
News from the field from Dr. Carl Conley

International News

Vanuatu: Planning is underway for the annual National Assembly, held the first week of December. FCCI sponsors the leadership dinner and provides a book for every leader in attendance.

Johannesburg, South Africa: Bishop Levy Silindza of Governors Cathedral in Johannesburg South Africa pastors a dynamic group of leaders. He is much in demand to speak in conferences in many places. He produces a WhatsApp daily teaching that is full of rich exposition of the Word.

Kampala, Uganda: Bigimba Ngabo reports that a new facility has been provided rent-free for five years, to serve their younger students. The school serves more than two hundred students, seventy of which are seventy orphans cared for by Goshen Ministries.
