

Several members of the GGS participated in the "Scarecrows in the Garden" event in October held at the Research and Educational Garden in Griffin. Next year every patch should make a scarecrow to enter and show our patch creativity. The displays are usually up all of October throughout the garden open for the public to walk through the garden and enjoy all the scarecrows. The GGS served as artist in resident at the Georgia National Fair in Perry, GA. We were well represented in the fine arts competition at the fair with eight artists entering the Fine Arts Open 3-D Gourd Division. Karin Anderson won a blue ribbon in the Open 3-D Gourd Professional Division and a Fine Arts Open Division Best of Show for her dragon (the first time gourds have ever won a "Fine Arts Best of Show" at the National Fair). The schedule of the fair makes it possible for gourd artists to enter both the Georgia National Fair Fine Arts Competition and the GGS GourdFest competition. 2025 should see more than eight artists entered in the state fair. Now that winter has arrived, it's a great time to work on gourds and let all those creative juices loose and see what you can create. Stay warm and enjoy gourd crafting.

It's not too early to start thinking about the 2025 theme "What Bugs you?" Lots of possibilities, so have fun with it.






