
2 Kings 5, 14-17; Psalm 97; 2 Timothy 2, 8-13; Luke 17, 11-19

The Grateful Leper

As Jesus continued his journey to Jerusalem, he traveled through Samaria and Galilee. As he was entering a village, ten lepers met him. They stood at a distance from him and raised their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!" And when he saw them, he said, "Go show yourselves to the priests." As they were going they were healed. And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. He was a Samaritan. Jesus said in reply, "Ten were healed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?" Then he said to him, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

Reflection

There were 10 lepers that asked Jesus for healing. What is a leper? (A person with leprosy, a contagious disease that attacks the skin and the extremities.) How did lepers live? (Isolated from everyone so as not to spread the disease.) Jesus sends them to the priests. They knew that even the priests did not want to see them, but with faith, they go and are healed on the way. But only the Samaritan came back to thank Jesus for such great a gift. What is a Samaritan? (Someone from another religion; enemies of the jews) Why is it important that he returned? (He was not of the Jewish faith, the chosen people of God, yet he realizes Jesus' power and love cured him.) ...) Jesus tells the Samaritan that his faith saved him. Jesus shows us that salvation is for everyone who believes in Him. What can we be grateful to God for every day? (God's love and mercy. Just like leprosy separated them from the community, sin separates us from God and our faith



family. But Jesus' death on the cross obtained for us God's forgiveness and restores us into communion with God.) Being grateful for this great gift and for all the gifts God gives us every day is important. What else can we thank God for daily? (family, friends, health, food, home, faith Thanking God shows we know that everything good we have comes from God.


