Let's Get Ready for Kindergarten




Pick Up Your Pencil the "Write" Way

Paper Clip Chains



Molding with modeling clay is a great way to work out the tiny muscles in your hands and prepare them for writing!


You Will Need: coloured modeling clay, child safety scissors, a rolling pin, a fork, and cookie cutters

Tennis Ball Monster


You Will Need: a tennis ball with a slice cut into it, googly eyes, yarn, pipe cleaners, hot glue, and marbles

An adult is going to need to help make the tennis ball monster before the game can begin. Take the tennis ball with a cut in the side (about three inches long) and carefully hot glue 2 or 3 googly eyes onto your monster! You can even glue some coloured yarn on top for hair or pipe cleaners for antennae! Once your tennis ball monster is dry, you can start playing the game. Drop your marbles onto the floor. Hold the tennis ball and squeeze it to open your monster's mouth. Place the tennis ball on top of a marble and release your squeeze to close the monster's mouth. Pick up the tennis ball and shake it gently. Can you hear the marble inside? You got it! Do it again but try not to let the first marble fall out when you grab another marble. See how many marbles you can get without losing any!






Under Lock and Key


You Will Need: three to five small key locks and the keys to open them
