Tracked through blockchain-backed provenance trail showing how knowledge has shifted across agents and moments. (Ethnographic Model)

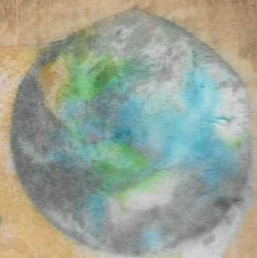


DISCOVERED in the ruins of an abandoned lab beneath Osaka's aging Ex-

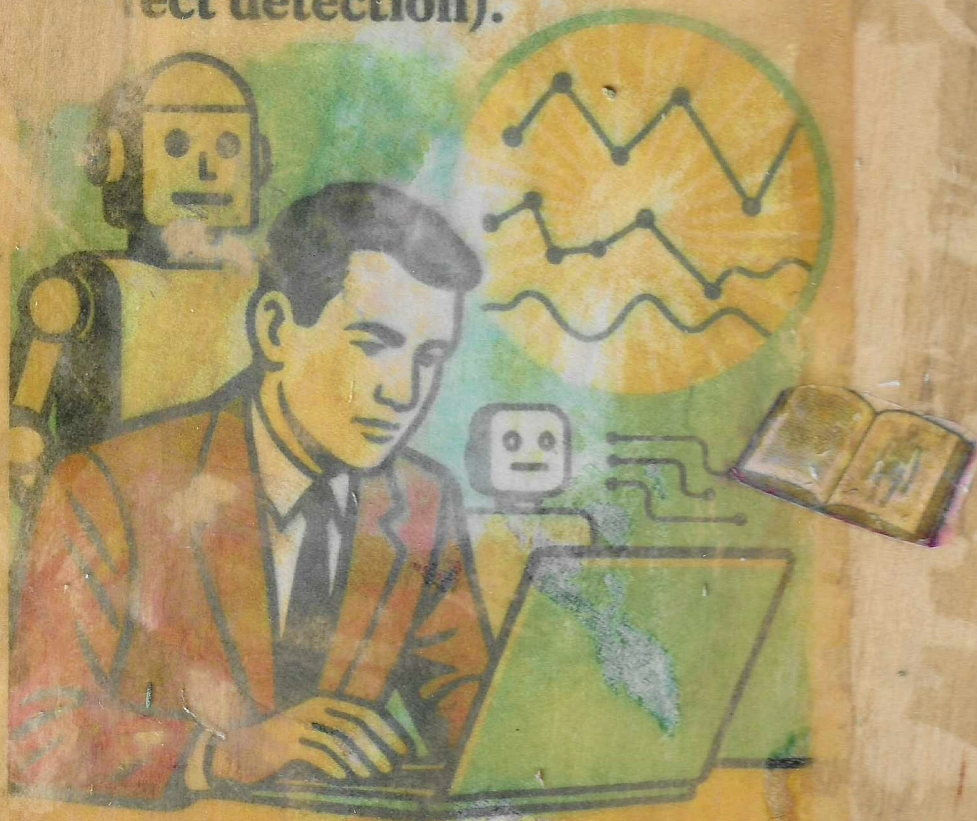

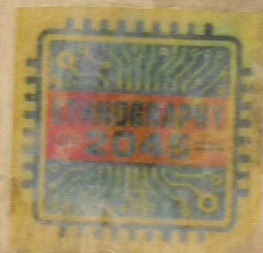

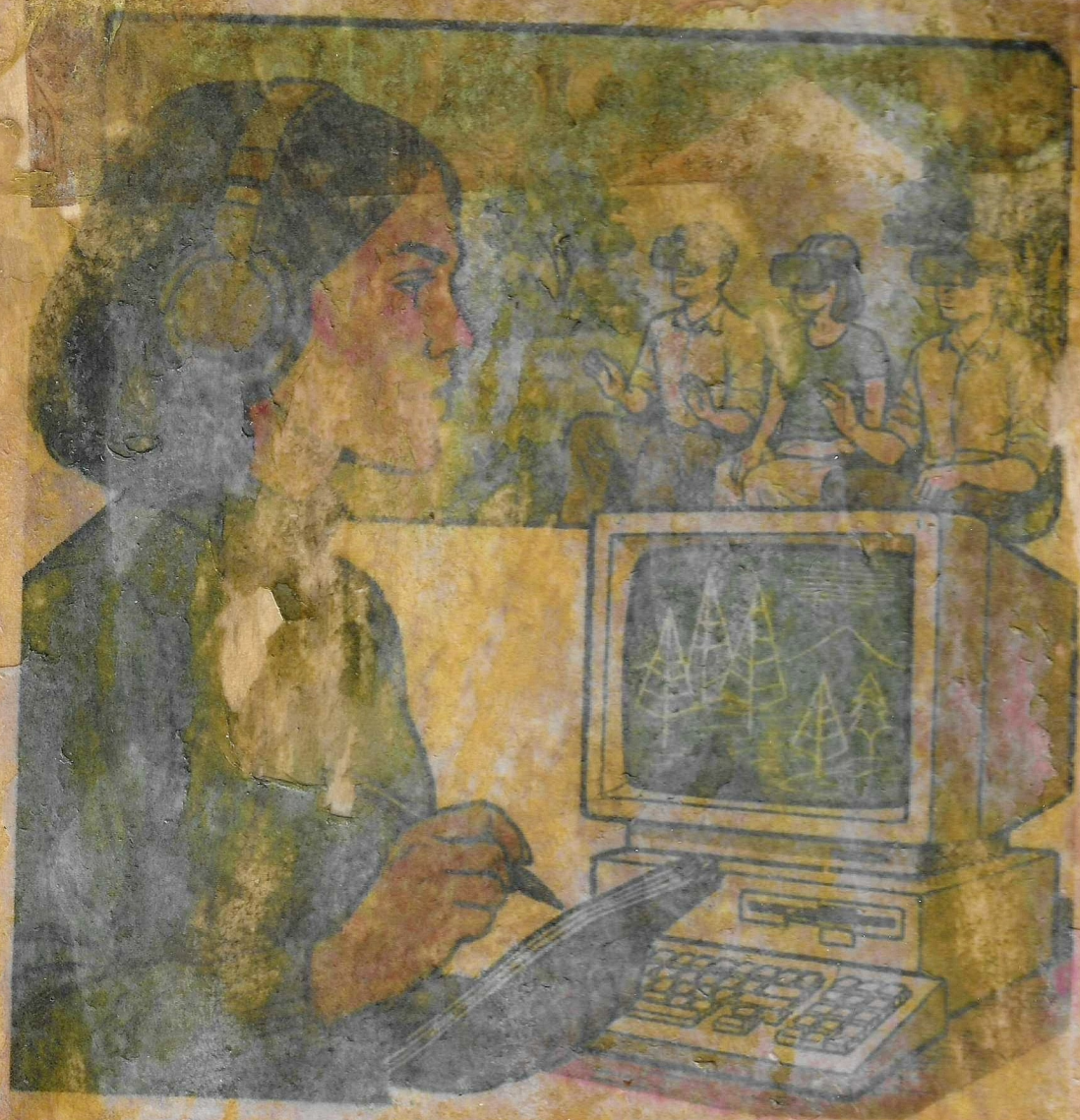
