesus then left the neighborhood of Tyre and went on through Sidon to Lake Galilee, going by way of the territory of the Ten Towns; some people brought him a man who was deaf and could hardly speak, and they begged Jesus to place his hands on him. So Jesus took him off alone, away from the crowd, put his fingers in the man's ears, spat, and touched the man's tongue. Then Jesus looked up to heaven, gave a deep groan, and said to the man, "Ephphatha," which means, "Open up!" At once the man was able to hear, his speech impediment was removed, and he began to talk without any trouble. Then Jesus ordered the people not to speak of it to anyone; but the more he ordered them not to, the more they told it. And all who heard were completely amazed. "How well he does everything!" they exclaimed. "He even causes the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak!" (Mark 7, 31-37)


#### Reflection

The worst "deafness" we encounter is when someone doesn't want to hear what we have to say. What daily obstacles to communication do we encounter? Do they feel that their families and teachers listen to them? Are they too busy to listen to their concerns and joys? How well do they listen to their friends? Do you sometimes pretend not to hear? How do you feel if your parents or others in your family do not listen to you? Do you know someone who is deaf or hearing impaired? How do you communicate with that person?

#### Activity

Take several musical instruments to the group. Hide them from the children and ask them to guess what instrument you are playing. Next say certain things that they are likely to hear often, such as "pick up your room," "you're so smart," or "do your homework." Ask them which phrases they would like to hear more often. Share.

Jesus, we thank you for the gift of sound, music and beautiful words. We ask you to open our ears so that we may listen to one another and to the needs of our community. **Amen** 

#### Exaltation of the Holy Cross, September 14, 2012 Readings: Numbers 21, 4-9; Psalm 77, Philippians 2, 6-11; John 3, 13-17

#### Jesus heals us

And no one has ever gone up to heaven except the Son of Man, who came down from heaven. As Moses lifted up the bronze snake on a pole in the dessert, in the same way the son of man must be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in Him may have eternal life. For God loved the world so much that he gave His only son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not die but have eternal life. For God did not send his son into the world to be its judge, but to be its savior. (John 3, 13-17)

#### Reflection

The cross was a most cruel punishment reserved for the worst criminals who were not only executed, but also publicly humiliated. For people in those times, the cross was a symbol of shame. For us however, the cross is the sign of glory and salvation. Jesus' cross symbolizes healing and hopes for those who look for it. It is also an invitation to fight against our personal sins of selfishness and social sins of injustice and evil. What bad habits do you have? Do you ask Jesus for the help to break free of those bad habits?

#### Activity


Draw and cut crosses on cardboard paper. Each child writes in one side a need or illness that he wants Jesus to heal. Put them in a basket and place them on top of the altar of the prayer group, so that all the children can pray for the intentions.



#### Peter's Declaration about Jesus


Then Jesus and his disciples went away to the villages near Caesarea Philippi. On the way he asked them. "Tell me, who do people say I am?" Some say that you are John the Baptist," they answered; "others say that you are Elijah, while others say that you are one of the prophets." "What about you?" he asked them "who do you say I am?" Peter answered, "You are the Messiah." Then Jesus ordered them, "Do not tell anyone about me." Then Jesus began to teach his disciples: "The Son of Man must suffer much and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the teachers of the law. He will be put to death, but three days later he will rise to life." He made this very clear to them. So peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But Jesus turned around, looked at his disciples, and rebuked Peter. "Get away from me, Satan," he said. "Your thoughts don't come from God but from human nature!" Then Jesus called the crowd and his disciples to him. "If any of you want to come with me," he told them, "you must forget me." For if you want to save your own life, you will lose it; but if you lose your life for me and for the gospel, you will save it. (Mark 8, 27-35)

#### Reflection

Do you find Jesus' words difficult to understand? Jesus says that there are things that are more important than thinking of ourselves and our needs. What could you do to make others happy and know Jesus? Jesus tells us that if people say that they believe in him but then turn around and don't help others, they aren't true followers. How can you help others more often? Do you feel happy when you do something for others even if it has been difficult?

#### Activity

Prepare and bring to the group some cardboard crosses. Ask them to write in it something difficult that they would do this week to show Jesus they love him and want to follow him. Place a large poster board in front and ask them to place in it their cross. As they place the cross they say: "I want to follow you, Jesus."



#### Prayer

Lord, sometimes we reject your cross because we don't recognize it as ours. Help us to see the needs of others and teach us how to serve them. Help us to recognize you in the daily small crosses and problems we encounter. Help us to create lives of love, so that we may receive your joy. **Amen.** 



XXV Sunday in Ordinary Time September 23, 2012 Readings: Wisdom 2, 12. 17-20 Psalm 53 James 3, 16-4, 3 Mark 9, 30-37

#### Jesus Speaks Again about His Death


Jesus and his disciples left that place and went on through Galilee. Jesus did not want anyone to know where he was, because he was teaching his disciples: "The Son of Man will be handed over to those who will kill him; three days later, however, he will rise to life. But they did not understand what this teaching meant, and they were afraid to ask him. They came to Capernaum, and after going indoors Jesus asked his disciples, "What were you arguing about on the road?" But they would not answer him, because on the road they had been arguing among themselves about who was the greatest. Jesus sat down, called the twelve disciples, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must place himself last of all and be the servant of all." Then he took a child and had him stand in front on them. He put his arms around him and said to them, "Whoever welcomes in my name one of these children welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me, welcomes not only me but also the one who sent me." (Mark 9, 30-37)

#### Reflection

God calls each of us to be a bridge of love to his people. You can be a "Bridge" in many ways. What does it take to really love people?

#### Activity

In the next page you will find a "Bridge of love." In this activity you can understand how you need certain qualities to really love people. The one who loves is the one who serves. Share why these qualities are important.




#### Prayer

XXVI Sunday in Ordinary Time September 30, 2012 Readings: Numbers 11, 25-29 Psalm 18 James 5, 1-6, Mark 9, 38-43

John said to him, "Teacher, we saw a man who was driving out demons in your name, and we told him to stop, because he doesn't belong to our group." "Do not try to stop him," Jesus told them, "because no one who performs a miracle in my name will be able soon afterward to say evil things about me. For whoever is not against us is for us. I assure you that anyone who gives you a drink of water because you belong to me will certainly receive a reward. If anyone should cause one of these little ones to lose faith in me, it would be better for that person to have a large millstone tied around the neck and be thrown into the sea. So if your hand makes you lose your faith, cut it off! It is better for you to enter life without a hand than to keep both hands and go off to hell, to the fire that never goes out." (Mark 9, 38-43)

#### Reflection

There are people who might be doing well, even if they are not with us. Jesus tells us to appreciate them and work with them. What are their experiences of collaboration or working in teams? Do they have opportunities at school to participate in projects that help others? Do they like team work? What did they like about team effort? What did they dislike? Each of us has a great treasure to share. We can create beautiful things with our talents. Put your talents at the service of others.

#### Activity

Make a list of different types of community services. Prepare flash cards with different types of service to others. Example: Help at home play with your smaller brothers and sisters, listen to someone that needs your help, teach a classmate, help your teacher, and more. Make two teams. By turns each team pick up a card and dramatize the service that appears in it. The other teams try to guess. If it guesses, it gets one point. The one with the most points is the winner. Make sure to let them know that when you help and share, you serve Jesus.




#### Prayer


