Octoberfest is a large, family-friendly folk festival held annually in Munich, Germany, featuring beer, amusement rides, food and music, all celebrating Bavarian culture. It originated in 1810 to commemorate the royal weeding of Bavarian Crown prince Ludwig to Princess Therese, though the event has since evolved beyond its royal beginnings to include agricultural displays, fairground rides and massive beer tents, becoming a massive celebration of German heritage.

From the Foot Locker

For those of you who do not know, Zippo, the manufacturer of lighters, will repair and/or replace damaged Zippo windproof pocket lighters...for free. All you have to do is mail them your unserviceable lighter(s), include a mailing address, email and phone number and they do the rest. Make sure for safety's sake that the lighter is empty of fuel. [remove the inside unit, allow to evaporate for 2-3 days, return the inside unit back into the case] {multiple units may be sent in one package}

Long story short, I returned 5 different lighters and received an email confirming their receipt acknowledging 3 different model numbers and that their return would take 4-5 weeks (which I think is certainly reasonable). Might even have them before the October meeting!

Law Abiding:
