The "stir" my newsletter caused was both positively acknowledged and controversial. In reality, my newsletter was only controversial to a few members of what may be thought of as a competing off-road trainer group. Personally, I don't see us competing. At this moment in time, that organization is as different from what ORTA will be as the East is from the West. ORTA will welcome the

trainers from this group. These seasoned trainers can only make ORTA better. ORTA will be inclusive, welcoming all that wish to join us to help enhance the off-road industry.

I received dozens of very positive emails, text messages, and phone calls from industry leaders, businesspersons, and other trainers.
