getting to the point that Nigeria just wasn't going to happen on this trip. This brought back a story that Bo had recounted in a sermon she had ministered about a few days before at one of the Minister's Conferences.

It was 1995 and we were attending Rhema Bible College in Tulsa, Oklahoma. We were doing everything we knew to do but one day as school was dismissed and we were ready to depart, our 1976 car would not start, and we had no way to make it home. We had been working every job available to us but still barely making it in paying our rent, buying food or even paying our Bible School tuition. Every month when we were finally able to pay the rent and school tuition, we had a great praise celebration. But now here we were - a broken-down car, unable to call a mechanic or even a tow truck and on top of that, we couldn't even call a taxi to get us home. We did the only thing we knew to do at the time, we walked the 4 miles home. During what could have been a very hard time for us, we walked as we talked to each other and to God. During the 4-mile walk, God gave us a business plan that we wasted no time in walking out in making it happened. In the next few years, we were able to purchase 4 houses and we able to assist several other students in paying their tuitions. In this "hard time", we were exactly where God wanted us to be, looking and listening to Him, getting His plan for this time of our life.

You see, our trip to Nigeria was kind of like that hard time so many years ago, we had done everything we knew to do but the door just wouldn't budge open. But just like scripture tells us in (Proverbs 16:9), many are the plans of a man, but the Lord directs his steps. Our steps were ordered of God and when we are faithful in what we know to do and the plan still doesn't work as you thought it should, if you will rest in HIM, you can stand back and watch HIM do what only He can, and it will ALWAYS be more than you can ask or imagine. I cannot tell you at this time exactly what HIS goodness bought for us from our "NOT" getting to go to Nigeria this trip but let me testify to you today....It was exceeding abundantly above all we could have asked or imagined.

So today, be encouraged, do not allow Satan to come in and bring discouragement or despair to the dream that you have. Habakkuk 2:2 and 3 "And the Lord answered me, and said, Write the vision, and make it plain upon tables, that he may run that readeth it. For the vision is yet for an appointed time, but at the end it shall speak, and not lie: though it tarry, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry." Take God at HIS Word and watch him work in and for you. Expect HIS greatness to be shown on your behalf for He watches over His Word to perform it in you. The joy of the Lord is your strength and when you have stood firm on his promises and your strength starts to become weak, encourage yourself, pray in the Spirt and keep standing and watch God do, what only He can do!
