



Robert Badal Teaching Experience:

## University

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Following his two year contract at Meito High School in Nagoya Japan (see Teaching Experience: Secondary School), in 2006, Robert was appointed as a Visiting Lecturer at Aichi Prefectural University, a high level public university.



At Aichi Prefectural, Robert used drama to teach English and Communication (see under Teaching Experience: Drama and Public Speaking) and also taught the American Mystery Novel, Novel and Film and TV, Filmmaking Project, and Writing (see under Teaching Experience: Writing Instruction). Following the completion of his short-term, full-time contract, Robert continued at Aichi Prefectural as a part-time professor.

At the end of 2006, Robert was awarded a full time, 5 year contract at Nanzan Junior College, part of Nanzan University, one of Japan's most prestigious universities, ranked in the Top 10 for English Instruction.



At Nanzan, Robert continued to develop the teaching methods he introduced at Aichi Prefectural.

He was extremely active in academic research, publishing four research projects in the Nanzan Junior College Journal, "The Mystery Novel, An Old Tradition Made New," "Lights, Action, Content: Using Acting and Drama to Teach Content-rich English," "The Schema of Listening," and "Business English, The Essential Subject." (see under Research, Publications, & Presentations).

This research evolved from, and was used in, Robert's popular classes, such as his Advanced ESL Listening and Discussion class, Business English, and his English classes in which he used drama.

Robert was also active in extra activities for students, participating in the celebrated Nanzan Oral Interpretation Festival and Short Play Contest (see Teaching Experience: Drama and Public Speaking), offering writing assistance outside of the classroom (see Teaching Experience: Writing (Adults, University, & Kids), as well as actively helping students enter the job market.



While teaching at Nanzan, Robert was recruited as a Visiting Lecturer in the Education Department at Nagoya University of Arts and Sciences to teach a special program for teachers in how to teach Kid's English. (see under Teaching Experience: English for Kids & Experience: Teacher Training).

Robert moved to Chongqing China in late 2012, and for a while taught English for Kids and Test Preparation for Owen Education and the Stilwell Foreign Language School. (see Teaching Experience: English for Kids and Test Preparation, Immigration, & Study Abroad). He also taught Hotel English for the Intercontinental. (see Business Training Experience: Hospitality Industry English under Business & Teacher Training Experience).

But while in Chongqing, his teaching career took a detour in 2013, and he became a full-time Consultant for Changan Ford. (see Experience: Corporate & Government Consulting under Business & Teacher Training Experience).



Later in 2013, he retained his position at Changan Ford, working remotely, but moved to Daejeon, South Korea to become a professor at Woosong University.

At Woosong, Robert taught a broad range of students from different departments.





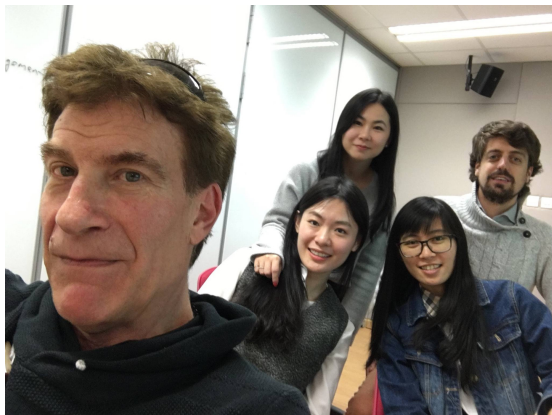
He taught students from the Culinary Studies department (see under Business & Teacher Training Experience: Hospitality), Medical English for the nursing program (see under Business & Teacher Training Experience: Medical English), Business English for the Management students, Railroad Engineering Students (see Business & Teacher Training Experience: Technical English), a special TOEFL preparation camp for visiting Japanese students, TOEIC preparation, and did teacher training for the other professors in the TOEIC (see Teaching Experience: Test Preparation, Immigration, & Study Abroad). Additionally, Robert taught a filmmaking project class in which his students made a TV commercial that won a competition (see Teaching Experience: Drama and Public Speaking).

Robert's stay in Korea ended in 2014 when he proposed to Amy Leung in Hong Kong and relocated there, retaining his Consulting position with Changan Ford and opening Robert Badal Consulting. He later subsumed this business under the Ba Lao Shi Perfect English brand name.
