

25x25 Financial Update

Gentlemen,

I am so happy to announce that our finances are as strong now as they have ever been! As of December 31st, 2021 our Corpus Account (soon to be the Michael E. Young Endowment, more on this later) is at \$23,790.15 and our Spendable Account is sitting at \$7,279.05.

The first thing that I would like to draw your attention to is how much the Corpus Account has grown in the past six months. On June 30th, 2021 this account was at \$13,009.90. In the last six months we have been able to increase this account by over \$10,000.00. THIS IS INCREDIBLE!!! However, this didn't happen by luck and coincidence, there has been a significant amount of hard work that has been completed to make it happen. With the creation and implementation of the 25x25 Campaign, as well as the Michael E. Young Endowment we have been able to supercharge the involvement of Alumni to the undergraduate chapter through your monthly donations.

Over these six months we have been able to sign up 36 monthly donors to the 25x25 Campaign, and with these 36 donors, we are seeing a monthly infusion of \$831.67. This has been an <u>unbelievable</u> start to this campaign, I personally want to thank everyone that has donated and assisted in getting it off the ground. Thank you.

With these new donations, we alumni have been able to immediately pay it forward to the undergraduate chapter. Our first contribution is \$3,500.00. With this money, we are going to send 12 undergraduates to Grand Chapter this coming July in New Orleans, LA. This experience will most certainly be an outstanding time for them to grow their knowledge, bond with brothers and learn more about the Fraternity.

This update has been all positive, however, I don't want anyone to think this is a time to rest on our laurels. In fact, with this early success and momentum, we need to throttle down and keep pushing. First, and most importantly, we have a benchmark to hit before we are able to rename the Corpus Account the "Michael E. Young Endowment". Once we achieve a balance of \$30,000 in this account, then we are able to transfer the name to the Michael E. Young Endowment. Second, we are still working to complete this 25x25 Campaign, which is to have 25% of our Alumni donating \$10 a month by the end of the 2025. We still have a long way to go before completing this goal. In conclusion, I want to reiterate a big thank you to all that have been able to do so much to make this happen. We have come a long way, but there is still a long way left to travel.


