
How can you bring the peace of Jesus to someone today?

where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy.









### **Prayer Service**

**Epiphany - January 6, 2013**Readings: Isaiah 60: 1-6; Psalm 72, 1-2.7-8.10-13; Ephesians 3, 2-3.5-6 Matthew 2, 1-12

Jesus was born in the town of Bethlehem in Judea, during the time when Herod was king. Soon afterward, some men who studied the stars came from the East to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the baby born to be the king of Jews? We saw his star when it came up in the East, and we have come to worship him." When King Herod heard about this, he was very upset, and so was everyone else in Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the teachers of the law and asked them. "Where will the Messiah be born?" In the town of Bethlehem in Judea," they answered. "For this is what the prophet wrote: Bethlehem in the land of Judah, you are by no means the least of the leading cities of Judah; for from you will come a leader who will guide my people Israel." So Herod called the visitors from the East to a secret meeting and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem with these instructions: "Go and make a careful search for the child; and when you find him, let me know, so that I too may go and worship him." And so they left, and on their way they saw the same star they had seen in the East. When they saw it, how happy they were, what joy was theirs! It went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. They went into the house, and when they saw the child with his mother Mary, they knelt down and worshipped him. They brought out their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, and presented them to him. Then they returned to their country by another road, since God had warned them in a dream not to go back to Herod. (Matthew 2, 1-12)

#### Reflection

Imagine the trip by camel through mountains, valleys and deserts. What dangers and difficulties might they have faced? Why would they continue walking in spite of everything? Would you do the same? The star guided the Magi to Jesus. Who guides you? Your parents, grandparents, teachers? How well do you listen and follow them?

#### Activity

#### Prayer




# FRIENDS AND ENEMIES EPIPHANY

#### The Baptism of Jesus

Peoples hopes began to rise, and they began to wonder whether John perhaps might be the Messiah. So John said to all of them, "I baptize you with water, but someone is coming who is much greater than I am. I am not good enough even to untie his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. After all the people had been baptized, Jesus also was baptized. While he was praying, heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit came down upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my own dear Son. I am pleased with you." (Luke 3, 15-16.21-22)

#### Reflection


Through our Baptism in Christ, we, too become beloved children of God, chosen to fulfill the mission God has for us. We should become God's hands and heart for others. # Baptism of the Lord

When Jesus reaches the age of thirty years, he went out of Nazareth to preach; but before he went to receive Baptism from John.

When He came to the Jordan River; He asks John to baptize him. John did not want to do it because he knew He was the Savior. Also He had no sins to be clean off. Jesus insisted saying:" Let it be so for now. For in this way we shall do all that God requires. So John agreed. As soon as Jesus was baptized, he came out of the water. Then heaven was opened to him, and saw the Spirit of God coming down like a dove and lighting on him. Then a voice said from heaven. "This is my own dear Son, with whom I am pleased." (Matthew 3,13-17) John had no doubt because in this way God had announce it to him in the desert. When Jesus leave John said to the people: I saw the Spirit came over Him, and I witness that He is the Son of God. Repent and sin no more, because the Savior has come.

Second Sunday Ordinary Time / January20, 2013 Readings: Isaiah 62, 1-5; Psalm 96, 1-3.7-10; 1Cor 12, 4-11; John 2, 1-11 The wedding in Cana

Two days later there was a wedding in the town of Cana in Galilee, and Jesus' mother was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine had given out, Jesus' mother said to him, "They are out of wine." "You must not tell me what to do," Jesus replied. "My time has not yet come." Jesus' mother then told the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." The Jews have rules about ritual washing, and for this purpose six stone water jars were there, each one large enough to hold between twenty and thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill these jars with water." They filled them to the brim, and then he told them, "Now draw some water out and take it to the man in charge of the feast." They took him the water, which now had turned into wine, and he tasted it. He did not know where this wine had come from (but, of course, the servants who had drawn out the water knew); so he called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone else serves the best wine first, and after the guests have drunk a lot, he serves the ordinary wine. But you have kept the best wine until now!" Jesus performed this first miracle in Cana in Galilee; there he revealed his glory, and his disciples believed in him. After this, Jesus and his mother, brothers, and disciples went to Capernaum and stayed there a few days. (John 2, 1-11)

#### Reflection

In the gospel of this week Mary tells us to do as Jesus tells us. When we listen to Jesus, we experience the miracle of bringing joy to others. Talk with the children about parties at home. Were there ever too many people and not enough food or drink? How did they solve the problem? What do they lack now? Do they know any family in need? What can they do to help? Are they ready to do what Jesus said, even if it didn't sound right? Are they ready to do whatever Jesus tells them? What do they think Jesus is asking them to do today? Share.

#### Prayer



#### Third Sunday Ordinary Time / January 27, 2013

Readings: Nehemiah 8, 2-6.8-10; Psalm 19, 8-10.15; 1Corinthians 12, 12-30; Luke 1, 1-4; 4, 14-21

Dear Theophilus: Many people have done their best to write a report of the things that have taken place among us. They wrote what we have been told by those who saw these things from the beginning and who proclaimed the message. And so, Your Excellency, because I have carefully studied all these matters from their beginning, I thought it would be good to write an orderly account for you. I do this so that you will know the full truth about everything which you have been taught.

Then Jesus returned to Galilee, and the power of the Holy Spirit was with him. The news about him spread throughout all that territory. He taught in the synagogues and was praised by everyone. Then Jesus went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath he went as usual to the synagogue. He stood up to read the Scriptures and was handed the book of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it is written, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has chosen me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free the oppressed and announce that the time has come when the Lord will save his people." Jesus rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. All the people in the synagogue had their eyes fixed on him, as he said to them, "This passage of scripture has come true today, as you heard it being read." (Luke 1, 1-4; 14-21)

#### Reflex ion

Imagine the temple full of religious people. What do you think they said when they heard Jesus, a young man, say all those things about the scriptures? Imagine you are poor and listening to Jesus. What would be good news for you to hear? Jesus said he came to carry out a great mission and he needs your help. What good news can you give to others? Jesus' mission to bring good news to the poor and to set the captives free is not an option but a mandate for us Christians.

#### Activity

Bring white paper to the group. Ask the children to write in them what they think Jesus' mission is for them. How is Jesus asking you to be good news? They made a scroll and bring it to the altar. Then they said: "Jesus you are good news."

#### Prayer

Lord, in times of sorrow, helps us to listen to one another with compassion. In times of estrangement, help us to build bridges. In times of disappointment, place on our lips the words that give encouragement and bring good news to others. Amen.
