

A Member's Story

It's tough to relay a story of being pulled into a boundless sea of uncertainty by a relentless undertow while you watch your anchor drift away. My wife, Rhonda, suffers from advanced Alzheimer's dementia. She was my soulmate and anchor for many happy years.

Rhonda and I met in high school, but lost touch during college. She got her Ph.D. in Psychology and worked for the VA, counseling veterans with PTSD and drug and alcohol dependence. We reconnected 35 years later, after we had both divorced, and married shortly thereafter. We were deliriously happy.

Rhonda's Alzheimer's symptoms began around eight years later. First it seemed she was "tuning me out" - not paying attention to what I said. It was annoying! Also, she started doing odd things in the kitchen like washing dishes but leaving the dirty plates or mixing up dirty dishes with clean ones in the dishwasher. She wasn't aware that this was a problem. We eventually consulted a neurologist who diagnosed her with Early Cognitive Impairment, and we enrolled her at MemoryCare in Asheville, a real blessing in this journey.

Rhonda has had a typical downhill course. She no longer has any awareness of her disability. She has lost the ability to verbally express herself and maintain reasonable hygiene and toileting. When we came down with COVID, we were both quite ill. But as sick as I was, Rhonda was totally dependent on me to care for her. I realized we were living too close to the edge of catastrophe and moved her to an inpatient dementia-only facility.

The emotional ups and downs of visiting her there are trying. Even though she does not know my name or recognize me as her husband, I get "up" when she smiles, happy that I am there...the "down" comes when I must leave. I visit her 3 or 4 times a week. Unlike some other residents, Rhonda is content and at ease in her new environment, and that reassures me. I am grateful that she never asks about going home. And I am lucky to have experienced a few short years with this wonderful woman who was my soulmate. Now I have the gratifying opportunity of caring for her through the rest of our story.
