Be good and honest and truthful as you try to please the Lord.



REFLEXION


Just like the blind man, Jesus heals.


Gospel Saint John 11:1-45 V Sunday of Lent—March 9, 2008

First Mystery: The agony of Jesus in de garden




Second Mystery: The scourging of Jesus at the pillar

Fourth Mystery: Jesus carries his heavy cross




Fifth Mystery: The crucifixion and death of Jesus





Reflection



The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord.....Thomas (called the Twin), one of the twelve was not with them when Jesus came so the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!" He said to them, "Unless I see the marks of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came...stood in their midstthen he said To Thomas, "put your Finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do Not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and My God."

Reflection

The Works of Mercy

Instructions for the game:

The works of mercy are acts of charity actions by means which we helped to the others in all its corporal and spiritual necessities.

There are 14 of them altogether, 7 corporal and 7 spiritual.

As you see there are in total 28 little cards with different pictures, come of which are repeated, 14 pictures in total. For what? You don't understand. right? I'll tru to explain muself better. Three can play. One of them directs the game and the other two participate in this exciting adventure among the works of mercy. The game consists of the following: the player who directs the game places all the cards in line facing downwards (so that the pictures can't be seen). The other two players take turns choosing a card, pointing at the one they want. The director of the game, takes up the card and the player who has chosen it has to say which work of mercy. If he gets it right first time (you only get one chance) he keeps the card. If he gets it wrong, the card is replaced facing downwards, and it's the next player's turn. The player who first succeeds in getting the 7 corporal and the 7 spiritual works of mercy, wins. That is why each card is repeated twice, so that two can play at once. Understand.

If you choose a card that you already have, you must say "I don't want it" and then it's the other player's turn again. You can't have two copies of the same card. That would be cheating, which is wrong.

To begin the game you have to cut out the cards one by one and stick them to pieces of cardboard or something hard so that they won't get tattered. And on the cardboard you can write, for example, H.M. WORKS OF MERCY GAME... Or whatever your imagination prefers.

SPIRITUAL WORKS

- 1. Instruct the ignorant.
- 2. Counsel the doubtful.
- 3. Correct the sinner
- 4. Comfort the sorrowful.
- 5. Forgive those who do us wrong.
- 6. Bear the wrongs of others patiently
- 7. Pray for the living and the dead

CORPORAL WORKS

- 1. Feed the hungry.
- 2. Give drink to the thirsty
- 3. Clothe the naked.
- 4. Shelter the homeless
- 5. Visit the sick
- 6. Visit the imprisoned
- 7. Bury the dead
