Breach of Rule	Does not always result in penalty if player chooses to ignore (but not discuss with opponent) a breach of a rule Players may agree how to decide a rule as long as they both don't deliberately agree to ignore a penalty	A breach must always result in a penalty Players knowing rules can play on, can play 2 balls, or ask for a rules official TC/Rules official determination is final
Committee becomes aware of a player's breach after play concludes but before the competition is closed (e.g., player made a stroke at the wrong ball)	If no timely request for ruling was made, result of match stands	The player must be disqualified
Handicaps	If not given correctly before match and affects # strokes given, player is disqualified, even if affected hole not yet played	If not given correctly, must be corrected before scorecard returned
