Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 05 2016 Readings: 1Kings 17,17-24; Psalm 29; Galatas 11-19; Luke 7,11-17

Jesus journeyed to a city called Nain, and his disciples and a large crowd accompanied him. As he drew near to the gate of the city, a man who had died was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. A large crowd from the city was with her. When the Lord saw her, he was moved with pity for her and said to her, "Do not weep." He stepped forward and touched the coffin; at this the bearers halted, and he said, "Young man, I tell you, arise!" The dead man sat up and began to speak, and Jesus gave him to his mother. Fear seized them all, and they glorified God, crying out "A great prophet has arisen in our midst, "and "God has visited his people. "This report about him spread through the whole of Judea and in all the surrounding region. (Luke 7, 11-17)

Reflection


Luke is the apostle that talks the most about relationship between Jesus and the woman. In this passage Jesus feels compassion for the widow from Nain and resurrects her son. Meditate about the feelings of the mother, the actions of Jesus and the reactions of the people that were with the widow. Jesus is merciful. He feels sorry for the widow's suffering and tries to fix it without limiting himself to just express his compassion. Let's learn to be with those who are suffering to lessen their burden and look for help if it is necessary.

Activity


Place the children in four groups. Each group will create a prayer with the word compassion. 1st Group: Make us merciful Lord. 2nd: Group Thanks for showing us compassion.3rd Group: We ask your forgiveness for our lack of compassion. 4th Group: Be merciful to today's youth. After creating the prayers share them in a circle of prayer.

Friends of Jesus and Mary XI Sunday in Ordinary Time June 12, 2016

Readings: 2 Samuel 12, 7-10.13; Psalm 31; Galatians 2, 16.19-21; Luke 7, 36-8, 3

A Pharisee invited Jesus to dine with him, and he entered the Pharisee's house and reclined at table. Now there was a sinful woman in the city who learned that he was at table in the house of the Pharisee. Bringing an alabaster flask of ointment, she stood behind him at his feet weeping and began to bathe his feet with her tears. Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them, and anointed them with the ointment. When the Pharisee who had invited him saw this he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would know who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him, that she is a sinner." Jesus said to him in reply, "Simon, I have something to say to you. "Tell me, teacher," he said." Two people were in debt to a certain creditor; one owed five hundred days' wages and the other owed fifty. Since they were unable to repay the debt, he forgave it for both. Which of them will love him more? "Simon said in reply, "The one, I suppose, whose larger debt was forgiven." He said to him, "You have judged rightly." Then he turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? When I entered your house, you did not give me water for my feet, but she has bathed them with her tears and wiped them with her hair. You did not give me a kiss, but she has not ceased kissing my feet since the time I entered. You did not anoint my head with oil, but she anointed my feet with ointment. So I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven because she has shown great love. But the one to whom little is forgiven, loves little." He said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." The others at table said to themselves," Who is this who even forgives sins? "But he said to the woman," Your faith has saved you; go in peace." Afterward he journeyed from one town and village to another.

Reflection

In the readings of this week Jesus shows us his great mercy with sinners, in the first reading we can see David. In the Gospel it shows that when the women repent God forgiveness them. True sin in the absence of love. Repentance is the recognition of our faults. Forgiveness is nothing other than the experience of the fullness of love. Those who criticize the woman don't realize that when one has received much love the only reasonable reaction is to love in return. Jesus feels pity for their woman and, with love, leads her to the right path, how do you feel when someone forgives you for something you had done wrong? Jesus says that, when you have received much love, the normal thing is to respond with a lot of love. How do you respond when someone treats you with affection? **Share**

Activity

Bring a blank sheet of paper, divided in 3 columns on tap of one write name, other love, gratitude, forgiveness and in the third commitment. Ask the children to write the names of person of their family and friends. In the same column write what have they receive and in the third what they would do for them this week. **Share with the group.**

Prayer

Lord we make mistakes every day and are our fault. Sometimes we hurt one another through lack of sensitivity. Help us to recognize our fault in order to have access to a forgiveness which leads to a deeper and more grateful love for one another. Amen.





THE MIRACLE OF RIMINI

Italy, 1227

A SAINT AND HERETICS

Saint Anthony of Padua used to go around visiting different towns in Italy to talk about God. When he got to Rimini, he ran into a group of "wise guys" who were trying to convince the people that Jesus wasn't really present in the Eucharist and that all this was just a story made up by priests. The heretics didn't accept the Saint's arguments and they debated with him.



THE DAY ARRIVES ...

After leaving his donkey without food for three days, Bonovillo took it to the town square which was filled with people waiting to see what would happen. Simultaneously, St. Anthony entered the square from the other side, carrying a monstrance with the Body of Christ.

That is when the miracle occurred. The donkey completely ignored the food Bonovillo offered it and, as if it had the use of reason, went straight over to St. Anthony. To everyone's surprise, it bowed its head, knelt down and remained motionless in front of the monstrance. The people began to cheer and applaud. The donkey was able to recognize its creator with greater ease than many men in that city. Bonovillo was faithful to his promise and accepted, along with the other heretics, the fact that Jesus is truly present with us in the Blessed Sacrament.

THE DONKEY OF BONOVILLO

Bonovillo tried to come off as the smartest of them all and proposed an idea to the saint: "If you want me to believe in this mystery, do the following: I have a donkey. I will leave it without food for three days, after which I will take the donkey to the town square and I will present it with feed and you'll present it with your sacrament. If the donkey ignores the feed and kneels down and adores this Bread of yours, then I'll adore it, too." St. Anthony accepted the

Jesus Speak about His Suffering and Death

Once when Jesus was praying by himself, and the disciples were with him, he asked them, "Who do the crowds say that I am? "They said in reply, "John the Baptist; others, Elijah; still others, 'One of the ancient prophets has arisen.' "Then he said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter said in reply, "The Christ of God. "He scolded them and directed them not to tell this to anyone.

He said, "The Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised."

Then he said to all, "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will save it."

Reflection

Jesus asks us to take up our daily cross that is, the difficulties and bother of each day, and to follow him with all our heart. Jesus says that serving others for love at Him is more important that keeping one's own things or saving one's own comfort. ¿Do you make sacrifices for the sake of others? ¿Do you think what Jesus asks is too difficult? Do you complain a lot about little things that bother you? ¿If Jesus asks you who do you think He is, What do you tell Him? Share



John is called from before his birth

June 24 St John the Baptist 6-021-6; Habox 13:22-26; Liste 1-77-66,80

Talk about the story. Talk with the children about the people for whom they are important. Has their mom told them sometimes how she prepared for their birth? Why did they give them the name they carry? Why are names important? Speak about how John had a mission even before he was born. Do they have some mission, something they know they must do? What would they like to do when they grow up?

Activities and prayer. Dramatize the scene of John's presentation to the people, adding: "John, you will ..." Give our papers where the children can write missions (good things that each child can do). Ask the children to send their paper to another kid telling him what they can do (make others happy, behave in class, help at home ...) Carry the papers in a basket at the Offertory procession.

Jesus, your friend, invites you:


- God chose John before he was born. Do you think God might also have chosen you to do his work?

Readings: 1Kings 19, 16b-19-21; Psalm 15; Galatians 4, 31b-5, 1.13-18; Luke 9, 51-62

When the days for Jesus' being taken up were fulfilled, he resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem, and he sent messengers ahead of him. On the way they entered a Samaritan village to prepare for his reception there, but they would not welcome him because the destination of his journey was Jerusalem. When the disciples James and John saw this they asked, "Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to consume them?" Jesus turned and rebuked them, and they journeyed to another village. As they were proceeding on their journey someone said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go." Jesus answered him, "Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head."

And to another he said, "Follow me." But he replied, "Lord, let me go first and bury my father." But he answered him, "Let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God." And another said, "I will follow you, Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home." To him Jesus said, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God." Luke 9, 51-62

Reflection

Jesus asks his followers to be available, Without any excuses or delay tactics. What excuses we often give not to do What we are asked? ¿ What are those Excuses about? Jesus says we have to keep up our resolution to do the right thing. Do you often start things and them give up? Do you want like Jesus friends to get even with the Samaritans who did not want to receive Jesus? Jesus did not want revenge. Do you sometimes feel like getting even. ¿Do you think following Jesus is too difficult? **Share.**
