Wisdom 11, 22-12, 2; Psalm 144; 2 Thesalonians1, 11-2, 2; Luke 19, 1-10

Zacchaeus Seeks to See Jesus

At that time, Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone, I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham. For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."

Reflection

Zacchaeus was the chief of the publicans. What is a publican? (they collected taxes for the Romans and were hated because they became rich overcharging.) Why did Zacchaeus try to see Jesus? (He had heard about His miracles and that He was a man of God. His heart felt His call. He needed to fill the emptiness that his stolen riches left him) Why did he climb the tree? (He was short in stature and the tall people blocked his vue. His stature also symbolizes his social status because of his sins. He had to work harder to see Jesus than others.) How did Zacchaeus feel when Jesus called out to him? (Happy and grateful) What did he promise? (To give half of his riches



to the poor and to pay back 4 times the amount he had stolen to people.) When he opened his heart to Jesus, he was filled with Jesus' love and he repented from his sins and was filled with love for others wanting to make up for the damage he had done them. How did the others react? (The complained that Jesus visited the home of sinners.) Jesus explains to them that the Son of Man came to seek out and save what has been lost. What distances us from God? How can we seek Him? How can we help Jesus save souls?








Did you know ...?

A sycamore is a fig tree of Egyptian origin. This tree is particular because its trunk divides close to the ground permitting Zacchaeus, chief of the publicans (collector of taxes), of short stature, to easily climb it to see Jesus.

2 Maccabees 7, 1-2. 9-14; Psalm 16; 2 Thessalonians 2, 16-3, 5; Luke 20, 27-38

Jesus Affirms the Resurrection of the Dead

Some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward. Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise. That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out 'Lord, ' the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive."

Reflection

Who were the Sadducees (A Jewish religious sect that existed during the time of Jesus; they did not believe in resurrection of the dead.) What does the resurrection of the dead mean? (The Church teaches us that just like lesus resurrected from the dead, at the end of time, we will resurrect with Jesus, with our same



body, but transfigured into our glorious or heavenly body (Fil. 3:21)) How does Jesus describe resurrected people? (They will not get married nor will they die, because they will be like angels and children of God.) What are angels? (They are spirits that love and serve God with their whole being.) When we get to Heaven, our focus will be on God's love and God will provide everything for us. How can we love and serve God better on earth?

Activity

XXXIII Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 17th, 2019

Malachi 3, 19-20; Psalm 98, 5-9 Thessalonians 3, 7-12; Luke 21,5-19

Stand erect and raise your heads.

While some people were speaking about how the temple was adorned with costly stones and votive offerings, Jesus said, "All that you see here the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." Then they asked him, "Teacher, when will this happen? And what sign will there be when all these things are about to happen?" He answered, "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end." Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky. "Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name. It will lead to your giving testimony. Remember, you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute. You will even be handed over by parents, brothers, relatives, and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

Reflection

What is the temple and where was it located? The temple was the place where Jews worshipped God in Jerusalem; people from all social classes were received. God was present in the temple. Once a year, all the Jews went to the temple to celebrate Passover. The walls of the temple were covered in gold and the exterior was extravagantly adorned. However, these luxurious items were not important. What did Jesus mean when He said, "there will not be left a stone upon another stone"? (The greatness of the church is not the expensive walls but Jesus' presence there and within our hearts.) What does Jesus tell us about the future and how we should defend ourselves? (Jesus says there will be wars,



earthquakes, hunger, persecution, etc. He will stay with us as long as we have faith, and He will protect us making sure "not a hair in our head will be destroyed". This invites us to never lose trust in Jesus.


Prayer

2 Samuel 5, 1-3; 20-22; Psalms 122; Colossians 1, 12-20; Luke 23, 35-43

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

The rulers sneered at Jesus and said, "He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Christ of God." Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine they called out, "If you are King of the Jews, save yourself." Above him there was an inscription that read, "This is the King of the Jews." Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us." The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise.

Reflection

What is a king? (He is the monarch of a kingdom, has power, wears a crown and tunics of elegant fabrics.) What is Christ the King like? (He is not a human-style king with great riches; His greatest triumph is giving His life for others; A king who, with his sacrifice and with his blood, converts to love; A king with all the power of the universe who does not use it to have comfort, but to serve and love others.) What attitude did the thieves who are on each side of Jesus on the Cross have? (One of them mocked and told Jesus to save himself; the other thief asked Jesus to remember him when he arrived in his Kingdom.) What did Jesus respond to each of them? (To the 1st, He did not answer not being tempted by his words; while to the 2nd, He gives a beautiful answer "today you will be with me in Paradise".)



Jesus wants us to be like the good thief, to be inspired by Jesus to correct our failures and follow Him. In spite of our failures, the mercy of God is infinite if we repent from the heart. Do I use my possessions or abilities for my personal comfort or to help those in need? How can I help others? (Help classmates study, or do homework, share my lunch or snacks, be friendly to someone who has few friends, etc. How do I react to insults? Do I respond back with insults or do I refuse to be tempted like Jesus?


Prayer



Amén.



He and Philip were the ones that took some Greeks before Jesus. Andrew was also the one who let Jesus know a boy had some fish and loaves of bread. According to tradition, after Pentecost, he preached the Gospel in many regions and was crucified in Acaya.




Who is King David?
