Wisdom 1,13-15; 2,23-24; Psalm 29; 2 Corinthians 8, 7. 9.13-15; Mark 5, 21-24. 35-43

The Daughter of Jairus

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him, and he stayed close to the sea. One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, "My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live." He went off with him, and a large crowd followed him and pressed upon him. While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?" Disregarding the message that was reported, Jesus said to the synagogue official, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official, he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. So he went in and said to them, "Why this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but asleep." And they ridiculed him. Then he put them all out. He took along the child's father and mother and those who were with him and entered the room where the child was. He took the child by the hand and said to her, "Talitha koum," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around. At that they were utterly astounded. He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat.

Reflection

Jesus cured a twelve-year-old girl who had died at the insistence of her father, Jairus. Do you pray to Jesus when someone you love is sick? Do you trust in Jesus when you are scared? Jesus tells us, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." Jesus' goodness should move us to grow in faith and share with others. How do we grow in faith? (We can pray for more faith.) How can we share with others?

Activity





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Friends of Jesus and Mary XIV Sunday of Ordinary Time, July 8, 2018 *Ezekiel 2, 2-5; Psalm 122; 2Co 12, 7-10; Mark 6, 1-6* Jesus is rejected at Nazareth


Jesus departed from there and came to his native place, accompanied by his disciples. When the sabbath came he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astonished. They said, "Where did this man get all this? What kind of wisdom has been given him? What mighty deeds are wrought by his hands! Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary, and the brother of James and John and Judas and Simon? And are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." So, he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.

Reflection

Jesus' neighbors do not want to listen to him because they know him so well and think he can't have anything new to say to them. Do you have anyone close to you that you don't listen to? Why? Who do you listen to? Why? Jesus wants to speak to them about God's love. Who speaks to you about God's love. Do you listen and learn from them Why is it important to hear about God's love? Where do you see God's love in your life?

Activity

Cut hearts and write on each one where they can find God's love. (A smile, a hug, the help of a friend, the bible, the Eucharist, the Sacraments, a beautiful flower, the correction of a parent, an invitation to play, a sunset, the devotion of a pet) Hide the hearts so they can find only one. Then have them present what the heart that they found says and how they can share it with others.



Prayer

Lord, we always want to listen to you. Help us to find the time to listen and to speak to one another. Help us to discover you in the humble blessing of our daily lives. **Amen**.






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The **Sacraments** are actions of God with which He shows us the love He has for his children. All of them have been created (instituted) by Him, and that's why it's He who performs them through different means.

He created them to **give us grace**; to give us, along with His love, the necessary strength to fight against and through the difficulties of life. Of course, that is, *if* we have a positive disposition and attitude towards wanting to please God.



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Friends of Jesus and Mary XV Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 15, 2018 Amos 7, 12-15; Psalm 84; Ephesians 1, 3-14; Mark 6, 7-13 Jesus Sends Out the Twelve Disciples.

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick—no food, no sack, no money in their belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic. He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them." So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

Reflection

Jesus sent them out in pairs to give testimony of everything he had said and done. People believe two people more than just one. In those days, two testimonies were required in trials. Jesus also gave them the power to expel bad spirits and to cure the sick to give signs confirming their testimony. Jesus wants the world to know how much God loves them and he needs us to be His messengers.



Activity

The following page has instructions to make a Wordless Book to teach them how to evangelize. They can make book for themselves, and one to give away. Have them practice evangelizing with the book.

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EVANGELIZE WITH THE BOOK WITHOUT WORDS

Instructions: Make a book without words so the children can evangelize with it. Cut construction paper in the following colors in four parts to make four books. You will need double the green pages. Make two holes on the left side to put a ribbon through them at the end. Hacer un libro sin palabras para que los niños evangelicen. Start with black and explain what it means. Continue with each color explaining the meaning until finishing the book. The two green pages are the back and front cover. String the ribbon and tie. Have them practice evangelizing with the book.

BLACK represents sin. Since Adam and Eve disobeyed God and separated themselves from Him, we are all born with the mark of Original Sin on our souls and with the tendency to sin. When we sin, we separate ourselves from God and enter spiritual darkness losing our way and our happiness. We sin when we disobey God's law of love.

RED represents the blood of Jesus, shed for our salvation. "Jesus died for our sins, as written in Scripture; was buried; and rose on the third day, also according to Scripture" (1Cor 15, 3-4). He died to replace us as sinners and rose from the dead to show His power over death, saving us from our sins. (John 3:16)

BLUE represents the waters of Baptism. Jesus told His disciples "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Mat 28: 19-10) When we are baptized Original Sin is erased from our soul and we become part of God's family.

WHITE represents the purification of our souls through the sacrifice of Jesus. "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come:^[a] The old has gone, the new is here!" (II Cor 5:17) The spiritual darkness is dispersed, and the light of Christ takes us to happiness and to heaven.

YELLOW represents Heaven, (Rev 21:18) Jesus has gone to prepare a wonderful place for those who believe and follow Him. (John 14:1-3)

GREEN (Cover) represents that Christians need to grow in their new life. Just as the plants need sun, rain, and soil, so do Christians need prayer, the Word of God, and the Church community and its teachings to grow spiritually and glorify God.





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
Friends of Jesus and Mary XVI Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 22, 2018

Jeremiah 23, 1-6; Psalm 22; Ephesians 2, 13-18; Mark 6, 30-34

The apostles gathered together with Jesus and reported all they had done and taught. He said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." People were coming and going in great numbers, and they had no opportunity even to eat. So, they went off in the boat by themselves to a deserted place. People saw them leaving and many came to know about it. They hastened there on foot from all the towns and arrived at the place before them. When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.

Reflection

Jesus sees that the people thirst for His words. Jesus wants to be with them, even though He is tired, teaching them what God wants and values. What does God want from us? Do you read the Bible? Do you help out in your house even if you are tired or don't feel like it? Jesus also wants his disciples to rest and spend time with Him to recharge their batteries. Do you spend time with Jesus? How can Jesus help you?



Activity

On the following pages is a prayer cube. Have the children cut and paste it together. Take turns tossing the cube and seeing what the top says. Read and discuss the meaning for each person. Ask them to play with their families at home.

Prayer










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FRIENDS OF JESUS AND MARY

XVII Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 29, 2018

2 Kings 4, 42-44; Psalms 144; Ephesians 4, 1-6; John 6, 1-15

Jesus feeds five thousand men.


Jesus went across the Sea of Galilee. A large crowd followed him, because they saw the signs he was performing on the sick. Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples. The Jewish feast of Passover was near. When Jesus raised his eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" He said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, "Two hundred days' wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little." One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" Jesus said, "Have the people recline." Now there was a great deal of grass in that place. So, the men reclined, about five thousand in number. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." So, they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat. When the people saw the sign he had done, they said, "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world." Since Jesus knew that they were going to come and carry him off to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain alone. (Prefiguration of the Eucharist)

Reflection

In the Old Testament, when God asks His prophets to feed His people, He provides the food. Jesus can multiply the bread Himself because He is God. But He needs our generosity. When we share what we are and have, God multiplies it for everyone. Would you like to share like the boy in the Gospel? Have you ever noticed that when you share, there is enough for everyone and everyone is happy?

Activity

The next pages have ideas for the children to do acts of charity. Do you know of anyone that needs help? How can you help? Talk about the different ideas they can help and have each child choose one they will do this week.




Prayer






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PRACTICE CHARITY

Bring toys that you no longer use that are in good condition to give to those in need.





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
OLD TESTAMENT STORY: JACOB'S LADDER

He dreamed of a ladder that reached from the ground all the way up to heaven. There were angels running up and down the ladder. He looked and saw God himself standing at the top of the ladder. God spoke to Jacob "I Will give to you and your descendants the land where you sleep. I am with you and will take care of you and return you to this place. He reached Haran and worked for Laban for many years accumulating great riches. He married Rachel, one of his daughters. When he returned to Canaan, Esau received him with open arms.



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St. Thomas Help us to Believe.

Feast Day: July 03

Born: (around the time of Jesus): Died: (around) 72 AD

Thomas was one of the twelve apostles of Jesus. Thomas in the Syriac language means "twin." St. Thomas loved Jesus very much. When Jesus was captured by his enemies, Thomas lost his courage and ran away with the other apostles. It broke his heart when Jesus died. Then on Easter Sunday, Jesus appeared to his apostles after he had risen from the dead but Thomas was not with them. As soon as he arrived, the other apostles told him joyfully, "We have seen the Lord." They thought Thomas would be happy. Instead, he did not believe them. "Unless I see in his hands the print of the nails," he said, "and put my finger in the place of the nails, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Eight days later when Jesus appeared to his apostles again, Thomas was there, too. Jesus called him and told him to touch his hands and the wound in his side. He fell down at Jesus' feet and cried out, "My Lord and my God!" Then Jesus said, "Because you have seen me, Thomas, you have believed. Blessed are they who have not seen, and yet have believed."

After Pentecost, Thomas was strong and firm in his belief and trust in Jesus. He took the mission he was given seriously and went to Parthia, Persia and India to preach the Gospel. He was killed by his enemies while kneeling in front of a cross and praying. He died a martyr there, after many people became followers of Jesus.
