## My First Letters

At this stage, fine motor activities and line and letter writing help get tiny hand muscles ready to write. Listening skills and following directions also play a big role in preparing for prekindergarten. Reading to your child and helping them learn to follow directions will give them an opportunity to develop some of the skills they will need to be ready for prekindergarten.

Preparing Finger Muscles to Write

Modeling clay is a great way to give tiny hand muscles a workout.

Help your child learn to squeeze, roll, and poke the modeling clay with their fingers. Push in buttons, beads, or googly eyes for fun!



Whisking with Bubbles

Fill a large tub with water and bubbles.

Grab a whisk and show your child how to use their wrist to whisk up the bubbles. Add food colouring for some colourful fun.



#### Strainer Fun

Using a strainer and coloured pipe cleaners, practise fine motor skills by helping your child to push the pipe cleaners through the holes in the strainer.

Push both ends of the pipe cleaners through the holes to make fun loops.



#### Let's Make Lemonade


Have your child help to squeeze the lemons, scoop the sugar, and stir the lemonade when you're done.

These activities will work out wrist, hand, and finger muscles.

Help your child stack cups on top of each other to make a tower. Don't forget the best part—knocking them down!




#### Holding a Pencil

Holding a pencil can be difficult for a preschooler. They need a bigger object to grasp and often end up just grabbing the pencil with a fist instead of the proper grip. To help them with this, use a ball pencil grip on the pencil.


You can purchase ball pencil grips or make one yourself.


Find a ball that your child can grasp comfortably and punch a hole into the ball and push the pencil through.

Put the tray in the freezer to make ice cubes.
