Dear Friends,

I want to say thanks to all of you for supporting our cause!! HOM cannot function without YOU!!! And thanks to our great partners in Mirebalais Haiti Fr. Alphonse, Rector of St. Pierre Church and Fr. Romel, Pastor of St. Louis Church!!!

Haiti is still in turmoil and a gang made it to Mirebalais. However the Town retaliated and defended itself so Thank God our friends in Mirebalais are safe. Please continue to pray for them and for Haïti.

Even though there is instability and unrest, with your support we are able to keep St. Pierre clinic open 5 days a week. Fr Alphonse asked for help with a program where he is providing some groceries to the kids who are identified by the pediatrician as being malnourished.

HOM recently installed a solar power system at St Louis rectory and are in the process of getting one for the clinic. We've also sent money for Fr. Alphonse to get medication in town since he is not able to go to the DR to get them. Nobody can go to Port-Au-Prince right now to do anything because of gang activities.



In last years Newsletter I wrote about my need to visit my very ill godmother in Haiti. Her suffering has ended. Nicole St. Victor has passed. We have also lost others dear to us; Edith Morisseau, Dr. Jean-Marie Pierre and Ron McKay. Please see page 13 for their memorials.

We must be careful because of the gang crises in Haiti. There will be no funds detailed in this Newsletter or during our annual meeting. If you wish to view our financials, email us at lobos7kiko@aol.com and identify who you are. Thank you and please continue to pray for Haiti.

Since 1998, Haiti Outreach Mission has had many individual donors. But our member churches support through their annual donation of "seed money" and additional fundraising events makes our work in Haiti possible.

SOLAR POWER SYSTEM, was installed at the St. Louis rectory in May by KDEL Energie Solaire.

Haitian-government owned electricity utility Electricite d'Haiti (EDH) is inconsistent at best. For the last year little electricity has been available in Mirebalais, leading many to use (very) expensive fuel, diesel generators.

In December 2022 Fr. Romel requested funds for solar power. He received several proposals and forwarded them to HOM. After much discussion a majority of the executive committee voted to approve the project. The solar power system that was proposed had 8 solar panels and 8 storage batteries. As installed the system has 9 solar panels and 12 storage batteries. St. Louis Parish paid the difference between the cost in the original proposal and the final cost.

This system provides electricity for the St. Louis rectory and church 24/7. It requires very little maintenance, mostly battery maintenance.

Fr. Romel thanks you for your goodness, your understanding and your generosity for providing the solar power system.



Before the inflation it was at 30 Gourdes and because of the inflation I put it at 25 Gourdes in order to facilitate the people more and more. Because of your support I can afford that to our people. 
