# Blackpool family pet finds gold while digging in the park

Family pet finds £6,000 in gold while digging in the park

## A family's new puppy is already worth its weight in gold - after digging up sovereign coins worth nearly £6k.

Adam Clark, 51, bought Ollie, a lagotto romagnolo, as a surprise for his daughter Alicia, nine, last month.

The breed is notorious for digging - especially for truffles - and on March 30, on his first walk around the local fields, the young dog stumbled upon a small fortune.

To his owner's delight and utter disbelief, Ollie instinctively dug up a total of 15 gold sovereign pieces likely dating back to the nineteenth century.

Adam, who works in property, took the gold coins to be examined by Chards, one of the leading gold dealers in the country - who valued them at a staggering  $\pm 5,943.96$ .



The landlord is thrilled with the return from the treasure, but believes the real prize is Ollie himself, dubbing him his very own "gold hunter".

Adam, from Blackpool, said: "When we got him we thought he seemed special.

"Alicia was over the moon and we couldn't wait to take him out for his first walk around the gala fields.

"We'd literally been walking for around ten minutes when Ollie suddenly stopped and started frantically digging away at the soil.

"That's when he uncovered the pile of gold pieces - I couldn't quite believe it.

"The treasure is one thing, but, the fact is, I've bought myself my very own gold hunter, and I cannot wait to take him out again.

"He is obviously a very special pup and I'm thrilled with what he brings to the table - quite literally!"

## How The "Find Of The Month" Contest Works

The Find of the Month Contest is a very important part of our club's meetings. The rules are so important they are a part of our By-Laws. The Quick Overview below should answer most questions but in cases of questions, please refer to the By-Laws.

## FIND OF THE MONTH (Quick Overview)

Qualified finds –

- Any find of lost, cached, trashed or prospected items of significant value or interest
- Only those items found since the last club meeting attended are eligible
- One item per category may be entered
- Finds must be fresh, nothing purchased, nothing recovered from a seeded hunt
- All finds must be signed in on the entry form for the appropriate category

### <u>Categories</u> –

COINS

- All coins are eligible
- Currency worth \$20.00 or more and coin caches are eligible
- No clad coins or memorial cents are eligible

#### JEWELRY

• Includes anything with or without stones, designed to be worn by mankind

#### RELICS

- Items must be at least 50 years old
- Jewelry items may be entered only if they have more significance as a relic

### MOST UNUSUAL

- Any find that doesn't qualify in the other three (3) categories is eligible
- Costume jewelry may be entered

### SECOND CHANCE

- A second coin, piece of jewelry, or relic may be entered
- Must be a "second item"
- Only one (1) entry per person, per month is allowed

#### PROCEDURE

- Sign in on the correct entry form with your name, description of item, block number where your item is placed
- On the block with your item, write what it is
