Mountain Youth Network stayed true to their mission this quarter; prioritizing youth engagement in the community. TREK Teen Council members gave presentations to multiple different audiences including their peers, elected officials, civic leaders, and community members at large. The youth involved in the Community Mapping project went before the City Council of Idaho Springs. The teens practiced hard and delivered an amazing "Public Comment" presentation! They described the Community Mapping Project and asked to be involved in improvement projects highlighted by youth feedback. No Vape November



In accordance with the Governor's "No Vape November" proclamation, TREK Teen Council formed the TREK No Vape Squad, dedicated to delivering an educational presentation about vaping. The TREK No Vape Squad "went on tour" and gave this presentation to their peers, middle school students, Carlson Elementary School, Georgetown Community School, King Murphy and the Clear Creek School District Board of Education. The presentations were informative and intended to prevent vaping and to provide information and resources to anyone wanting to quit! The students on the Squad gained experience in public speaking and a sense of helping in their community to curb a behavior that has become a true epidemic.

TREK Community Involvement

Collaboration efforts by the Mountain Youth Network continued with local organizations like the Clear Creek County Advocates, Scraps to Soil, and ECO School. These organizations reached out to work with MYN and TREK once again



in 2019. This was the third year that TREK pulled together a group of youth volunteers for the annual Pumpkin Smash event. This annual event focuses on sustainability and composting leftover Halloween pumpkins. TREK volunteers participated for the second year assisting with the local Santa Shop project run by the Clear Creek Advocates. Santa Shop provides local families with toys, baskets, and food over the holiday season. Both high school and middle school TREK members helped by shopping for gifts that suited their age demographic to make Christmas special for peers in need. TREK involvement in collaborative events like these provide opportunities for volunteer hours, skill-building and community connection for our young people!
