Corpus Christi June 2, 2013

Readings: Genesis 14, 18-20; Psalm 109; 1Corinthians 11, 23-26; Luke 9, 11b-17

Jesus Feeds Five Thousand

When the crowds heard about it, they followed him. He welcomed them, spoke to them about the Kingdom of God, and healed those who needed it. When the sun was beginning to set, the twelve disciples came to him and said, "Send the people away so that they can go to the villages and farms around here and find food and lodging, because this is a lonely place." But Jesus said to them, "You yourselves give them something to eat." They answered, "All we have are five loaves and two fish. Do you want us to go and buy food for this whole crowd?" (There were about five thousand men there) Jesus said to his disciples, "Make the people sit down in groups of about fifty each." After the disciples had done so, Jesus took the five loaves and two fish, looked up to heaven, thanked God for them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to distribute to the people. They all ate and had enough, and the disciples took up twelve baskets of what was left over. (Luke 9, 11b-17)

#### Reflection


There are two central messages in the multiplication of loaves and fish: a) Jesus gives thanks for what is there, b) When everyone contributes and shares, goods are multiplied. Sometimes we think we don't have enough belongings and we complain. But Jesus teaches us to give thanks for what we do have and teach us to share it. Are you grateful for what you have? Do you share with others? Jesus gives himself in the Eucharist. At each Eucharist, the Lord himself is present and invites us to her table, where they can receive the nourishment of the word of life. Jesus shares the bread of His body and pours the wine of His blood to invite his friends to go out to the world and do the same with others. Share.

#### Activity

Prepare loaves of breads and fish cut out from white cardboard. Give them to the children so they can decorate them and ask them to write something they could do this week to share (time, talent, toys etc.) Ask them to offer it as their commitment for this week and in this way fulfill our mission as Christian that Jesus gives us this week. Invite a relative that does not go to mass to go with you.

#### Prayer

Jesus gives us a thankful heart for the many good things you have given us, our family, friends, food, clothes and all our talents. Teach us to share your love and all that you have given us with all. Thank you for staying with us in the Eucharist. **Amen.** 






# Eucharist

#### Look for the Miracles!


God's love works miracles.

X Sunday in Ordinary Time June 9, 2013

Readings: 1K17, 17-24; Psalm 29; Galatians 1, 11-19; Lk7, 11-17 Iesus Raises a Widow's Son

Soon afterward Jesus went to a town named Nain accompanied by his disciples and a large crowd. Just as he arrived at the gate of the town, a funeral procession was coming out. The dead man was the only son of a woman who was a widow, and a large crowd from the town was with her. When the Lord saw her, his heart was filled with pity for her, and he said to her, "Don't cry." Then he walked over and touched the coffin, and the men carrying it stopped. Jesus said, "Young man! Get up, I tell you!" The dead man sat up and began to talk, and Jesus gave him back to his mother. They all were filled with fear and praised God. "A great prophet has appeared among us!" they said; "God has come to save his people!" This news about Jesus went out through all the country and the surrounding territory. (Luke 7, 11-17)

#### Reflection

Luke is the apostle that talks the most about the relationship between Jesus and the woman. In this passage Jesus feels compassion for the widow from Nain and resurrects her son. Meditate about the feelings of the mother, the actions of Jesus and the reaction of the people that were with the widow. Jesus is merciful. He feels sorry for the widow's suffering and tries to fix it without limiting himself to just express his compassion. Let's learn to be with those who are suffering to lessen their burden and look for help if it is necessary.

#### Activity

Place the children in four groups. Each group will create a prayer with the word compassion. 1st Group: Make us merciful Lord. 2nd Group: Thanks for showing us compassion. 3rd Group: We ask your forgiveness for our lack of compassion. 4th Group: Be merciful to today's youth. After creating the prayers share them in a circle of prayer.

#### Prayer

Jesus, you showed us that to suffer for love has infinite value. When we suffer with serenity, patience, without rebelling and with courage the pain purifies us. Teach us to be with those who suffer, to lessen their burden and to look for the help they need. **Amen.** 





# Friends of Jesus and Mary XI Sunday in Ordinary Time June 16, 2013

Readings: 2 Samuel 12, 7-10.13; Psalm 31; Galatians 2, 16.19-21; Luke 7, 36-8, 3

A Pharisee invited Jesus to have dinner with him, and Jesus went to his house and sat down to eat. In that town was a woman who lived a sinful life. She heard that Jesus was eating in the Pharisee's house, so she brought an alabaster jar full of perfume and stood behind Jesus, by his feet, crying and wetting his feet with her tears. Then she dried his feet with her hair, kissed them, and poured the perfume on them. When the Pharisee saw this, he said to himself, "If this man really were a prophet, he would know who this woman is who is touching him; he would know what kind of sinful life she lives!" Jesus spoke up and said to him, "Simon, I have something to tell you." "Yes, Teacher, "he said, "tell me." "There were two men who owed money to a moneylender," Jesus began. "One owed him five hundred silver coins, and the other owed him fifty. Neither of them could pay him back, so he canceled the debts of both. Which one, then, will love him more?" "I suppose," answered Simon, "that it would be the one who was forgiven more." "You are right," said Jesus. Then he turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I came into your home, and you gave me no water for my feet, but she has washed my feet with her tears and dried them with her hair. You did not welcome me with a kiss, but she has not stopped kissing my feet since I came. You provided no olive oil for my head, but she has covered my feet with perfume. I tell you, then, the great love she has shown proves that her many sins have been forgiven. But whoever has been forgiven little shows only a little love." Then Jesus said to the woman, "Your sins are forgiven." The others sitting at the table began to say to themselves, "Who is this, who even forgives sins?" But Jesus said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace." Some time later Jesus traveled through towns and villages, preaching the Good News about the Kingdom of God. The twelve disciples went with him, and so did some women who had been healed of evil spirits and diseases: Mary (who was called Magdalene), from whom seven demons had been driven out; Joanna, whose husband Chuza was an officer in Herod's court; and Susanna, and many other women who used their own resources to help Jesus and his disciples. (Luke 7, 36-8, 3)

#### Reflection

In the readings of this week Jesus shows us His great mercy with sinners, in the first reading we can see David. In the Gospel it shows that when the women repent God forgives them. True sin in the absence of love. Repentance is the recognition of our faults. Forgiveness is nothing other than the experience of the fullness of love. Those who criticize the woman don't realize that when one has received much love the only reasonable reaction is to love in return. Jesus feels pity for their woman and, with love, leads her to the right path. How do you feel when someone forgives you for something you have done wrong? Jesus says that, when you have received much love, the normal thing is to respond with a lot of love. How do you respond when someone treats you with affection? Share.

#### Activity

Bring a blank sheet of paper, divide it in 3 columns and on top of one write "name," on the other "love, gratitude, forgiveness" and in the third "commitment." Ask the children to write the names of persons in their family and of friends. In the second column write what have they received and in the third what they would do for them this week. Share with the group.

#### Prayer

Lord we make mistakes every day and it is our fault. Sometimes we hurt one another through lack of sensitivity. Help us to recognize our faults in order to have access to a forgiveness which leads to a deeper and more grateful love for one another. **Amen.**



# John is called from before his birth

June 24: St John the Baptist ls 49:1-6; Hechos 13:22-26; Lucas 1:57-66,80

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about the people for whom they are important. Has their mom told them sometimes how she prepared for their birth? Why did they give them the name they carry? Why are names important? Speak about how John had a mission even before he was born. Do they have some mission, something they know they must do? What would they like to do when they grow up?

Activities and prayer. Dramatize the scene of John's presentation to the people, adding: "John, you will ..." Give our papers where the children can write missions (good things that each child can do). Ask the children to send their paper to another kid telling him what they can do (make others happy, behave in class, help at home ...) Carry the papers in a basket at the Offertory procession.

Readings: Zechariah 12, 10-11; Psalm 62; Galatians 3, 26-29; Luke 9, 18-24

#### Jesus Speak about His Suffering and Death

One day when Jesus was praying alone, the disciples came to him. "Who do the crowds say I am?" He asked them. "Some say that you are John the Baptist," they answered. "Others say that you are Elijah, while others say that one of the prophets of long ago has come back to life." "What about you?" he asked them. "Who do you say I am?" Peter answered, "You are God's Messiah." Then Jesus gave them strict orders not to tell this to anyone. He also told them, "The son of Man must suffer much and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the teachers of the law. He will be put to death, but three days later he will be raised to life." And he said to them all, "If you want to come with me, you must forget yourself, take up your cross every day, and follow me. For if you want to save your own life, you will lose it, but if you lose your life for my sake, you will save it." (Luke 9, 18-24)

#### Reflection

Jesus asks us to take up our daily cross that is the difficulties and bother of each day, and to follow him with all our hearts. Jesus says that serving others for love at Him is more important that keeping one's own things or saving one's own comfort. Do you make sacrifices for the sake of others? Do you think what Jesus asks is too difficult? Do you complain a lot about little things that bother you? If Jesus asks you who do you think He is, what do you tell Him? Share.

#### Activity

On the next page you will find a page with bible verses, where you can find the different names given to Jesus. Do it after you read the bible verses.

#### Prayer

Lord sometimes we go through life without appreciating the many things others do for us and without thanking you for your love and generosity. Make us grateful that we may follow you in service to others and to accept our daily lives. **Amen.**



## MARY QUEEN OF PEACE







XIII Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 30, 2013

Readings: 1Kings 19, 16b-19-21; Psalm 15; Galatians 4, 31b-5, 1.13-18; Luke 9, 51-62

As the time drew near when Jesus would be taken up to heaven, he made up his mind and set out on his way to Jerusalem. He sent messengers ahead of him, who went into a village in Samaria to get everything ready for him. But people there would not receive him, because it was clear that he was on his way to Jerusalem. When the disciples James and John saw this, they said, "Lord, do you want us to call fire down from heaven to destroy them?" Jesus turned and rebuked them. Then Jesus and his disciples went on to another village. As they went on their way, a man said to Jesus, "I will follow you wherever you go. "Jesus said to him, "Foxes have holes, and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lie down and rest." He said to another man, "Follow me." But that man said, "First let me go back and bury my father." Jesus answered, "Let the dead bury their own dead. You go and proclaim the Kingdom of God." Someone else said, "I will follow you, sir; but first let me go and say goodbye to my family." Jesus said to him, "Anyone who starts to plow and then keeps looking back is of no use for the Kingdom of God." (Luke 9, 51-62)

#### Reflection

Jesus asks his followers to be available, without any excuses or delay tactics. What excuses we often give not to do what we are asked? What are those excuses about? Jesus says we have to keep up our resolution to do the right thing. Do you often start things and then give up? Do you want like Jesus' friends to get even with the Samaritans who did not want to receive Jesus? Jesus did not want revenge. Do you sometimes feel like getting even? Do you think following Jesus is too difficult? Share.

#### Activity

On the following page there is an activity that can be used. Talk about the life of a saint and how they follow Jesus.

#### Prayer

Lord sometimes we don't see clearly what makes us true and draws us closer to you. Give us strength to persevere in your service and in the service of others. Give us generosity to follow you without delay. **Amen.**
