Friends of Jesus and Mary 6th Sunday of Easter May 1, 2016

Readings: Acts 15:1-2, 22-29; Psalm 66 Revelation 21, 10-14, 22-23; John 14:23-29 Jesus said to his disciples: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; yet the word you hear is not mine but that of the Father who sent me.

"I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. You heard me tell you, 'I am going away and I will come back to you. 'If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father; for the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it happens, so that when it happens you may believe." (John 14:23-29)
Reflection

God is everywhere but seeks loving hearts where he can dwell. This is the real beauty and glory of a human city. Is God present in our family? The peace that God provides is not based on the absence of conflict and division. Jesus brings peace that is based on total trust in God, the forgiveness of others, a commitment to serve, and hope in a better future that will come from God. What difficulties, tensions, or violence affect the peace of mind of the children? How do they and their families experience and understand peace? How do you picture a family or people at peace to be? Are you at peace, for instance, when you tell lies to your parents, or when you think others have more than you do, or when you want to be superior to your siblings and classmates? What will Jesus mean when he says that leaves us a different kind of peace? Share

Activity

Bring papers divided in three columns. On them write peace, anxiety, fear. Ask them to write under each column what they feel and how they will bring this week the peace Jesus talks about to others. What will they do to correct the things they are doing wrong. Share what each one will do this week.

Prayer

Lord, be our peace when we refuse to hold grudge. When we sincerely forgive one another; when we are thankful for the good things you have given us; when, in the midst of difficulty, we help one another to trust in you. Amen

Ascension of the Lord May 5, 2016

Readings: Acts 1, 1-11 Psalm 46, Hebrews 9, 24-48; 10, 19-23 Luke 24, 45-53

Jesus said to his disciples: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And behold I am sending the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." Then he led them out as far as Bethany, raised his hands, and blessed them. As he blessed them he parted from them and was taken up to heaven. They did him homage and then returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and they were continually in the temple praising God. (Luke 24,45 -53)

Reflection

Jesus goes to heaven but he promises the Spirit which will help us and give us strength to be his witness, taking his messages to others.

Jesus sends his friends to do his work; that is to serve and help others, to communicate that God loves them, to share what we have, to respect everyone as the image of God, and to strive for justice. What can each one of us do? Share

In the following page you will find a script to act the Ascension of the Lord. It is based on Acts1,1-11. Bring customs for the children to wear.


Prayer





Narrator: Today we honor all mothers, but specially those whose lives we read about in the Bible. Hear them as they

speak for themselves.

Sarah: (enters carrying baby) I am Sarah, wife of Abraham, from whom all our people are descended. I was an old woman when my baby, promised by my Lord, was born. I was so overloyed that I named him Isaac, which means laughter. (Goes to back or other side of stage before next person enters)

Rebekah: (Enters carrying twin babies in her arms) I am Rebekah, wife of Sara's son. Isaac and mother of the twins Jacob and Esau. Although I love Jacob more. When he was a young man, I even helped trick his father into giving him a blessing meant for Esau, but I never saw him after that. (She goes to stand beside Sarah.

Raquel: (Enters carrying twin babies in her arms leading Joseph by the hand) My name is Raquel, and I was the beloved wife of Jacob. My first son, Joseph was the favorite of his father, who gave him a beautiful coat of many colors. My second son I named Ben-Oni, which means "son of my pain", but my husband rename him Benjamin, "son of the right hand" for he, too, was loved by his father. (She to stand beside Rebekah).

Naomi: (Enters followed by young woman) I am Naomi, I had two sons, but I am best remembered for my daughter in law, Ruth. It is through her loving devotion, after my sons died, that all mothers-in-law are remembered. (She and Ruth move back with the others).

Salomé: I am Salome, the mother of James and John. I stayed close to Jesus when he was in Galilee, and I followed him to Jerusalem. After Jesus died, I even walked to the tomb with spices to anoint him.

Elizabeth: (Entry followed by John) My name is Elizabeth, one of the first mothers mentioned in the New Testament. I am the mother of John, ;later known as the Baptist, Like Sarah, I was old when he was born, yet I was honored and happy to be the mother of the man who later baptized Jesus. (Both move back beside the others).

Mary: (Enters carrying baby). I am Mary, the mother of Jesus, whose birth was announced by an angel, whose death took place on the cross, and whose kingdom will never end. My soul glorifies the Lord. (Moves back by others).

Women

I am the Canaanite women who begged Jesus to cure my suffering child. Even though I had great faith in

Jesus, it took great courage to go to him because I was looked on as a "foreigner", someone different from others. My love for my child gave the strength not to worry about what people were saying about me.

(All characters come forward and stand together)

Narrator: Even after so many generations, we remember those mothers. They gave to the world children who later changed the world. May all mothers like these continue to teach their children how much God loves them.

Reflection

One of the greatest witness we as Christians can give is the unity, which is not thinking all the same, but seeking the common good, respecting diversity. Our unity and witness is based on Jesus Christ who gives us living waters and is our beginning and our end.

Jesus is the bread of life, the bread of unity. In the Eucharist we all share in the same bread, which is the body of the Lord and drink of the same cup, his blood. In doing so, we become one with Jesus and with one another as members of the Body of Christ, the church.

Explain the word martyr. Martyrs are those who, In spite of persecution, continue firm in their discipleship of Jesus, forgive those who persecute them and remain united to God and to everyone. Stephen was one of them. Do we have a strong faith like Stephen, that is not deviated from God's will by either treat or flattery? Have they ever been martyrs when they have done good even if they were criticized or laughed for it? Share


Activity

Bring a blank sheet of paper and ask the children to write in I it what have they done for the good of your family or community this week. Example: house work, forgive someone you have hurt, heard patiently someone that needs advice, help with homework to a classmate, etc.

Encourage them to make a commitment this week for the unity and wellbeing of the community. Share.

Prayer

Lord, sometimes we judge the people around us harshly and we are not able to acknowledge our sinfulness. But you forgive us regardless of what we have done. Give us understanding. Give us the strength to start on a new path with you. Amen

Martin was impressed by Paschal's gaze and looking downwards tears began to stream down his cheeks. And he said, "For love of God, I forgive them." After that, Martin was not the same person. His friends said that this had truly been a miracle. He was always happy, because he had learned how happy a person can be when he learns to forgive.

Reflection

The apostles were afraid, but when they receive The Holy Spirit everything was change. For The Holy Spirit there are no foreign languages. Everyone can understand the language of love. The apostles receive the special gift of the Holy Spirit. We receive them at Confirmation. Here Jesus is given them the power to forgive sins and in this way instituted the sacrament of Reconciliation.

Activity

Read Acts 2, 1-11 Seat the children in a circle. Darken the room. Explain them that we are going to pray like when Mary and the Apostles were gather together. Prepare tongues of fire drawn on construction paper. Behind each tongue write one of the Fruits of the Spirit. Place them on the head of each child. When the prayer is finish pray over each one for the gift they have receive. The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are: Wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and holy fear.

Prayer

Lord Jesus Christ, your peace is our greatest gift. Help us to treasure this gift and to know how to use all the gifts you have given us. **Amen**







Reflection




Prayer

Each child can give thanks for his family and also for being part of the family of God. All respond: Glory to the Father, to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit three times. **Amen**



Just like the eggshell




the egg white




And the

egg yolk



Readings: Genesis 14, 18-20; Psalm 109; 1Corinthians 11, 23-26; Luke 9, 11b-17

Jesus Feeds Five Thousand

Jesus spoke to the crowds about the kingdom of God, and he healed those who needed to be cured. As the day was drawing to a close, the Twelve approached him and said, "Dismiss the crowd so that they can go to the surrounding villages and farms and find lodging and provisions; for we are in a deserted place here."He said to them, "Give them some food yourselves." They replied, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have, unless we ourselves go and buy food for all these people. "Now the men there numbered about five thousand. Then he said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty. "They did so and made them all sit down. Then taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets. (Luke 9, 11b-17)

Reflection

There are two central messages in the multiplication of loaves and fish:


- a) Jesus gives thanks for what is there, even if it is little.
- b) When each contributes and shares, goods are multiplied. Sometimes we think we don't have enough belonging and we complain. But Jesus teaches us to give thanks for what we do have and teach us to shared it. Are you grateful for what you have? Do you share with others? Jesus gives himself in the Eucharist. At each Eucharist, the Lord himself is present and invites us to her table, where they can receive the nourishment of the word of life. Jesus shares the Bread of his body and pours the wine of His blood to invite his friends to go out to the world and do the same with others *Share*.

Activity

Prepare loaves of breads and fish cut out from white cardboard. Give them to the children so they can decorate them ask to write something they could do this week to share (time, talent, toys etc.) Ask them to offer it as their commitment for these week and in this way fulfills our mission as Christian that Jesus gives us this week. Invite a relative that do not go to mass to go with you.

Prayer

Jesus gives us a thankful heart for the many good things you have given us, our family, friends, food, clothes and all our talents. Teach us to share your love and all that you have given us with all. Thank you for staying with us in the Eucharist. **Amen.**
