Readings: Isaiah 49, 14-15; Psalm 61; 1Corinthians 4, 1-5; Matthew 6, 24-34

### God and Possessions

"You cannot be a slave of two masters; you will hate one and love the other; you will be loyal to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money. This is why I tell you: do not be worried about the food and drink you need in order to stay alive, or about clothes for your body. After all, isn't life worth more than food? And isn't the body worth more than clothes? Look at the birds: they do not plant seeds, gather a harvest and put it in barns; yet your Father in heaven takes care of them! Aren't you worth much more than birds? Can any of you live a bit longer by worrying about it? And why worry about clothes? Look how the wild flowers grow: they do not work or make clothes for themselves. But I tell you that not even King Solomon with all his wealth had clothes as beautiful as one of these flowers. It is God who clothes the wild grass -grass that is here today and gone tomorrow, burned up in the oven. Won't he be all the more sure to clothe you? What little faith you have! So do not start worrying: 'Where will my food come from? Or my drink? Or my clothes?' (These are things the pagans are always concerned about.) Your Father in heaven knows that you need all these things. Instead, be concerned above everything else with the Kingdom of God and with what He requires of you, and He will provide you with all these other things. So do not worry about tomorrow; it will have enough worries of its own. There is no need to add to the troubles each day brings." (Matthew 6, 24-34)

# Reflection


The readings of this week tell us that even if everything human, including the love of a mother, fails, the love of God would never forsake us. Jesus asks for total surrender to his reign and his work, without anything material taking first place. He thus invites us to trust and calmness since the kindness and love of God will be with us always. Do you really believe what Jesus says? What is most important to you? Are the adults in your family too concerned about material things, about making progress and having success in this society? Are they also concerned about their spiritual life and education of their faith? Share with them about the flowers and the birds.

## Activity

Bring to the group pictures of flowers and birds. Describe their beauty. Do they do anything to achieve such beauty on their own? Ask them to draw pictures of themselves on a separate paper. Place a picture of a flower or bird beside the drawing. Write on it "God always takes care of me." All together make a thanksgiving prayer to God for caring for them.

# Teaching about Charity and Fasting

"Make certain you do not perform your religious duties in public so that people will see what you do. If you do these things publicity, you will not have any reward from your Father in heaven. So when you give something to a needy person, do not make a big show of it, as the hypocrites do in the houses of worship and on the streets. They do it so that people will praise them. I assure you, they have already been paid in full. But when you help a needy person, do it in such a way that even your closest friend will not know about it. Then it will be a private matter. And your Father, who sees what you do in private, will reward you. And when you fast, do not put on a sad face as the hypocrites do. They neglect their appearance so that everyone will see that they are fasting. I assure you, they have already been paid in full. When you go without food, wash your face and comb your hair, so that others cannot know that you are fasting, and your Father, who sees what you do in private, will reward you. (Matthew 6, 1-6.16-18)

# Reflection

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Thursday before the mass of the Supper of the Lord. At this time the Church reminds us of the surrender of Jesus for us and calls us to conversion. Forty days to thank Jesus for his sacrifice and love for us, doing all the things He likes. Do their families and communities celebrate Lent as a time of sacrifice? Jesus says that more important than what people do or give up for Lent is what we do because we love God and God loves us. What do you think would please Jesus that you could do this Lent? Share.

# Activity





# The Temptation of Jesus

Then the Spirit led Jesus into the desert to be tempted by the Devil. After spending forty days and nights without food, Jesus was hungry. Then the devil came to him and said, "If you are God's Son, order these stones to turn into bread." But Jesus answered, "The scripture says, 'Human beings cannot live on bread alone but need every word that God speaks." Then the devil took Jesus to Jerusalem, The Holy City, set him on the highest point of the Temple, and said to him, "If you are God's Son, throw yourself down, for the scripture says, 'God will give orders to his angels about you; they will hold you up with their hands, so that not even your feet will be hurt on the stones." Jesus answered, "But the scripture also says, 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test." Then the Devil took Jesus to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in all their greatness. "All this I will give you," the Devil said, "If you kneel down and worship me." Then Jesus answered, "Go away, Satan! The scripture says, 'Worship the Lord your God and serve only him!" Then the Devil left Jesus; and angels came and helped him. (Matthew 4, 1-11)

# Reflection

Jesus has gone through every human temptation to break away from God. By overcoming that temptation, Jesus teaches us to be children of God. Are there gangs in the neighborhood who might lure them to easy money or drugs? What ideas about success and power do we get in our homes and through TV, specially the evenings soaps? Let's ask ourselves what is most important for the Are the good characters bad characters? sometimes tempted to lie, seek revenge, or do something for money? Let's think about some time when we wanted to do something right but it was easier for us to be lazy, lie or misbehave. How did we feel not doing the right thing? Were we able to overcome some temptations? Share.

# Activity

Prepare different cards for each member of the group. The cards should said: lots of money, good education, big house, lots of fame, sexual activity, elegant clothes, trips, social status, personal talents, beauty, intelligence, computer, digital games, musical instruments, cellular phones, etc. Seat the group in a circle and give each one 4 cards. Ask them to pick up 2 of them. One will represent what he needs the most. The other will represent what turns him or her away from God. Share the cards they pick up and why they chose those. Explain to them what is necessary and what is temptation. Reflect what they need to do to be better and what help they need.

on the next circle you must land on the prayer space and say this sentence: "Death rather than sin", and then you can pass to the space directly below the prayer space. When you land on the virtue that is the contrary to the sin, they give you a box with the name of the virtue written on it and you go directly to the star space and you start over, repeat until you have obtained all of the virtues. You have to make a tower with the right. If you land on a question and you answer incorrectly, the person who is not participating in the game puts a black do under your name. # Friends of Jesus and Mary 2 Sunday of Lent March 16, 2014

Readings: Genesis 12, 1-4; Psalm 32; 2Timothy 1, 8b-10; Matthew 17, 1-9
The Transfiguration

Six days later Jesus took with him Peter and the brothers James and John and led them up a high mountain where they were alone. As they looked on, a change came over Jesus: his face was shining like the sun, and his clothes were dazzling white. Then the three disciples saw Moses and Elijah talking with Jesus. So Peter spoke up and said to Jesus, "Lord, how good it is that we are here! If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah. While he was talking, a shinning cloud came over them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my own dear Son, with whom I am pleased; listen to him!" When the disciples heard the voice, they were so terrified that they threw themselves face downward on the ground. Jesus came to them and touched them. "Get up," he said. "Don't be afraid!" So they looked up and saw no one there but Jesus. As they came down the mountain Jesus ordered them. "Don't tell anyone about this vision you have seen until the Son of Man has been raised from death." (Matthew 17,1-9)

# Reflection

In the transfiguration Jesus shows himself as He is to his best friends. Jesus is radiant with light to show that he really is the Son of God. This is a call to listen to Jesus as a priority. The Transfiguration gives us a taste of the triumph of Jesus and our reasons to trust in God always. What obstacles do they find in their own homes and communities? Have they ever been so happy in one place that they didn't want to leave? Why did they have to leave? To whom do they willingly listen? What are the most difficult tasks or things they have to do? Share.

# Activity

Dramatize the gospel story of this week. Explain to them that Moses and Elias are a sign of the Law and the Prophets, the two pillars of the Judaism. Jesus is the par excellence prophet, who brings to fulfillment the laws of the Old Testament, eliminates the obligations of it and teaches us the law of love to God.





Readings: Exodus 17, 3-7; Psalm 94; Romans 5, 1-2.5-8; John 4, 5-42

# *Jesus and the Samaritan Woman* Representation of the Gospel

Narrator: So when Jesus heard what was being said, he left Judea and went back to Galilee; on his way there he had to go through Samaria. In Samaria he came to a town named Sychar, which was not far from the field that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired out by the trip, sat down by the well. It was about noon. A Samaritan woman came to draw some water, and Jesus said to her.

**Jesus**: "Give me a drink of water." (His disciples had gone into town to buy food.)

**Narrator**: The woman answered:

Samaritan: "You are a Jew, and I am a Samaritan so how can you ask me for a drink?"

Narrator: Jesus answered:

**Jesus**: "If you only knew what God gives and who it is that is asking you for a drink, you would ask him, and

he would give you life-giving water."

**Narrator**: The woman said:

Samaritan: Sir, "You don't have a bucket, and the well is deep. Where would you get that life-giving water? It was our ancestor Jacob who gave us this well; he and his children and his flocks all drank from it. You don't claim to be greater that Jacob, do you?"

Narrator: Jesus answered:

Jesus: "Those who drink this water will get thirsty again, but those who drink the water that I will give them will never be thirsty again. The water that I will give them will become in them a spring which will provide them with life-giving water and give them eternal life."

**Narrator**: The woman said:

Samaritan: "Sir give me that water! Then I will never be thirsty again, nor will I have to come here to draw water."

**Narrator**: Jesus told her:

**Jesus**: Go and call your husband and come back.

**Narrator**: The woman answered: **Samaritan**: I don't have a husband.

**Narrator**: Jesus replied,

**Jesus**: "You are right when you say you don't have a husband. You have been married to five men, and the man you live with now is not really your husband. You have told me the truth."

**Narrator**: The woman said:

Samaritan: Sir, I see you are a prophet, "My Samaritan ancestor's worshiped God on this mountain, but you Jews say that Jerusalem is the place where we should worship God."

**Narrator**: Jesus said to her:

**Jesus**: "Believe me, woman, the time will come when people will not worship the Father either on this mountain or in Jerusalem. You Samaritans do not really know whom you worship; but we Jews know whom we worship, because it is from the Jews that salvations come. But the time is coming and is already here, when by the power of God's Spirit people will worship the Father as he really is, offering him the true worship that he wants. God is spirit, and only by the power of his Spirit can people worship him as he really is."

**Narrator**: The woman said to him:

Samaritan: "I know that the Messiah will come, and when he comes, he will tell us everything."

Narrator: Jesus answered,

**Jesus**: "I am he, I who am talking with you."

Narrator: At that moment Jesus' disciples returned, and they were greatly surprised to find him talking with a woman. But none of them said to her, "What do you want?" or asked him, "Why are you talking with her?" Then the woman left her water jar, went back to the town, and said to the people there:



**Samaritan**: "Come and see the man who told me everything I have ever done. Could he be the Messiah?" **Narrator**: So they left the town and went to Jesus. In the meantime the disciples were begging Jesus "Have something to eat!"

**Jesus**: "I have food to eat that you know nothing about."

**Narrator**: So the disciples started asking among themselves, "Could somebody have brought him food?" Iesus said to them:

**Jesus**: "My food," Jesus said to them, "Is to obey the will of the one who sent me and to finish the work he gave me to do. You have a saying, 'four more months and then the harvest.' But I tell you, take a good look at the fields; the crops are now ripe and ready to be harvested! The one who reaps the harvest is being paid and gathers the crops for eternal life; so the one who plants and the one who reaps will be glad together. For the saying is true: 'Someone plants, someone else reaps.' I have sent you to reap a harvest in a field where you did not work; others worked there, and you profit from their work."

**Narrator**: Many of the Samaritans in that town believed in Jesus because the woman had said, "He told me everything I have ever done." So when the Samaritans came to him, they begged him to stay with them, and Jesus stayed there two days. Many more believed because of his message, and they told the woman, "We believe now, not because of what you said, but because we ourselves have heard him, and we know that he really is the Savior of the world." (John 4, 5-42)

# Reflection

Because she was a woman and a Samaritan, Jesus was not supposed to speak to the woman at the well. But Jesus wants to give the waters of salvation to all, without exception. Only God can give the living waters. Jesus does not mind talking to a Samaritan woman, though in those times they were consider bad. How do you treat those who are not like you? Imagine your conversation with Jesus. What does he tell you about yourself? Are there things you think no one knows about you, but he knows? Jesus says that those who go to him will not be thirsty, will need nothing else to make them happy. Will you go to Jesus to look for what you need? Do you easily follow Jesus? Share.

# Prayer

Lord, we want to be the water that will help us be the best we can be; giving love to all our brothers and sisters. We want to be the water that refreshes after a hard day's work, the water of love that gives strength. Amen.





# Friends of Jesus and Mary 4th Sunday in Lent, March 30, 2014

Readings: 1 Samuel 16, 1b.6-7.10-13 Psalm 22; Ephesians 5, 8-14 John 9, 1-41

As Jesus passed by he saw a man blind from birth. His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Jesus answered, "Neither he nor his parents sinned; it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him. We have to do the works of the one who sent me while it is day. Night is coming when no one can work. While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." When he had said this, he spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva, and smeared the clay on his eyes, and said to him, "Go wash in the Pool of Siloam" -which means Sent. So he went and washed, and came back able to see. His neighbors and those who had seen him earlier as a beggar said, "Isn't this the one who used to sit and beg?" Some said, "It is," but others said, "No, he just looks like him." He said, "I am." So they said to him, "How were your eyes opened?" He replied, "The man called Jesus made clay and anointed my eyes and told me, 'Go to Siloam and wash.' So I went there and washed and was able to see." And they said to him, "Where is he?" He said, "I don't know." They brought the one who was once blind to the Pharisees. Now Jesus had made clay and opened his eyes on a Sabbath then the Pharisees also asked him how he was able to see. He said to them, "He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and now I can see." So some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, because he does not keep the Sabbath." But others said, "How can a sinful man do such signs?" And there was a division among them. So they said to the blind man again, "What do you have to say about him, since he opened your eyes?" He said, "He is a prophet." Now the Jews did not believe that he had been blind and gained his sight until they summoned the parents of the one who had gained his sight. They asked them, "Is this your son, who you say was born blind? How does he now see?" His parents answered and said, "We know that this is our son and that he was born blind. We do not know how he sees now, nor do we know who opened his eyes. Ask him, he is of age; he can speak for himself." His parents said this because they were afraid of the Jews, for the Jews had already agreed that if anyone acknowledged him as the Christ, he would be expelled from the synagogue. For this reason his parents said, "He is of age; question him." So a second time they called the man who had been blind and said to him, "Give God the praise! We know that this man is a sinner." He replied, "If he is a sinner, I do not know. One thing I do know is that I was blind and now I see." So they said to him, "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?" He answered them," I told you already and you did not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you want to become his disciples, too?" They ridiculed him and said, "You are that man's disciple; we are disciples of Moses! We know that God spoke to Moses, but we do not know where this one is from." The man answered and said to them, "This is what is so amazing, that you do not know where he is from, yet he opened my eyes. We know that God does not listen to sinners, but if one is devout and does his will, he listens to him. It is unheard of that anyone ever opened the eyes of a person born blind? If this man were not from God, he would not be able to do anything." They answered and said to him, "You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?" Then they threw him out. When Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, he found him and said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" He answered and said, "Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, the one speaking with you is he." He said, "I do believe, Lord," and he worshiped him. Then Jesus said, "I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do not see might see, and those who do see might become blind." Some of the Pharisees who were with him heard this and said to him, "Surely we are not also blind, are we?" Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no sin; but now you are saying, 'We see,' so your sin remains." (John 9, 1-41)

# Reflection

Talk with the children about blindness. Do they know anyone who is blind? What difficulties do blind people encounter? By giving sight to the blind man, Jesus says that he can give light to whomever he wants so that he can help them to see the right way to live. Do you ask Jesus for help to see what you must do? What ideas of guilt do soap operas transmit to them? What blindness or wrong ideas do we find in our families, neighbors and friends? Do they have role models of honesty, justice, and truth around them? Where can they find the guidance to follow the right path? Do they sometimes prefer not to see because it is ugly or painful, or because it makes us do uncomfortable things? In the readings of this week we can see how Christians are called to be children of the light and to reject the work of darkness. Christ can help us to see the truth about ourselves and to walk in the light with Jesus. Share.


# Activity








The Bessette family lived in Canada. They had ten children. Among them was Alfred, who was born on August 9, 1845.




The parish priest of the town discovers Alfred's magnanimous soul in preparing him for his First Communion, and will become a strong spiritual support for him.


Brother André knows that spiritual illnesses are worse than physical ones.
