Wellness & Wholeness Center Good Faith Estimate

You have the right to a **Good Faith Estimate** explaining how much your medical care at Wellness & Wholeness Center will cost. Healthcare providers are required to estimate the cost of services for patients who are self-paying or not using their insurance because the provider is out of network for their benefits. This estimate should include the total expected costs of any non-emergency items or services, including costs like medical tests, prescription drugs, equipment, and hospital fees that are being billed directly by the provider. This allows you to make the best decision about your own healthcare services and expenses.

Wellness & Wholeness Center provides **non-emergency outpatient services** and some **medical testing**. Wellness & Wholeness Center does not sell prescription drugs, equipment, or hospital services.

There are 2 ways our services are billed at Wellness & Wholeness Center:

- As part of a prepaid PROGRAM that is not based on the amount of time you spend with your provider each visit.
- As an HOURLY rate based on the number of minutes you spend receiving services with your provider each visit.

If you are not registered for a medical coaching program at the time of your visit with the doctor at Wellness & Wholeness Center, you will be billed at the HOURLY rate, which is \$350/hour for medical visits (pro-rated at \$25/15-minutes), and \$200/30 minutes visit.

Lab services (blood work and other lab testing) prescribed by the doctor at Wellness & Wholeness Center may or may not be eligible for insurance reimbursement. When you choose to pay for lab services out of pocket, or when insurance reimbursement for those services is not available, you will be given an estimate of the price for the cost of those labs.

This Good Faith Estimate is not a contract, and signing it does not obligate you to obtain the services estimated. The Good Faith Estimate is an estimate and may not include any unknown or unexpected costs that may arise during treatment. Therefore, actual items, services, and charges may differ from the Good Faith Estimate.

Remember to keep a copy of your signed Good Faith Estimate for future reference.
